Final examinations must be administered according to the above schedule.

Classes not assigned by the above schedules may use any time during the examination days which is mutually agreeable to faculty and students concerned, provided it is scheduled no later than Friday, June 12, and no student has conflict with another examination.

*Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day may use 8:30-11:20 or 2:30-5:20 for the examination; but in 5-credit courses which meet Monday and Wednesday, or Monday, Wednesday, and Friday for lecture, with quizzes or laboratories at various hours, there may be students who have other classes meeting on Tuesday and Thursday at the same hours as the Monday and Wednesday, or Monday, Wednesday, and Friday lectures. In order not to penalize those students who will have an examination in the Tuesday and Thursday course from 10:30-12:20 or 4:30-6:20 the same day, and to insure equity, the examination must be terminated at the end of one hour and fifty minutes and all examination papers must be collected.

†Examinations for all 4:30 College of Education classes numbered 400 and above will be administered at 4:30 on the day of the final examination period on which the class is normally taught.

Instructors of 5-credit courses, which do not occupy the

same classroom five days a week, who wish to give a 3-hour examination must ascertain whether or not there is a 2- or 3-credit course occupying the classroom on other days of the week which will be holding an examination scheduled for the 10:30 hour. If that proves to be the case the instructor must arrange for another examination room by calling Room Assignments, Ext. 3-1080.

All students in undergraduate courses shall be required to take final examinations, provided that in a course for which an examination is not an appropriate test of the work covered, the instructor, with the consent of the dean of the school or college concerned, may dispense with the final examination.

The Faculty Code specifies that "special early examinations given to individual students or groups of students as substitutes for final examinations are prohibited."

Working students are responsible for arranging their work hours to enable them to attend the final examinations.

A student absent from a scheduled final examination, either by permission of his dean or through sickness or other unavoidable cause, shall be given a grade of Incomplete if his work in that course has been satisfactory until the time of his absence. He may remove this Incomplete in the manner provided for the removing of Incomplete grades. In all other cases of absence from the scheduled final examination, a student shall be given a grade of EW.

CHANGES IN UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS

The University and its colleges and schools reserve the right to change the fees, rules, and calendar regulating admission and registration, instruction in, and graduation from the University and its various divisions, and to change any other regulations affecting the student body. Changes shall go into force whenever the proper authorities so determine, and shall apply not only to prospective students but also to those who at that time are matriculated in the University. The University also reserves the right to withdraw courses at any time.

A graduate student must satisfy the requirements for an advanced degree which are in force at the time the degree is to be awarded.

GENERAL REGISTRATION DIRECTIONS

See each quarter's registration poster for exact dates and deadlines.

It is the University's expectation that a student will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the *General Catalog*. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and the student is persuaded that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, he may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the Office of the Dean of the School or College in which he is enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer the student to the proper office for a decision.

1. All matriculated students currently in school who plan to register for the following quarter must register by Advance Registration and pay fees by the deadline stated on their fee cards. Registration will be cancelled if fees are not paid on time.

WARNING: STUDENTS WHO DO NOT COMPLETE ADVANCE REGISTRATION (INCLUDING PAYMENT OF FEES BY THE DATE STIPULATED ON THEIR FEE CARD) WILL NOT BE GUARANTEED A PLACE FOR SPRING QUARTER.

In-Person appointments, primarily designed for former and new students, may well be filled if a continuing student waits to apply for an In-Person Registration appointment. Continuing students who fail to participate in Advance Registration and are later granted permission to register In-Person will be assessed a \$15.00 service charge.

2. All nonmatriculated students currently in school who plan to register for the following quarter must request an appointment and register in person. Appointments will be issued on a space-available basis.

All former matriculated and nonmatriculated students not currently registered must make application as soon as possible since space is limited. (For information call 543-5920.)

All new entering students should file application for admission and credentials with the Director of Admissions as soon as possible. Space is limited and in-person registration appointments will be issued on a space-available basis.

