after the change periods receive no entry on their academic record if the drop is made during the first two weeks of the quarter, except if all courses are dropped then a university withdrawal date is entered. Drops made during the third and fourth weeks of the quarter will be recorded with a "W." No drops are permitted after the fourth week except a limited number may be dropped as determined by the number of credits earned at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, a student has three drops permitted after the fourth week. Any of these three drops not used at the time 45 credits are earned are forfeited. After 45 credits have been completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. These may be accumulated and used as necessary. No drops, other than hardship withdrawals may be made after the last day of instruction.

b) *Graduate Students.* Graduate students who drop courses after the first two weeks of the quarter receive a grade of "W." No drops are permitted after the seventh week of instruction.

c) Students may petition the Registrar for a hardship withdrawal after the regular drop deadline if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the regular drop deadline. Petitions must be filed promptly after the occurrence of the event that gave rise to the need for dropping the course. Hardship withdrawals are for dropping individual courses only. See section on Withdrawal from the University for the procedure to follow for dropping all courses for the quarter; no petition is required.

3. Fee Forfeitures or Refunds

a) Students will be billed for the number of credits, including audit hours, on their programs at the end of the first week of the quarter. Only partial fee reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter.

b) Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition and fees associated with that course. Example: An undergraduate originally registered for 5 credits. The fee for 5 credits is \$265 (resident). The student then drops a 3-credit course in the second week of the quarter. The total number of credits for which the student remains registered is 2. Tuition and fees are due for the 2 credits (\$106) and one-half the difference between 5 credits and 2 credits, in this case an additional \$79.50. Total fees owed are \$185.50. The student has been registered in the dropped course for more than one week and therefore must pay half the fees for the course.

c) Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund. Example: A student is registered for a 3-credit course. The student drops that course after the thirtieth calendar day. No refund is available. If the student adds a different 3-credit course at the time the original 3-credit course is dropped, he or she will pay tuition and fees for 6 credits.

d) The effect of fee forfeitures on the over-18-credit surcharge is as follows: forfeitures for courses dropped that exceeded 18 credits are charged the same as in (b) and (c) above. Also, if a student drops a course after the thirtieth calendar day and adds another, an additional fee per credit will be charged as appropriate. Example: if a student is registered for 15 credits, drops one 5-credit course and then adds another 5-credit course, after the thirtieth calendar day, he or she will be charged for 20 credits although the student's class schedule will show only the 15 registered credits. As a result, he or she will pay for 2 credits above the 18-credit limit.

e) Drops become effective the date received in Sections.

4. Courses Added After the Official Change Period

a) As a general rule, no courses may be added after the official change period. Exceptional cases may be approved if both the instructor of the course and the dean of the student's college consent.

b) Courses audited may not be changed to a credit registration after the first two weeks of the quarter.

FEE PAYMENT

1. You should indicate your permanent or local address on your mark-sense registration form for fee statement mailing. If you have not received a fee statement by the end of the second week of the quarter, contact the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office for the amount of tuition due.

2. You may pay your fees in person in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office or mail them to UW, Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz, PE-10, Seattle, WA 98195, before the tuition due date. Fees must be paid by Friday of the third week of the quarter whether or not you have received a statement. Payments postmarked on or before the due date are accepted without a late fee. Metered mail received after the due date is subject to penalties as described in # 3 below.

3. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your fees, with a \$30 late fee, for one week following the due date. If fees have not been received in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by this time, your registration will be cancelled. Students permitted to reregister after cancellation for nonpayment will be charged a \$75 fee, in addition to their tuition.

4. If you reregister, you must reregister for all classes on your schedule at the time of registration cancellation. (Fees will include appropriate charges for classes dropped during the forfeiture period.) All fees for registration must be paid by cash, money order, or cashier's check. No reregistration will be possible after the last day of instruction. *Please note: Even if your registration is canceled you will continue to owe one-half your tuition and fees.*

5. Credit card checks are not accepted.

6. Tuition and fees not paid by the end of the academic quarter will be subject to an interest charge of 1% per month, or a fraction thereof (12% A.P.R.), beginning the month following the end of the quarter.

Special Course and Laboratory Fees

The amounts charged for tuition and fees normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If you change your address after you have turned in your mark-sense registration form, be sure to complete a change of address form at the Registration Office. Forms are available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall. *You are responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office of any address change.*

STUDENT INSURANCE

UW students who remain registered through at least the first six days of instruction in the quarter are eligible to enroll in the student health insurance plan. The following students are not eligible:

1. Those enrolled only in programs administered by Continuing Education or Conferences and Institutes, including but not limited to extension, correspondence, independent study, continuing studies, noncredit courses, or the Access program.

