Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University. For example, a student who withdraws during the first week of Spring Quarter and Autumn Quarter must reapply as a returning former student for winter.

2. Submitting the Preregistration Form

Mark-sense registration forms are available at advisory offices and at Window 3, Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall. Please note that some courses listed in the *Time Schedule* have restricted enrollment and will require entry cards. Also, undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter. This is done to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

3. If You Miss Preregistration

Obtain an in-person registration appointment by September 21 at Window 8, Schmitz Hall. After September 21 you will be required to register late and to pay a \$15 late registration fee at the Cashier's Office, 129 Schmitz, before registering.

4. Schedule of Classes

All students who preregister will be scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year) students, juniors, and sophomores. Schedules will be mailed June 15.

5. Registered Students

Students who preregister and do not get scheduled into any courses are not considered registered students. Their names are not included on the current file of registered students, and they are not eligible for preregistration the following quarter. Students in this category must submit a Former Student Application for the next quarter they wish to attend the University.

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION

1. Eligibility

In-person registration is primarily for newly admitted and returning former students. Continuing matriculated students who miss preregistration, tuition-exempt faculty/staff, older students in the Access program, and nonmatriculated students also register during in-person registration. All students, except Access students, must be admitted to the University before attempting to register.

2. How to Register

See an academic adviser as indicated in the *Advising and Registration Guide*, which you received with your registration appointment.

Develop a schedule of classes selected from courses in the quarterly *Time Schedule*. Please note that undergraduates are limited to 19 credits until the first day of the quarter to allow everyone a chance to develop a basic program. List the classes on a worksheet, available from your adviser, or at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall, and take it together with your registration appointment (or your faculty/staff exemption card) to the Sections branch office in the Undergraduate Library. If your registration appointment is for, or after, 4 p.m., try to see an adviser an hour early so that you can arrive at Sections by the time indicated on the appointment. *Your classes will be scheduled while you wait.*

ENTRY CARDS

Certain courses and sections require entry cards for registration. Students who request these courses (and/or sections) on their registration request forms will not be registered in the courses unless the requests are accompanied by entry cards. An entry card alone is not sufficient. The course and schedule line number (SLN on entry card) must also be requested on the mark-sense registration form. Obtain course entry cards for courses designated with the symbol >>> in the margin of the *Time Schedule*. Information on where to obtain entry cards is found in the body of the *Time Schedule*, either as a comment before the course listing or just after the title of the course.

LATE REGISTRATION

Students who register after the official registration period will be charged a \$15 late registration fee, payable at the Cashier's Office, 129 Schmitz.

REGISTRATION CHANGES

1. Change Appointments and Late Fee

a) *All changes to a student's program should be completed during the official change periods (see calendar).* Changes are made by appointment only. Appointments are available at Window 3, second-floor lobby, Schmitz Hall, for all students except those in engineering; engineering students go to 353 Loew. Changes may also be made during the first week of the quarter, without an appointment, in the lobby of the T-wing, Health Sciences Building. A student who arrives more than a half-hour late will be required to make a new appointment. Changes made after the change periods cost \$5 and may result in fee forfeiture (see item 3 of this section).

b) *Students will be expected to present Autumn Quarter 1981 University of Washington student identification cards when requesting appointments.* No more than one change appointment will be issued to a student at a time. Additional change appointments will be issued only after the initially assigned appointment has been used or the date has expired.

2. Grades in Dropped Courses and Drop Restrictions

a) *Undergraduates.* Undergraduate students who drop courses after the change periods receive no entry on their academic record if the drop is made during the first two weeks of the quarter. Drops made during the third and fourth weeks of the quarter will be recorded with a "W." No drops are permitted after the fourth week except for a limited number determined by the number of credits earned at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, the student has three drops permitted after the fourth week. Any of these three drops not used by the time 45 credits are earned are forfeited. After 45 credits have been completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. These may be accumulated and used as necessary. *No drops of any kind are permitted after the last day of instruction.*

b) *Graduate Students.* Graduate students who drop courses after the first two weeks of the quarter receive a grade of "W." No drops are permitted after the seventh week of instruction.

c) Students may petition the Registrar to drop a course after the regular drop deadline if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the regular drop deadline. Petitions must be filed promptly after the occurrence of the event that gave rise to the need for dropping the course.