3. It is your responsibility to plan and select the required courses for your degree objective. Check your *General Catalog* for degree requirements.
4. Note the following University requirements.
 - a. Every student who has not satisfied the three-quarter lower-division Physical Education Activity graduation requirement is held responsible for including a Physical Education Activity on his Official Program each quarter until this requirement is satisfied.
 - b. The Selective Service requires full-time registration to maintain student status.
 - c. Students registering for more than 13 credits must select an afternoon class meeting at 12:30 p.m. or after, if one is available. Only a daily class or two 2-hour laboratories, except lower-division

ROTC and Physical Education Activity, will satisfy this afternoon class requirement. Waiver of the afternoon class requirement must be approved by your dean or his authorized representative.

- d. Immigration students with undergraduate status must register for a minimum of 12 credits per quarter; with graduate status, 8 credits.
- e. Veterans: Minimum full-time load exclusive of lower-division ROTC and Physical Education activity:

P.L. 815 and 894 (Disabled Veterans), 15 credits. Veterans under P.L. 815 or 894 must have their Official Programs approved by their training officer each quarter.

P.L. 358 (Veterans Act of 1966), 14 credits.

P.L. 634 (Children of Deceased and Totally Disabled Veterans), 14 credits. Minimum requirement to use P.L. 634, 7 credits.

Graduate and Summer Quarter students should consult with the Veterans Division regarding minimum credits to be a full-time student.

- f. New students and students returning after an absence of one calendar year are required to submit results of a medical examination by a private physician on the University's Health History and Medical Examination form prior to initial registration.
5. Obtain an Official Program at your adviser's office.
 6. Print with a *BLACK LEAD PENCIL* on your Official Program.
 - a. Fill in all personal information, including your Permanent Student Number.
 - b. Enter courses, credits, and sections in the space provided. *Do not enter hours.* If you have work, transportation, or other activities that will affect the arrangement of your schedule, note them in the area provided.
 - c. Print an "R" before *required* courses, an "E" before *elective* courses, and a P/F for courses taken by Pass/Fail, in the column provided.
 - d. Check to be certain that you have the prerequisites, as indicated in the *General Catalog*, for the courses you select.
 - e. List *alternate courses* which can be substituted in case courses on your original schedule are closed. Indicate whether these alternates are required or elective. The listing of alternate courses may prevent a change of registration.
 - f. Obtain course permission signatures where indicated in this time schedule. If you are registering

for a course out-of-quarter, obtain the required permission form at your advisory office.

- g. If you have a known conflict of hours, obtain written permission for the conflict from the departments concerned. Authorization signatures must appear in the course permission area of the Official Program.
- h. Take your Official Program to your adviser for his signature, if required.
- i. All courses offered within the College of Arts and Sciences which have an Honors designation (excluding English 101H and 103H) require an ASPH permission stamp.

ADVANCE REGISTRATION ONLY

7. a. Take your Official Program to the Administration Building lobby (Engineering students go to 353 Loew Hall).
- b. Follow posted instructions.
- c. In Advance Registration, programs are accepted by class, with graduates and seniors first; then juniors, sophomores, and freshmen. Every effort is made to comply with your requests. If a course is closed an approved alternate course will be substituted.
- d. You will be mailed a fee card, a copy of your scheduled Official Program with additional registration instructions, and two Information Cards. *Read the enclosed instructions CAREFULLY.*
- e. Mail your fee card, fee payment, and your two Information Cards to the Cashier in the envelope provided, before the due date indicated. *Return your fee card and your Information Cards, without exception, even though no cash payment may be required.*
- f. If the above items are received by the date specified on your fee card, your registration will be complete.

If you find a conflict in hours or an error in credits, *pay your fees by the due date anyway*. Report to Sections at your earliest convenience for an adjustment of your schedule. You need not wait for the change of program period.