2. UW employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption program.

Students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish student insurance automatically will be enrolled and billed for *student only* medical, surgical, and hospital insurance.

If you are billed for student insurance and wish to cancel your coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance copy of the billing statement and pay the amount billed less the indicated amount for insurance. If you wish to change or add coverage, you must do so in person in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by the date tuition is due. Tuition/fees and the student health insurance premium must be paid in full by the due date to be eligible for health insurance.

International Students

International students must subscribe to the student insurance plan. Penalties for not paying insurance fees by the tuition due date are the same as tuition penalties under #3 of Fee Payment section. Exceptions may be granted by the International Services Office if the student presents proof of other medical insurance coverage. Students are responsible for obtaining a waiver each Autumn Quarter (or upon initial admission if other than Autumn Quarter), because waivers are valid only through Summer Quarter each year. Students holding insurance policies that expire during the academic year are responsible for obtaining new waiver cards, as necessary. Insurance waiver cards submitted during the late payment period require a \$30 late fee. To be eligible for the student health insurance plan, the student must pay, in full, tuition, fees, and the student health insurance premium by the due date. International students who want coverage during the Summer Quarter and are not enrolled Summer Quarter must prepay the Summer Quarter premium during one of the preceding quarters.

WASHPIRG

An optional \$2 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the regular tuition and fees. If you want to support WASHPIRG, pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$2.

WASHINGTON STUDENT LOBBY (WSL)

An optional \$1 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Student Lobby (WSL), a voluntary, independent organization of university students whose purpose is to influence the state legislative process on matters of special interest to students. Students not wishing to support this activity simply pay the regular tuition and fees. Students supporting WSL pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$1.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY (DROPPING ALL COURSES FOR THE QUARTER)

1. Obtain an approved withdrawal form from your adviser or from the Withdrawal Office.

2. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz. *Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Registrar's Office. Fees owed will be based upon the date the withdrawal is received in the Registrar's Office. No withdrawals accepted after the last day of instruction, December 10.*

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University. For example, a student who withdraws during the first week of Spring Quarter and Autumn Quarter must reapply as a returning former student for Winter Quarter.

3. Students are required to turn in their student I.D. cards when they withdraw and are not eligible to continue using University services or facilities after their withdrawal.

The forfeiture schedule for withdrawing from the University is as follows:

a) Continuing Students

(1) Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition or fees.

(2) Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition and fees.

(3) Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe full tuition and fees.

b) New and Returning Students

(1) Students withdrawing through the sixth day of the quarter forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.

(2) Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter must pay one-half of the regular tuition and fees.

(3) Students who withdraw officially after the thirtieth calendar day must pay full tuition and fees, including the \$50 enrollment service fee.

4. Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal in time may petition the Comptroller's Office. Petition forms are available at the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz.

5. Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed during the first two weeks of a quarter receive no grade and no entry except date of withdrawal is made on the student's permanent academic record. Withdrawals completed after the first two weeks result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W."

GRADING SYSTEM

The University of Washington uses a numerical grading system with certain exceptions in the schools of Dentistry, Law, and Medicine. Instructors may report grades from 4.0 to 0.7 in 0.1 increments and the grade 0.0. The number 0.0 is assigned for failing work or unofficial withdrawal. Grades in the range 0.6 to 0.1 may not be assigned. Grades reported in this range will be converted by the Registrar's Office to 0.0. For graduate students, grades reported in the range 1.6-0.1 will be converted to 0.0; 100-200-level courses are excluded from credits earned and grade-point averages although such grades are recorded on the transcript; for 300-level courses and courses numbered 600, 601, 700, 750, and 800, grades are recorded and credit is allowed but grades are not included in the grade-point averages. Numerical grades may be considered equivalent to letter grades as follows:

Repeating Courses

With the approval of the academic department offering the course, an undergraduate student may repeat a course once. Both the original grade and the second grade will be computed in the student's grade-point average but credit will be allowed once. Students repeating courses should so indicate on their registration form.

The Grade of Incomplete

In order to obtain credit for a course in which an Incomplete has been awarded, an undergraduate student must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the following quarter. An Incomplete grade for a Spring Quarter course must be made up by the last day of Autumn Quarter or the Incomplete will be converted to a grade of 0.0 by the Registrar, unless the instructor has indicated when assigning the Incomplete grade that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. This time limitation may be extended up to one year maximum with instructor approval. Such approval must be received by the Registrar's Office before the end of the next quarter.