3. Fee Forfeiture or Refunds

a) Students will be billed for the number of credits on their programs at the end of the first week of the quarter. Only partial fee reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter.

b) Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition and fees associated with that course. Example: An undergraduate originally registered for 5 credits. The fee for 5 credits is \$114 (resident). The student then drops a 3-credit course in the second week of the quarter. The total number of credits for which the student remains registered is 2. Tuition and fees are due for the 2 credits (\$45) and one-half the difference between 5 credits and 2 credits, in this case an additional \$34.50. Total fees owed are \$79.50. The student has been registered in the dropped course for more than one week and therefore must pay half the fees for the course.

Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund. Example: A student is registered for a 3-credit course. The student drops that course after the thirtieth calendar day. No refund is available. If the student adds a different 3-credit course at the time the original 3-credit course is dropped, he or she will pay tuition and fees for 6 credits.

c) Drops become effective the date received in Sections.

4. Courses Added After the Official Change Periods

a) As a general rule, no courses may be added after the official change period. Exceptional cases may be approved if both the instructor of the course and the dean of the student's college consent.

b) Courses audited may not be changed to a credit registration after the first two weeks of the quarter.

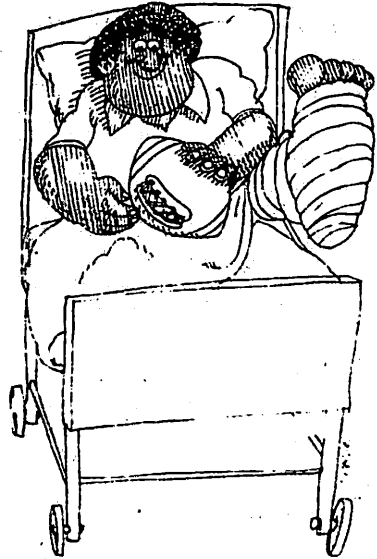
Without insurance, could you pay such expenses and still afford to continue your education?

If not, you owe it to yourself to investigate this coverage available to you as a UW student.

Brochures describing the benefits, costs and conditions of coverage are available at Hall Health Center, Schmitz Hall Information Window and the HUB.

But don't wait. Your decision to enroll or not should be indicated as you complete the university registration form for the next academic quarter. The appropriate premium and tuition must be paid by the quarterly tuition due date.

The student insurance plan has been developed by the Student Insurance Review Committee and approved by the Board of Regents.



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FEE PAYMENT

1. A fee statement will be mailed to the address you indicate on your mark-sense registration form. If you have not received a fee statement by the end of the second week of the quarter, contact the Cashier's Office for the amount of tuition due.

2. Mail your fee payment to the Student Accounts Office in the envelope provided before the due date indicated. *Fees must be paid by Friday of the third week of the quarter.*

3. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your fees, with a \$15 late fee, for one week following the due date. If fees are not paid by this time your registration will be canceled. Students permitted to reregister after cancellation for nonpayment will be charged a \$50 fee. No reregistration will be possible after Friday of the sixth week. *Please note: Even if your registration is canceled you will continue to owe one-half your tuition and fees if you are a continuing student or, if you are a new or returning student, \$50 or one-half your tuition and fees, whichever is greater.*

Quarterly Tuition and Fee Rates

Fees will increase for Autumn Quarter 1981. The exact amounts will be published after the state legislature, the governor, and the Board of Regents have adopted the fees.

Special Course and Laboratory Fees

The amounts listed in the Tuition and Fee Rate schedule normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If you change your address after you have turned in your mark-sense registration form, be sure to complete a change of address form at the Registration Office. Forms are available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall. *You are responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office of any address change.*

STUDENT INSURANCE

UW students who remain registered through at least the first six days of instruction in the quarter are eligible to enroll in the student health insurance plan. The following students are not eligible:

1. Those enrolled only in programs administered by the Department of Continuing Education or Office of Short Courses and Conferences, including but not limited to extension, correspondence, independent study, continuing studies, noncredit courses, or the Access program; or

2. UW employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption program.

Students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish student insurance automatically will be enrolled and billed for *student only* medical, surgical, and hospital insurance.

If you are billed for student insurance and wish to cancel your coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance copy of the billing statement and pay the amount billed less the indicated amount for insurance. Tuition/fees and the student health insurance premium must be paid in full by the due date to be eligible for health insurance.

International students must subscribe to the student insurance plan. Exceptions may be granted by the International Services Office if the student presents proof of other medical insurance coverage. To be eligible for health insurance, the student must pay, in full, tuition, fees, and the student health insurance premium by the due date.