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION ONLY

8. On the day and time of your appointment:
 - a. Present your approved Official Program and your appointment card at the Registration Office, second floor; Schmitz Hall, to obtain a Registration Packet.
 - b. Take the Registration Packet and your Official Program to Sections, 105 Schmitz Hall (Engineering students go to 353 Loew Hall).
 - c. As soon as you are scheduled and receive a copy of your Official Program, report to the Cashier's Office and pay your fees.

CHANGE OF PROGRAM

Drop or Add

1. Obtain a Change of Program card at your advisory office and have it approved by your adviser, if required. Obtain permission signatures, where indicated in this *Time Schedule*, for any courses that you plan to enter. All changes involving Freshman English Composition must be authorized in writing by the Freshman English Department, Padelford Hall. All changes in undergraduate chemistry courses must be cleared at 139 Bagley Hall.
2. Present the Change of Program card at the Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall, where you will be given an appointment for Sections.
3. A service charge of \$5.00 is made for Change of Program.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY

1. Obtain a withdrawal form from your advisory office, and have it approved by your adviser.
2. Present the withdrawal form at the Information Window, lobby, Schmitz Hall. Withdrawal is not official until the form is presented to the Registrar's Office.

WARNING:

All Autumn, Winter, and Spring Quarter fees (except those indicated as not subject to refund) will be refunded less an enrollment service charge of \$50.00 if complete withdrawal is made prior to the sixth day of instruction; one-half of said fees less a \$25.00 enrollment service charge will be refunded if withdrawal is made during the first thirty calendar days, except for Air Force or Army ROTC uniform deposits.

Students withdrawing under discipline forfeit all rights to the return of any portion of the fees.

NEW

499 Undergraduate Research (*, max. 6)

Individual or small group studies in which students may select topics with approval of faculty sponsor and department. Prerequisite, permission.

LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

NEW

242 Design Basics (6)

Intensive study in the analysis of, approach to, solution of, and presentations of, basic landscape architectural problems. Prerequisites, Architecture 401, 406, 411 (formerly 225) and/or permission.

URBAN PLANNING

NEW

210 Contemporary Urban Problems (2)

Study of major trends and problems in urban America which have grown out of our past or have become important today. A new topic and materials each quarter. Topics are selected for their contemporary importance, environmental (biocultural) impact, and planning implications. History is used as our chief record of their past, not as a blueprint of the present and future.

NEW

431 Quantitative Analytical Models and Methods (3)

A survey of probabilistic and mathematical models and other techniques of operations research relevant to planning. Emphasis will be placed upon linear and dynamic programming, critical path methods, queuing models, networks, and the Bayesian approach to decision making under uncertainty. Stress will be placed upon the underlying model and implications for planning rather than on mathematical detail. Prerequisite, 430 or permission.

NEW

446 Field Study (2-4)

Explicit task assignment in a community development organization under professional and academic supervision. Placement arranged by the Bureau of Community Development. Participation ordinarily limited to seniors. Prerequisite, permission of the instructor.

NEW

475 Directed Social Change (3)

General course for both undergraduate and graduate students on the theories and practice of directed social change and citizen involvement in the planning process.

NEW

500 Survey of Urban Planning (3)

Concepts and logic of planning as a professional activity. Evolution of guiding ideas in relation to changing social, economic, and environmental conditions within the American political framework. Major procedures used by planners. Critical appraisal. Not open to students who have taken 400. Prerequisite, graduate standing in Urban Planning.

NEW

501 Resources for Urban Planning (2)

Introduction to areas of specialized study in

environmental planning and policy programming. Organization for planning in the Seattle region; range of activities and emphasis, established and changing roles. Required of new graduate students; not open to others. Prerequisite, graduate standing in Urban Planning.

NEW

525 Transportation and Land Use Planning Models (3)

Theory underlying land use and transportation planning models; past attempts to model urban development; modeling of alternatives; forecasting technological innovation, assessing its land-use implications. Offered jointly with CETC 525.