A graduate student who receives an Incomplete must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the next quarter *in residence*. An Incomplete received by a graduate student does not automatically convert to 0.0 but remains an Incomplete if the course work is not completed. This time limitation may be waived by the dean of the college in which the course was offered only if the nature of the uncompleted work is such as to make the fulfillment of this requirement impossible. In no case can an Incomplete received by a graduate student be converted to a passing grade after a lapse of two

years. The Incomplete grade entry remains on the record permanently. The final grade is posted under the quarter in which the final grade is received.

Incomplete grades may only be awarded if the student is doing satisfactory work up until the last two weeks of the quarter. Undergraduate students must not reregister for courses in which they have received an Incomplete. A grade earned in a repeat course will not be recorded as an incomplete conversion grade.

Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis. Advisers should be consulted, and in no case are students allowed to register for more than one course or 6 credits on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter. A course in which an "S" is earned may not be used to satisfy any department, college, or University requirement, except that the credits may be applied to the minimum of 180 credits required for graduation. Each instructor will report conventional grades to the Registrar, who will convert satisfactory grades (2.0 or greater) to "S," and unsatisfactory grades (less than 2.0) to "NS" for the student's transcript. No more than 25 S/NS credits will apply to an undergraduate degree. *S/NS must be elected during initial registration or added or dropped*

during the official change of program period. Undergraduate students earning grades of 2.0 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory) while grades below 2.0 are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory).

Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). With the approval of his or her graduate program adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairperson, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on an S/NS basis.

In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS are included in the grade-point average, N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

Credit/No Credit-Only Courses

Some courses are offered on a CR/NC-only basis. It is not necessary to register S/NS to take these courses, because the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

Final examinations should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule.

The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed:

1. With the dean's permission, the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for changing the date of a final examination.

2. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.

3. A student absent from any examination through sickness or other cause, judged by the instructor to be unavoidable, shall be given an opportunity to take a rescheduled examination or perform work judged by the instructor to be the equivalent. If the instructor determines that

neither alternative is feasible during the current quarter, the instructor may exempt the student from the requirement. Examples of unavoidable cause include death or serious illness in the immediate family, illness of the student, and, provided previous notification is given, observance of regularly scheduled religious obligations.

4. Classes that meet on the hour use the first full hour of instruction to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that meets at 10 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.

5. Classes that begin on the half hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the examination time. For example, a class that meets at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9:00 a.m. would use the 7:30 a.m. time.

6. Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may use that room at 8:30 a.m. or 2:30 p.m. for a three-hour examination. All other examinations are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.

7. If an examination is held at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure that the room is going to be available.

Questions concerning the examination schedule should be directed to Room Assignments, 543-1080.

INDEPENDENT STUDY THROUGH CORRESPONDENCE

AMATH 514 NETWORKS AND COMBINATORIAL OPTIMIZATION (3)

Offered jointly with MATH 514. See Mathematics for description.

COMMUNICATIONS

CKU 425 ADVANCED JOURNALISM METHODS (5, MAX. 10)

Reporting regional trends; analyzing and using aggregate data; news planning. Prerequisites: 322 and 328, or permission of instructor.

CKU 501 DEVELOPMENT OF MASS COMMUNICATION (5)

Institutions of mass communication. Political and Social roles.

DRAMA

DRAMA 401 DRAMA COLLOQUIUM (1-, MAX. 3)

Weekly lectures by guest artists, presentations by faculty or students of works in progress. Required of all undergraduate and graduate drama majors.

DRAMA 441 BEGINNING PLAYWRITING (5, MAX. 10)

Writing exercises and drafts of a one-act play provide students with their first experience in writing for performance. Readings of representative one-act plays introduce genres and writing styles. Prerequisites: 253 or 353; and 210,211,212; or practical theatre experience.

DRAMA 454 PROJECTS IN ACTING (3, MAX. 9)

Rehearsal and classroom performance of dramatic literature of various periods and styles. Prerequisite: audition.

GENERAL AND INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

GIS 101 THE UNIVERSITY AND ITS STUDENTS (2)

A seminar for first-quarter freshmen aimed at acquainting them with the history, organization, and curriculum of their university. Attention also devoted to the national research literature on undergraduate students.