WASHPIRG

An optional \$2 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the regular tuition and fees. If you want to support WASHPIRG, check the payment card and pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$2.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY (DROPPING ALL COURSES FOR THE QUARTER)

1. Obtain an approved withdrawal form from your adviser.
2. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz. *Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Registrar's Office.* Fees owed will be based upon the date the withdrawal is received in the Registrar's Office. No withdrawals will be accepted after the last day of instruction, December 9.

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University. For example, a student who withdraws during the first week of Spring Quarter and Autumn Quarter must reapply as a returning former student for winter.

The fee schedule below will be followed.

Continuing Students

a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition or fees.

b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition and fees.

c. Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe full tuition and fees.

New and Returning Students

a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.

b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter must pay one-half of regular tuition and fees or forfeit the \$50 enrollment service charge, whichever is greater.

c. Students who withdraw officially after the thirtieth calendar day must pay full tuition and fees, including the \$50 enrollment service fee.

3. Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal in time may petition the Cashier's Office for additional refund. Petition forms are available at the Cashier's Office, 129 Schmitz.

4. Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed during the first two weeks of a quarter receive no grade and no entry is made on the student's permanent academic record. Withdrawals completed after the first two weeks result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W."

GRADING SYSTEM

The University of Washington uses a numerical grading system with certain exceptions in the schools of Dentistry, Law, and Medicine. Instructors may report grades from 4.0 to 0.7 in 0.1 increments and the grade 0.0. The number 0.0 is assigned for failing work or unofficial withdrawal. Grades in the range 0.6 to 0.1 may not be assigned. Grades reported in this range will be converted by the Registrar's Office to 0.0. For graduate students, grades reported in the range 1.6-0.1 will be converted to 0.0. Numerical grades may be considered equivalent to letter grades as follows:

The Grade of Incomplete

In order to obtain credit for a course in which an Incomplete has been awarded, an undergraduate student must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the following quarter. An Incomplete grade for an Autumn Quarter course must be made up by the last day of Winter Quarter or the Incomplete will be converted to a grade of 0.0 by the Registrar, unless the instructor has indicated when assigning the Incomplete grade that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. This time limitation may be extended up to one year with instructor approval. Such approval must be received by the Registrar's Office before the end of the next quarter.

A graduate student who receives an Incomplete must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the next quarter in residence. An Incomplete received by a graduate student does not automatically convert to 0.0 but remains an Incomplete if the course work is not completed. This time limitation may be waived by the dean of the college in which the course was offered

ECONOMICS

ECON 481 Introduction to Mathematical Statistics (5)

Probability, continuous and discrete distributions, approximation to sampling distributions, generating functions, the δ -method, Jacobians, Bayes theorem; maximum likelihood, Newman-Pearson lemma, efficiency, decision theory; regression correlation, bivariate normal distribution theory. Primarily intended for business, economics, and related majors. Offered jointly with STAT 411. Prerequisites: 281 or STAT 311 or equivalent; and MATH 124, 125, 126.

ENGLISH

ENGL 200 Reading Literature (5)

Techniques and practice in reading and enjoying literature. Examines some of the best works in English and American literature and considers such features of literary meaning as imagery, characterization, narration, and patterning in sound and sense. Emphasis on literature as a source of pleasure and knowledge about human experience.

ENGL 201 Writers and Their Works (5)

Introduction to literature from the writer's point of view: a study of selected writers, why they wrote, how they wrote, what relation their literary output has to the lives they actually led, and the various general conditions under which they led them. Most offerings will include at least three writers.

ENGL 328 The Rise of American Fiction (5)

A literary form in which America has found distinctively American expression. Selected readings among important novelists from the beginnings until 1900, including Cooper, Hawthorne, Melville, Twain, Chopin, James and Wharton.

ENGL 331 English Literature: The Romantic Age (5)

An age unified by great events and hopes, diverse in responses to them. Influenced by intellectual ferment and the French Revolution, some of its writers rejected old forms and proposed ambitious projects for man and for poetry. Others cultivated old forms under new conditions or laughed at the excesses of their contemporaries. Among its major poets and prose writers were Burke and Blake, Mary Shelley and Jane Austen, Wordsworth and Byron, Lamb and Carlyle.

ENGL 340 The Modern Novel (5)

The novel on both sides of the Atlantic in the first half of the twentieth century. Includes such writers as Joyce, Woolf, Lawrence, Stein, Hemingway, Faulkner, and others.

ENGL 341 Modern Poetry (5)

Poetry in the modernist mode including such poets as Yeats, Eliot, Pound, Auden, Moore.