NEW

535 Airport Systems Planning (3)

Investigation of physical, sociopolitical, and economic features of air transportation system planning. Emerging technologies. Intermodal relationships. The decision-making environment for resource allocation, land-use planning, programming, and organization. Scenarios of anticipated conflict resolution problems. Offered jointly with CETC 535.

NEW

546 Practicum (3-5)

Field work assignments to participate in some phase of a community problem-solving activity utilizing planning skills. Placement is ordinarily arranged by the Bureau of Community Development. Enrollment for credit is limited to one quarter. Prerequisites, permission of the instructor.

NEW

575 Seminar in Citizen Participation (3)

Seminar on modes of citizen participation in public decision making, advocacy planning, participant democracy, and community development are considered in terms of contemporary problems. No prerequisite for graduate students; permission of instructor for undergraduates.

NEW

580 Theories and Methodology of Planning I (4)

A survey of the philosophy, methods, and analytical techniques used in planning public actions and policies, with emphasis on the logic and assumption on which these are based. Various planning surveys and methods discussed. Prerequisite, 400.

NEW

581 Theories and Methodology of Planning II (4)

Factors relating to the timing, phasing, and programming of urban development. The bearing of amenity, density, etc., on the actual development process. Prerequisite, 480.

NEW

591-592-593- Doctoral Seminar I, II, III (2-2-2)

Researchable issues and research methodology. Discussion and critique of selected pieces of recent research work. Presentation and critique of research proposed by members of the seminar. Credits given on satisfactory completion of the three-quarter sequence. Prerequisite, master's degree or the equivalent in a planning discipline.

Consideration of the natural environment and basic human adaptations: the emergence of Islam and its cultural and social repercussions; the basic institutions of Middle-Eastern society and patterns of social change since the 19th century.

498 Seminar in Middle East Social Organization (3)

A comparative analysis of village organization in Afghanistan and other Middle Eastern communities. Students will be expected to participate in ethnographic research on the Middle East. Prerequisite, a Middle Eastern social science course or permission.

NEW

284 Social Biology of the North American Indian (3)

The peopling of the aboriginal New World, population at time of discovery, and subsequent changes. Past histories as seen through skeletal remains, and analysis of morphological and genetic variation in living North American Indians. Race mixture. Effects of cultural, dietary, and disease factors in their physical and clinical status. Prerequisite, sophomore standing.

NEW

285 Social Biology of Middle and South American Indians (3)

Synthesis of archaeological, historical, cultural, and biological data in delineating the clusters of extant populations of living Indians. Intensive review of nutritional and clinical studies in Guatemalan and Peruvian Indians. Current genetic data on largely intact Indian populations. Prerequisite 284 or permission.

NEW

487 Human and Comparative Osteology (3)

Introduction to the vertebrate skeleton. The skeleton is described in detail and various methods of determining age and sex are presented. Osteometry and modern statistical methods for handling such data. Prerequisite, instructor's permission.

586 **Topics in Primate and Human Evolution (3, max. 9)**

Enlargement of physical anthropology program made possible by enlargement of faculty.

Individual study under the direction of a faculty member of a selected problem in art education within a school setting. Prerequisites, approved plan of study and permission of instructor.

306 **Survey of Renaissance Art (5)**

Sculpture, painting, and architecture in Europe from 1300-1600 with main emphasis on Italy.

NEW

308 **Survey of Modern Art (5)**

The art of Europe and America from the late eighteenth century to the present, with emphasis on stylistic and thematic changes in painting.

NEW

ARTH

465 **Renaissance Architecture and Architectural Theory (3, max. 9)**

Architecture in Italy (1400-1600) from Brunelleschi to Palladio, with an emphasis on the development of Renaissance architectural theory from Alberti to Palladio and Vignola. Prerequisites, Art History 202 or 306, or Architecture 350 and 351.

ARTH

469 **Problems in Northern European Art (3, max. 12)**

The evolution of North European art during the fifteenth through the seventeenth centuries, the study of which will direct the attention of students to the many points of iconography, style, and attribution that need clarification. During four quarters the major artistic traditions of this area will be covered. Prerequisite, upper-division standing.