GIS 250 CONTEMPORARY ISSUES IN COLLEGIATE SPORTS (5)

Survey of the contemporary issues in collegiate sports arising from the impact of sports on the society, the academic community, and the athletes. Issues cover competition, drugs, gambling, ethics, recruiting, racism, and women in sports. (Last quarter offered, Sp 87)

HISTORY

HST 315 HISTORY OF TECHNOLOGY FROM ANTIQUITY TO THE TWENTIETH CENTURY (5)

Development of humanity's ability to understand more fully and utilize more efficiently the natural environment, stressing technology's changing social, economic, scientific, and cultural relationships. Emphasis on technology in the United States. (Last quarter offered, A 86)

MATHEMATICS

MATH 514 NETWORKS AND COMBINATORIAL OPTIMIZATION (3)

Networks and directed graphs. Paths and trees. Feasible and optimal flows and potentials. Transportation problems, matching and assignment problems. Algorithms and applications. Offered jointly with AMATH 514. Prerequisites: 302 and 327, or equivalent.

NEAR EASTERN LANGUAGES AND CIVILIZATION

N E 445 MODERN JEWISH FICTION (3)

Examines nineteenth and twentieth century fiction of Jewish writers from America, Europe, North Africa, and Israel. Authors include: Sholem Aleichem, I.B. Singer, Henry Roth, Bernard Malamud, Cynthia Ozick, Albert Memmi, Elie Wiesel, S.Y. Agnon, S. Yizhar, H. Hazaz, Yehuda Amichai, Amos Oz, and A.B. Yehoshua. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. (Last quarter offered; A 86)

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

EDUCATIONAL CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

EDCAI 488 EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY AND LEARNING IN ALTERNATIVE SETTINGS (3)

Examination of how educational technology can be used to encourage learning in nonschool environments such as museums, radio and television broadcasts, parks and recreation centers, and distance education programs. Students investigate one of these areas and prepare a project.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

EDSPE 562 CURRICULA FOR PRESCHOOL HANDICAPPED CHILDREN (3)

Provides information about basic theoretical models and approaches to curricula for handicapped preschoolers. Students introduced to prominent and specific preschool curricula, develop skills to assist them in critiquing and evaluating curricula, learn how to adapt materials for specific populations and plan and program for exceptional preschoolers.

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

MATERIALS SCIENCE ENGINEERING

MSE 599 CRYSTAL STATISTICS (3)

Microscopic behavior of atoms and molecules using statistical thermodynamics of crystalline systems. Cluster variation method (CVM) used as basic mathematical tool in formulating free energy and deriving equilibrium state. Introduction of theoretical tools useful in working out phase relations in crystals; correction of prevailing misunderstanding in phase equilibrium thermodynamics. (Last quarter offered, A 86)

SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION

STC 501 THEORETICAL DIMENSIONS OF TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION (3)

An examination of theories and research drawn from a variety of fields that inform such topics as the historical and social context of technical communication, the aims of technical discourse, readability, invention and audience, audience analysis, technical style and graphics. Prerequisite: admission into a engineering Master's program or permission of instructor.

STC 598 SPECIAL TOPICS (1-5, MAX. 6)

Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

STC 599 SPECIAL PROJECTS (1-4)

Written report required. Prerequisite: permission of program director.

STC 600 INDEPENDENT STUDY OR RESEARCH (*)

Written report required. Prerequisite: permission of program director.

STC 700 MASTER'S THESIS (*, MAX. 9)

Prerequisite: permission of thesis advisor.

INTERSCHOOL/INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAMS

UNIVERSITY CONJOINT

UCONJ 501 INTERNATIONAL HEALTH EDUCATION (1)

Weekly two-hour seminar provides in-depth and concrete preparation for international health work, involving extensive use of case studies, a problem-solving format, and time for teaching practical skills and tools relevant to clinical, epidemiological, and laboratory needs. Each seminar prepared and presented by a faculty/student team.

PARKING REGULATIONS

THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON

STUDENTS PARKING GUIDE

The University of Washington endorses and promotes several modes of alternative transportation. To avoid traffic congestion and high transportation costs while commuting to campus, choose riding a bicycle, moped, motorcycle, carpool, vanpool, use the ride-matching service, or ride the bus rather than driving alone.

Transit

Many buses commute daily to the University District and through the campus, stopping along Stevens Way at five locations. Timetables are available at Commuter Information Centers located at the HUB-main floor, South Campus Center, University Hospital Lobby, and By George Deli. Monthly bus passes for Metro and Community Transit are sold at a discount with a current ASUW card at the HUB, South Campus Center, and Cashier's Office in Schmitz Hall.

Health Sciences Express

Shuttle bus service is available between the University Hospital/Health Sciences Center and affiliated hospitals and medical facilities. For more information, call 545-1522.

Carpool Parking (Daily Pay)

Three or more persons—Vehicles entering with three or more persons can park for 50¢ per day, payable upon entrance. Parking area will be assigned by the gate attendant. A designated number of spaces is available between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. to carpools entering campus through the following gates:

Gate 2 (NE 45th St. and 17th Ave. NE entrance to campus)—175 spaces. Parking area N-5.