ENGL 359 Contemporary Novel (5)

Recent efforts to change the shape and direction of the novel by such writers as Murdoch, Barth, Hawkes, Fowles, and Atwood.

ENGL 367 Studies in Short Fiction (5)

The American and English short story, with attention to the influence of writers of other cultures. Aspects of the short story which distinguish it, in style and purpose, from longer fiction.

ENGL 370 Fantasy (5)

Non-naturalistic literature, selected folktales, fairytales, fables, nonsense, ghost stories, horror stories, science fiction, and/or utopian literature--the supernatural and surreal, the grotesque, the fantastical. Readings and emphasis will vary.

ENGL 373 Pacific Northwest Literature (5)

Concentrates in alternate years on either prose or poetry of the Pacific Northwest. Prose works examine early exploration, conflicts of native and settlement cultures, various social and economic conflicts. Northwest poetry includes consideration of its sources, formative influences, and emergence into national prominence.

ENGL 382 The Novel (5, max. 10)

Readings may be English or American and drawn from different periods or may concentrate on different types--gothic, experimental, novel of consciousness, realistic novel. Special attention to the novel as a distinct literary form. Specific topic varies from quarter to quarter.

ENGL 499 Honors Seminar (5, max. 10)

Seminar study of themes and topics offering special approaches to literature. Required of, and limited to, honors students.

GEOGRAPHY

GEOG 471 Methods of Resource Analysis (5)

Economic and non-economic criteria for resource analysis. Theory and methods of linear models of natural resource analysis. Specific topics include: materials-balance modeling, residuals management, constrained system optimization approaches to water quality analysis, land use patterns and interregional energy use, and multiple objective planning techniques applied to natural resource problems. Prerequisite: 370 or permission of instructor.

GEOG 497 Tutorial in Geography (2, max. 6)

Intensive directed study and tutoring. Literature reviews, formulations of project outlines and research designs, orientation in contemporary geographic thought and trends. Directed writing. Required for honors students. Prerequisites: advanced status; open to seniors, juniors by permission of undergraduate adviser.

GEOPHYSICS

GPYS 452 Physical Sedimentology (4)

Introduction to theoretical and experimental techniques used in studying erosion, transportation, and deposition of sediments. Analysis of sediment samples, initial motion of sediments, bed-load motion, suspension of sediment by turbulent flows, mass movement of sediments, and applications of sediment transport theory to problems of geological interest. Offered jointly with GEOL 452 and OCEAN 452. Prerequisite: 402 or permission of instructor.

HISTORY

HST 250 The Jews in Western Civilization (5)

Jewish historical experience in the Mediterranean and European worlds from Ancient Greece to modern-day Israel. Examines the condition of Jewish life in the larger societies of which the Jews have always formed a part. Emphasis on the areas of contact between the Jewish and the Gentile worlds.

HST 254 The Role of the Low Countries in the Creation of Modern Europe (3)

Culture of medieval Flanders; Reformation and overthrow of Spanish rule; Golden Age of Dutch culture and power. Recommended: 112. (Offered Autumn 1981 only.)

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

SIS 201 Introduction to International Political Economy (5)

International political economy through the examination of major facets of the post-World War II era. Analyzes the new post-war economic order and its crises in the 1970s and 1980s, North-South relations, the post-war political order and its East-West rivalry.

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES (continued)

SIS 202 Cultural Encounters and Tensions (5)

Cultural changes that underlay the development in Europe of the modern global system. Effects of the encounter between this system and other cultures as the global system expanded politically and economically beyond Europe.

East European Studies

SISRE 220 Introduction to East European Studies (5)

Geographic setting, ethnic composition, religions, cultural patterns, economic problems, social and political institutions of Eastern Europe in the past and present.

MATHEMATICS

MATH 156 Applications of Algebra to Business and Economics (5)

Use of graphs and algebraic functions as found in business and economics. Algebraic and graphical manipulations to solve problems. Exponential and logarithm functions; various applications to growth of money. Not open for credit to students who have taken 105. Prerequisites: one and a half years of high school algebra and qualifying test.

MUSIC

Dance

DANCE 490 Special Studies in Dance (1-3, max. 10)

Special studies designed to address contemporary and historical concerns in the field of dance. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

Music

MUSIC 424 Music Since 1945 (3)

Diversity of the contemporary musical scene. Vocabularies appropriate for the description and understanding of the new music developed through study of representative composers and works, and appropriate readings. Prerequisite: 314.