581 **Problems in Modern Art (3, max. 9)**

Art historical problems of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Prerequisites, graduate standing and 308 or equivalent, or instructor's permission.

Aesthetic relations among the literary and visual arts in America: problems of common historical foundations, stylistic and iconographic analysis, and relations to cultural context. Offered jointly with English 582. Prerequisites, graduate standing and permission.

454 **Accelerated Classical Chinese (10)**

Introduction to classical Chinese language based mostly on pre-Han texts, with special attention to grammatical analysis. Prerequisite, 313.

NEW

500 **Chinese for Field Work (5)**

Designed to prepare the advanced graduate student for oral communication at a sophisticated academic level with Chinese professors and others with whom the student will be in frequent contact while studying and doing research in Taiwan or other overseas Mandarin-speaking communities. Prerequisite, three years of Chinese.

NEW

570 **Topics in the History of Chinese Science (3)**

After surveying the significant aspects of the history of Chinese science, specific texts will be selected for relevant readings. Prerequisite, sound knowledge of classical Chinese.

NEW

301, 302, 303 **Advanced Hindi (5,5,5)**

Advanced conversation. Rapid reading of Hindi prose, drama, and poetry. Introduction to literary criticism and history of Hindi language and literature. Prerequisite, 203 or equivalent.

NEW

468 **Seminar on Modern Hindi Literature (3)**

Genre and contextual analysis of literary forms of a rapidly developing language.

NEW

600 **Independent Study or Research (*)**

For advanced students doing independent study or research. Prerequisite, permission.

JAPANESE

NEW

114 **First-Year Conversation (5)**

First-year level conversation in Japanese.

Conversational subjects based on everyday social situations. Prerequisite, 113 or equivalent.

NEW

404 **Reading of Newspapers and Journals (5)**

Readings and discussions on contemporary topics selected from newspapers and journals from Japan. Prerequisites, Japanese 313, 333, or their equivalents.

TAMIL

NEW

411, 412, 413 **Advanced Tamil (5,5,5)**

Readings in modern literary Tamil. The modern novel and short story, as seen in the writings of such writers as Jeyakantam, Putumaippittan, Vayyavan, Janakiraman, Sundara Ramaswamy, and Ramamirtham. Laboratory sessions will continue practice in the colloquial dialect. Prerequisite, 403.

NEW

455 **Structure of Dravidian (3)**

Comparative analysis of the phonologies and morphologies of the major Dravidian languages.

NEW

600 **Independent Study or Research (*)**

Independent readings of various historical and literary sources ranging from the Sangam period to the modern novel. Prerequisites, 411, 412, 413, or equivalent.

NEW

411, 412, 413 **Reading in Thai (5,5,5)**

Readings in a variety of modern styles, with oral and written practice. Prerequisite, 403 or equivalent.

TURKIC

NEW

542, 543 **Comparative and Historical**

Grammar of Turkic Languages (3,3)

Classification of the Turkic languages; alphabets used; phonology, morphology, and syntax; lexical composition; structure changing developments. Offered every third year; offered first time Winter, 1970, Spring, 1970. Prerequisites, Turkic 301, 302, 303, 404, or Turkish 101-102, 103.

NEW

546 **Old Turkic (Orchon Turkic) (3)**

Introduction to Runic script, phonology, morphology, and syntax of the oldest form of Turkic; reading and translation of the seventh through eighth century inscriptions, of importance for the history of the Turks during this period. Offered every third year; offered first time Winter, 1970. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

547 **Old Uighur (3)**

Introduction to script systems, phonology, morphology, and syntax. Reading and translation of mainly Buddhist texts in Uighur script (eighth through eleventh century). Offered every third year; offered first time Spring, 1970. Prerequisite, permission, or background in Old Turkic or a modern Turkic language.

NEW

600 **Independent Study or Research (*)**

Independent study or research on different topics of Turkic language and literature. Prerequisite, permission.