Gate 3 (25th Ave. NE entrance to campus)—75 spaces in Padelford Garage.

Gate 1 (NE 41st and 15th Ave. NE)—Between 7 a.m. and 9:30 a.m., a designated number of spaces (300) is available in Central Plaza Garage. After 9:30 a.m., three person carpools will be parked on a space available basis.

Two or more persons—Montlake Lot—E-1 (north of the IMA tennis courts)—Carpool spaces are available in the south end between 7 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. for 25¢ per day. Upon entering through the southwest gate, the driver will be given 35¢; when exiting, the driver will pay the normal 60¢ charge. (Discontinued during Summer Quarter and breaks.)

Gate 8 (Stadium entrance to E-12)—Carpool spaces are available for vehicles for 50¢ per day, payable upon entrance. Parking based upon space availability.

Evening—Two or more persons—After 4 p.m., a reduced rate of 25¢ is available to Gate 8, except for special events.

Note: Carpool permits (annual or quarterly) are issued to only faculty and staff. A student may be a member only.

Ride-matching Service

The University provides a ride-matching service for carpools and vanpools. For more information, contact the Transportation Information Office (545-0450).

Motorcycle, Moped and Scooter Parking

A motorcycle parking permit may be purchased at the Parking Division Office on a quarterly basis for \$7.50/quarter or on an annual basis for \$30.00/year. On a daily basis, permits may be purchased at a campus gate for 50¢. Motorcycles, scooters and mopeds must park only in designated cycle areas. Residence hall motorcycle parking is assigned through the Residence Halls. For more information, see Parking Division's Motorcycle Brochure.

Daily Pay Parking

Daily pay parking is available in the following areas:

East Campus:

Montlake Lot—E-1 (north of the IMA tennis courts); 60¢ upon exiting.

E-5 (east of E-1): purchase a 25¢ ticket from the machine in lot E-5.

E-3 and E-4 (east of E-5): purchase a 25¢ ticket from the machine in lot E-4.

West Campus:

W-44 (NE Northlake Pl. and 7th Ave. NE): purchase a 25¢ ticket from the machine. Tickets purchased from the machine must be visibly displayed in the vehicle. Tickets are valid for one day and expire at midnight.

Central Plaza Garage:

The Central Plaza Garage (levels B, C, and D) is available for visitor parking. Pay \$3.00 upon entrance, and a prorated refund will be made upon exiting if you stay less than three hours.

Evening Parking

Students registered in evening classes may purchase night permits on a quarterly basis at the Parking Division Office. These permits are valid weekdays from 4 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. and Saturday mornings. Student I.D. cards or proof of University registration and a valid driver's license are required. Individual night permits are available at campus gates for \$1.25 and expire at 7:30 a.m.

Residence Hall Permits

Residence hall students must apply for parking for the academic year through their residence hall complex desk. Assignments are issued through the residence halls based upon priority (number of quarters). For summer quarter only, students must apply at the Parking Division Office and assignments are issued on a first-come, first-served basis.

Quarterly Permit

Very limited permit parking is available to commuting students on a first-come first-served basis the first day of school at the Parking Division Office, 3917 University Way NE. Student I.D. cards or proof of University registration and a valid driver's license must be presented with the parking permit application. Parking areas available to students are E-2 in the east campus (across from the University Village Shopping Center) and W-40 in the west campus (on NE Northlake Pl. and 8th Ave. NE). Parking permits are \$37.50 per academic quarter and renewable.

Disabled Parking

Physically disabled students (including those in wheelchairs) with a confirming letter of disability from Hall Health Center will be issued parking in areas according to need. Permits are \$37.50 and \$51.00 per quarter, based on the area. Applications may be made one week prior to the first day of school or anytime thereafter.

Shuttle bus service is available (7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) for disabled students on a reservation dial-a-ride basis at 545-1511. Service can be scheduled for an entire quarter if necessary. All rides are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis. Vehicles are equipped with wheelchair lifts.

Renewing Permits

Residence Hall students should renew their academic year permits by applying to their residence hall complex desk. Commuting students should renew their quarterly permits for the next quarter at the Parking Division Office approximately two weeks before the first day of class. All renewal permits not purchased before the first day of school each quarter go on sale to new applicants. Disabled students whose disability form has expired must obtain another form from Hall Health Center before renewing their permit.

Parking Violations

Any outstanding campus parking violation(s) must be settled before a parking permit will be issued or renewed. Contact Parking Violations Division, (HE-15), 1117 NE Boat St. (543-9008).