MUSIC 446 Advanced Studio Jazz Ensemble (2, max. 24)

Preparation and performance of material appropriate to large jazz ensemble concerts, clinics, radio and television broadcasts. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Three quarters of 208 desirable.

MUSIC 473 Keyboard Harmony and Improvisation (3)

Study and practice of harmonic progressions from the Baroque period through the twentieth century, clef reading in two or more parts, and melodic harmonization. Prerequisite: 321 or permission of instructor.

OCEANOGRAPHY

OCEAN 522 Radiochemical Tracers and Ocean Mixing (3)

Distribution of natural and bomb produced radioactive tracers in the ocean. Application of models used to derive information concerning time scales of (1) gas transfer at the water atmosphere interface; (2) whole ocean, thermocline, and deep ocean water circulation; and (3) particulate settling in the marine environment. Knowledge of elementary differential equations suggested. Prerequisites: 401, 402, 421.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

POL S 354 Elections and Voting in the United States (5)

Electoral institutions and processes of the United States: the idea and practice of elections, the electoral system, individual voting behavior, collective voting behavior, and the impact of elections on policy. Recommended: 101 or 102.

POLITICAL SCIENCE (continued)

POL S 551 American Politics II (5)

Core course in American government and politics. A systematic survey of the literature. Focuses on subnational politics. Prerequisites: undergraduate courses in American government and politics.

POL S 591 Philosophy of Political Research (3)

Philosophic issues in empirical research in political science, such as, the logic of inquiry, the role of theory, problems of concept formation, the notion of causality, and the utility and limitations of quantification. Prerequisite: 490 or equivalent and graduate standing.

ROMANCE LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Spanish

SPAN 104 Spanish Grammar Intensive (5)

Thorough review of the basics of Spanish grammar. Intended only for persons who already have some knowledge of Spanish. Not open to students who have taken 102 or 103. Prerequisite: one year pre-university Spanish, or 101, or instructor's permission.

SCANDINAVIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Norwegian

NORW 201 Second-year Norwegian (5)

Intensive practice in speaking, reading, and writing. Functional review of grammar. Prerequisite: 101, 102, 103.

Swedish

SWED 201 Second-year Swedish (5)

Intensive practice in speaking, reading, and writing. Functional review of grammar. Prerequisites: 101, 102, 103.

Scandinavian

SCAND 312 Masterpieces of Scandinavian Literature (3)

Major works of Scandinavian literature read in English translation: Ibsen, Strindberg, Kierkegaard, Dinesen, Hamsun, Undset, Laxness, Lagerlof, and Lagerkvist.

SOCIOLOGY

SOC 492 Sociology Senior Seminar (5)

Selected topics of contemporary interest, explored through a discussion group led by a sociologist active in the particular field. Prerequisite: major standing or permission of the instructor.

SPEECH COMMUNICATION

SPCH 301 Interviewing (5)

Interviewing principles and practices with emphasis on information gathering and persuasive interviews. Surveys purposes and types of interviews, the structure of interviews, and the influence of communication patterns on interview outcomes.

SPCH 484 Cultural Codes in Communication (5)

Social and cultural codes in interpersonal communication, with special reference to contemporary American subcultural groups and their communication patterns in sociolinguistics and ethnology.

SPCH 588 Small Group Communication (5)

Major small group theories relevant to communicative behavior. Descriptive and experimental research findings in current speech communication literature. Prerequisite: 473.

STATISTICS

STAT 301 Basic Statistics with Applications (5)

Structure of data sets, description and summary of these by histograms, means, standard deviations; summary of bivariate data; objectives and pitfalls of statistical studies; elements of probability theory, and its application to various statistical tests; objectives of hypothesis testing, application to data sets, and interpretation; analysis of linear regression models; practice in use of statistical methods in concrete problems. Mainly for upper division and graduate students. Prerequisite: one and one-half years of high school algebra.

STAT 390 Probability and Statistics in Engineering and Science (4)

Random variables, distribution and density functions, conditional probability and independence. Expectations and variance, Law of Large Numbers and Central Limit Theorem. Univariate and multivariate normal distributions. Transformations and propagation of errors. Maximum likelihood estimation and the method of moments. Descriptive statistics and exploratory data analysis. Regression and analysis of variance. Use of interactive computing methods throughout. Offered jointly with MATH 390. Prerequisites: MATH 327 or 238, and MATH 302 or 205.