ASTRONOMY

NEW

102 **Introduction to Astronomy (5)**

Survey of the solar system, stars, galaxies, and cosmology. Prerequisites, one year of high school physics or Physics 101-102 or 110, 111, 112.

NEW

321, 322, 323 **Basic Astronomy 3,3,3)**

Intended for physical scientists, this course gives a mathematically-oriented treatment of the planets and interplanetary medium, the sun and other stars, star clusters, the galactic system, galaxies, and cosmology. Prerequisites, Physics 123 and calculus.

NEW

433 Stellar and Interstellar Astrophysics (3)
Stellar spectra, luminosity, radii, and temperatures. Stellar structure, energy sources, and compositions. Interstellar gas and dust: its temperature, density, distribution in the galaxy and interaction with stars. Prerequisites, 432 and Physics 322 or 325.

NEW

507 Physical Foundations of Astrophysics I (3)

Survey of thermodynamics from an astronomer's point of view: black body radiation, basic radiative transfer, equation of state, degenerate gases, crystallization at high density, introduction to hydrodynamics and gas dynamics for astronomers: turbulence, convection, shock waves, radiation gas dynamics.

NEW

508 Physical Foundations of Astrophysics II (3)

Introduction to magnetohydrodynamics: basic theorems and application to stellar and interstellar magnetic fields; introduction to plasma physics, waves in a plasma, kinetic theory and transport phenomena in astrophysics. Prerequisite, Physics 513 or equivalent.

435 Introduction to Cloud Processes (3)
Emphasis on the qualitative aspects of cloud formation and processes. Moist adiabatic processes; dew point equation. Condensation nuclei. Thermodynamics and dynamics of convection. Development of precipitation in warm clouds. Ice nuclei; growth of ice particles in clouds. Orographic clouds and precipitation. Artificial modification. Severe storms. Prerequisite, 340 or permission.

587 Analysis of Development Laboratory (1-5, max. 5)

A series of intensive workshops in developmental biology, each extending from seven to ten days. 350 Introduction to Plant Geography (3)

An examination of behavioral science contributions to the understanding of consumer communication and purchasing behaviors; contributions from psychology, sociology, and anthropology; emphasis is on the application of findings to the preparation and placement of the advertising message. Prerequisite, 200 or equivalent.

NEW

583 Regional Communication Systems (5)

Analysis of communications problems of regional economic associations, theory of political community, and examination of empirical research on regional communications. Special emphasis will be given to Western Europe and the North Atlantic area. Prerequisites, 480, 485 or equivalent, or permission. Offered alternate years with 585.

NEW

584 Research Seminar in Regional Communication Systems (3)

Directed research in communications factors in regional integration in a determined region of the world. Offered alternate years with 586. Prerequisite, 583.

COMPARATIVE LITERATURE

NEW

261, 262, 263 Modern African Literature (3, 3, 3)

A survey course in African literature from the colonial period to the present with specific

references to the themes of nostalgia, rebellion, and humanism. Readings, discussions of, and reports on, representative works in prose, poetry, and drama. Among authors studied: Achebe, Mphahlele, Oyono, Paton, Senghor, Soyinka, Tutuola. Prerequisite, sophomore, junior, or senior standing.

NEW

571 Studies in the Lyric (3-5, max. 15)

An examination of central questions in the study of the lyric genre, as approached from an international point of view. Course will change, so consult department each quarter for specific information. Prerequisite, ordinarily, reading knowledge of one foreign language.

Office, powers, and functions of the American presidency. Recruitment and multiple roles of the Chief Executive. Party, congressional, administrative, and judicial relationships.

PSYCHOLOGY

NEW

210 Psychology of Human Sexual Behavior (3)

Survey of the current literature concerning the development of human sexual behavior. Physiological and psychological components of human sexuality and its deviations will be considered.