STAT 411 Introduction to Mathematical Statistics (5)

Probability, continuous and discrete distributions, approximation to sampling distributions, generating functions, the δ -method, Jacobians, Bayes theorem; maximum likelihood, Newman-Pearson lemma, efficiency, decision theory; regression correlation, bivariate normal distribution theory. Primarily intended for business, economics, and related majors. Offered jointly with ECON 481. Prerequisites: 311 or ECON 281 or equivalent; and MATH 124, 125, 126.

STAT 498 Special Topics (2-5, max. 15)

Reading and lecture course intended for special needs of students. (Offered when demand is sufficient.) Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

STAT 499 Undergraduate Research (2-5, max. 15)

Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

STAT 520 Spectral Analysis of Time Series (3)

Estimation of spectral densities for single and multiple time series. Basic theory for nonparametric estimation of spectral density, cross-spectral density, and coherence for stationary time series, real and complex spectrum techniques. Bispectrum. Digital filtering techniques. Aliasing, prewhitening. Choice of lag windows and data windows. Use of the fast Fourier transform in spectral estimation and computation of correlation functions. The parametric autoregressive spectral density estimate for single and multiple stationary time series. Spectral analysis of nonstationary random processes, and for randomly sampled processes. Techniques of robust spectral analysis. Offered jointly with E E 520. Prerequisite: 390 or equivalent.

STAT 570 Introduction to Linear Models (3)

Review of linear algebra and matrix manipulations. Statistical distribution theory for quadratic forms of normal variables. Fitting of general linear model by least squares. Computer data analysis for classical experimental designs. Offered jointly with BIOST 570. Prerequisites: 473 or 513 and BIOST 513. (Offered Autumn Quarter 1981 only.)

WOMEN STUDIES

WOMEN 416 Sexist Language and Education (3)

How language reflects or determines sexist attitudes, particularly in current educational institutions. Includes male and female language use, systematic lexical syntactic distinctions based on sex, derogatory references to women, influences of classroom language on sex roles, and effects of language of sex differences on learning. Pre-

requisite: 200; or 15 hours in Education or Women Studies.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

ACCOUNTING

ACCTG 550 Communications in Professional Accounting (4)

Introduction to communications forms and practices of professional accountants and accounting managers. Development of effective written and oral skills employed in accounting presentations, such as audit reports and consultants reports. Study of results of organizational communications research applicable to accounting firms and/or units within firms. Prerequisite: undergraduate accounting concentration or permission of instructor.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

EDADM 519 Laboratory in Educational Administration (1-3, max. 3)

This course consists of a series of extended class sessions in which students are engaged in skill building in relation to concepts taught in the regular courses. Skill building activities selected for use in the laboratory sessions parallel the tasks facing building level and central office administrators in the public and private schools.

EDADM 601 Internship (3-9, max. 9)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

EDUCATIONAL CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

EDC&I 568 Seminar on Instruction and Curriculum for Minority Youth (3)

Examines research related to curriculum and instruction for minority youth for purpose of preparing teachers, administrators, and other educators working with students who differ from mainstream students along such dimensions as value and motivational systems, learning styles, and socialization practices. Prerequisite: EDPSY 513, 591, or permission of instructor.

EDC&I 601 Internship (3-9, max. 9)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: graduate standing and permission based on approval of proposal submitted during the quarter preceding the internship.

EDUCATIONAL POLICY STUDIES

EDEPS 601 Internship (3-9, max. 9)

Prerequisites: permission of supervisory committee chairperson and area chairperson.

HIGHER EDUCATION

EDHED 529 Resource Allocation in Higher Education (3)

After attention to the basic tools of economic analysis, focus is on application of those tools to specific topics in higher education, e.g., access, budgeting, financial and policies, and funding alternatives.

EDHED 601 Internship (3-9, max. 9)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: graduate standing and permission received at least one month prior to the beginning of the quarter in which the internship is taken.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

EDSPE 601 Internship (3-9, max. 9)

Prerequisite: graduate status, permission based on pre-arrangement of internship placement and approval by adviser.

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

ENGR 401- Methods in Applied Mathematics (4)

Acquisition of technique and experience in application of areas of mathematics encountered in science and engineering; illustrated by case studies from many fields. Applications of ordinary or differential equations; phase plane, stability, linear algebra--matrices, systems of differential equations; power series solutions, special functions. Offered jointly with AMATH 401. Prerequisite: MATH 205 and MATH 238 or AMATH 341 or permission of instructor.

ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

E E 559 Special Topics in Electrical Energy Systems (1-5)

Topics of current interest in electrical power and energy devices and systems. Content varies from year to year, based on current professional interests of faculty member in charge. May be repeated for credit by permission. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

COLLEGE OF FISHERIES

FISHERIES

FISH 408 Physiological Ecology of Shellfish (3)

The relationship between the principle physical-chemical factors of aquatic habitats and physiological adaptations of invertebrates, primarily mollusca and crustacea, are considered. The ability to tolerate extremes in unstable environments and the synergistic impact of adverse conditions at the molecular and trophic levels are examined as contributory causes to poor recruitment, reduced productivity, shifts in energy allocations, use of marginal habitats. Prerequisites: 352 and CHEM 102 or equivalents, or permission of instructor.

INTERDISCIPLINARY GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS

APPLIED MATHEMATICS

AMATH 341 Quantitative Methods in Oceanography I (3)

Application of mathematical techniques and basic principles of physics, chemistry, geology, and biology to major oceanographic problem areas. Mathematical models of biological growth, processes in marine chemistry, wave phenomena. Offered jointly with OCEAN 341. Prerequisites: one year of physics and MATH 126.

DOCTOR OF ARTS

D ART 800 Doctoral Dissertation (*)

RADIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

RAD S 508 Physical Aspects of Medical Imaging (2)

Quantitative physical principles of medical imaging are presented for electromagnetic and sonic radiation. X-ray imaging; sources, image formation, and information extraction, for CT as well as conventional systems; theory of ultrasound and resonance imaging. Offered jointly with RADGY 508. Prerequisites: 505, 506.

INTERSCHOOL OR INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAMS

BIOENGINEERING

BIOEN 510 Bioengineering Seminars (1)

Topics of current bioengineering interests are presented by faculty, visitors, and students. Graduate students actively involved in bioengineering research are eligible to enroll for credit and are expected to attend regularly, participate in discussions, and make presentations. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. (Last quarter offered: Summer 1984.)

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

BIOCHEMISTRY

BIOC 587 Molecular Aspects of Differentiation (1)

Weekly conferences on laboratory research in microbial development and/or molecular aspects of differentiation. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MEDICAL PRACTICE

MED P 601P Visiting Medical Student Clerkship (*, max. 24)

The School of Medicine accepts a limited number of students from other medical schools for individually designed clinical clerkships at the University of Washington. (Students are accepted only for clerkship sites available after all UW students are accommodated.) Prerequisites: completion of all preclinical work at the parent institution and certification from the Dean of that institution.

PHARMACOLOGY

PHCOL 519 Introduction to Laboratory Research in Pharmacology (4)

Students become familiar with and assist in the performance of research on ongoing projects in designated laboratories. Emphasis on currently employed methodology and techniques. For first-year graduate students in Pharmacology to provide a basis for future independent research.

PSYCHIATRY AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES

PBSCI 685P Geriatric Psychiatry Clerkship (4, max. 12)

A two, four, or six week elective. Students will participate in the evaluation and care of older persons with psychopathology, such as intellectual impairment and depression, in a variety of settings, including UH, HMC, and the Seattle VA. Emphasis on improving clinical skills regarding diagnosis and treatment of common behavioral problems in the elderly. Prerequisite: 664, 665, or 666.

RADIATION ONCOLOGY

R QNC 695P Clinical Cancer Management (*, max. 8)

Supervised participation in clinical management of the patient with cancer. Includes clinical evaluation, planning of treatment and follow-up examination of patients. Daily teaching conferences. Prerequisite: MED 665P or permission of instructor. (2 and/or 4 weeks.)

RADIOLOGY

RADGY 508 Physical Aspects of Medical Imaging (2)

Quantitative physical principles of medical imaging are presented for electromagnetic and sonic radiation. X-ray imaging; sources, image formation, and information extraction, for CT as well as conventional systems; theory of ultrasound and resonance imaging. Offered jointly with RAD S 508. Prerequisites: RAD S-505, 506.

RADGY 570P Physical Basis of Diagnostic Radiology (1)

Topics covered are: production of x-rays, spectra, design of x-ray systems, interactions of x-rays with matter, attenuation, filters, beam restrictors, grids, intensifying and fluoroscopic screens, x-ray film, film processing, the radiographic image, image intensifiers, cine and videotape systems, tomography, magnification radiography, exposures to patients and personnel, xerography, receiver operating characteristics, image enhancement, field emission radiography, ultrasound and computerized tomography. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: resident physician standing, or permission of instructor.

REHABILITATION MEDICINE

REHAB 432 Woodworking for Occupational Therapists (3)

Hand-tool processes, elementary machine operations, safety practices, problem solving and planning, methods of assembling and fastening, simple wood finishing as prerequisite skills to the learning of occupational therapy treatment activity applications and analyses. Prerequisite: occupational therapy major.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

COMMUNITY HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS

CHCS 551 Theoretical Foundations of Primary Care I (3)

Presentation and interpretation of theoretical bases of family-focused primary care, mutual responsibility and participation, clinical decision-making, professional leadership, and research. Emphasis on independent and interdisciplinary actions of family nurse practitioners within primary health care arenas. Provides students with conceptual foundation upon which to base their development as family nurse practitioners. Prerequisites: Family Nurse Practitioner students to take 452 concurrently. Permission of instructor.

CHCS 558 Advanced Occupational Health Nursing (5)

The integration of occupational health and community health nursing principles into a framework for occupational health nursing. Concepts from community health nursing theory, industrial hygiene, epidemiology, and toxicology are examined. Students have the opportunity to synthesize concepts and explore in depth selected occupational health problems. Includes evaluation and application of theories and research findings. Prerequisites: 550, 450, 458, ENVH 453, 571 and/or permission of instructor.

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

MEDICINAL CHEMISTRY

MEDCH 350 Medicinal and Poisonous Plants (3)

Review of the history/ethnobotany, chemistry, and physiological activity of selected higher plants which are used medicinally or are poisonous. A perspective for the current popular use of herbal remedies is provided. (For majors and advanced-level nonmajors.) Prerequisite: BIOL 212 or equivalent.

PHARMACEUTICS

PCEUT 499 Undergraduate Research (*, max. 6)

Research problems in biopharmaceutics and clinical pharmacokinetics. Prerequisites: cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and permission of instructor.

PCEUT 501 Advanced Pharmacokinetics (4)

Study of the time course of drug absorption, distribution, excretion, metabolism, and effects in mammalian systems. Compartmental model and model-independent approaches are examined. Where possible drug disposition is studied in a physiologically realistic context taking nonlinear events into account. Aimed at development of innovative methods for data analysis and evaluation in biological systems, illustrated by experimental and clinical problems. Prerequisites: 405 and 406, or equivalent, introductory calculus.

PCEUT 520 Seminar (1, max. 5)

Graduate students attend seminars and make one formal presentation per year while in residence: 1 credit per year is allowed. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

PCEUT 583 Topics in Pharmaceutics (1, max. 15)

Discussion of pertinent articles from current literature and recent laboratory results. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

PCEUT 600 Independent Study or Research (*)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

PCEUT 700 Master's Thesis (*)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

PCEUT 800 Doctoral Dissertation (*)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

PHARMACY PRACTICE

PHARM 471 Externship in Institutional Practice (*, max. 15)

Closely supervised study-experience periods in hospital or other institutional pharmacies. Ordinarily, students rotate through two periods of five weeks each, and they participate in active pharmacy practice under the supervision of a preceptor. Conferences on selected topics supplement the work experience. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

PHARM 583 Advanced Clinical Pharmacy and Therapeutics I (5)

A lecture-discussion format with extensive reading assignments for each topic. Disease states with current therapeutic approaches are the major emphasis. Infectious diseases, oncology and chemotherapy, and gastrointestinal diseases are covered. Prerequisite: graduate standing in Department of Pharmacy Practice.

SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

ENVH 550 Microscopy of Particulates (2)

A consideration of modern microscopical instrumentation and the techniques used to identify, describe and study the wide variety of particles, dusts, and fibers that occur in our societal and industrial environments. Sample preparation methods, theory and practical use of light microscopy, transmission electron microscopy, and scanning electron microscopy. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

ENVH 584 Occupational Health and Safety Legislation (2)

Occupational health and safety legislation in the United States and other nations, the social issues leading to passage of such legislation, effectiveness of the legislation, policy issues and proposed solutions. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

PATHOBIOLOGY

PABIO 583 Seminars on Frontier Membrane Research (1, max. 4)

Research seminars on structure and function of cell surface membranes are presented for postdoctoral fellows and graduate students. A detailed discussion on experimental design based on current topics of cell surfaces structure and function will be made among researchers in the Dept. of Pathobiology, and Division of Biochemical Oncology, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center. This course can be regarded as advanced stage supplement to the membrane course 525.