NEW

250 Mental Health of Minority Groups (3)

A survey of the problems of minority groups, with particular emphasis on the conditions related to the development of mental health. Emphasis will be placed on the situation of the Negro, although Indian, Oriental, and Spanish-American groups will be included. Offered jointly as PSYC (Psychiatry) 250.

NEW

260 Psychological Aspects of Poverty (3)

Psychological effects of poverty and related social phenomena; the effects on psychological development, personality, mental health, and social behavior. Where possible, remedial steps will be discussed.

NEW

417 Ethology and Human Behavior (3)

A seminar for undergraduates with primary emphasis on a critical reading of recent literature which has claimed that ethology is relevant for an understanding of human behavior. Prerequisite, 200 or permission of instructor.

428 Survey of Psychoacoustics (3)

Study of the auditory stimulus, the hearing mechanism, and man's abilities to discriminate simple and complex sounds. Topics included are speech perception, hearing tests, and the effects of noise upon efficiency, speech communication, and the hearing mechanism. Prerequisite, 303 or equivalent.

443 Social Psychology of Prejudice (3)

An examination of social psychological theory and research regarding the development, maintenance, and dissolution of prejudicial attitudes, with particular emphasis on anti-Black sentiment. Topics to be covered include personality traits such as authoritarianism and dogmatism, environmental factors such as conformity and forced compliance, and cultural elements such as the notion of justice. A study of the evolution of the French theatre from the turn of the century to the present. Special emphasis will be given to the French theatrical scene since World War II.

Major currents and literature of Spain's theatre in this century. Special attention to modern reactions against Realism. Benavente, Valle-Inclan, Sastre, Lorca, and others. Prerequisites, Spanish 304, 305, 306.

A survey of Scandinavian history from 1814 to the present with major emphasis on the political, social, cultural, and economic development of the Scandinavian countries. Offered jointly with HSTEU 381.

The study and discussion of representative

The attendant issues, problems, and administrative solutions to leading cases are examined. Prerequisite, upper-division standing.

400 Applied Materials Science for Teachers I (3)
A course designed to give junior high school and high school science teachers and science consultants a broad background in the structure and properties of solids, solid-state reactions, and phase equilibria, and in typical engineering applications of these principles. Laboratory and discussion sections on the educational implications and applications of this material in the classroom. Prerequisite, knowledge of freshman chemistry.

401 Applied Materials Science for Teachers II (3)
Continuation of 400, with more information on engineering applications of materials. Discussion sessions and special curriculum projects in place of laboratories; special seminars and field trips on arrangement. Prerequisite, 400 or equivalent.

402 Educational Projects in Materials Science (1-5)
In-depth study of special topics in materials science with special seminars and lectures, participation in materials science research projects or curriculum development projects involving science or industrial arts classes. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite, 400 or equivalent.

423 Corrosion of Engineering Materials (3)
Applications of physical chemical principles to the reaction of materials with their environments. Prevention and control of corrosion

and oxidation processes. Corrosion problems in materials applications, including chemical process industries, nuclear engineering, and marine environments. Prerequisite. Materials Engineering 250.

551 Special Topics (*)

Topics of current interest and importance in the mineral industries or individual study on a subject of special interest. Prerequisite, graduate standing.

NUCLEAR ENGINEERING

NEW

477 Introduction to Radioactive Tracer Techniques (2)

To introduce the student to the basic concepts of the use of radioactive tracers in measuring the transfer between the compartments of a biological system. The theoretical analysis will be restricted to systems with no more than three compartments. The experiments are designed to permit the student to utilize the theory discussed and to make actual determinations of transfer coefficients. Offered jointly with Radiology 477. Prerequisite, permission.

512 Soil Genesis (4)

Consideration of soil as a natural system. Description of soils and basic processes in soil, including weathering and soil formation. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

517 Soil Plant-Atmospheric Relations (3)

Principles of mass and energy exchange between the earth and the atmosphere with special emphasis upon the state and movement of water in soils, energy balance of the vegetated surface and individual leaves, and methods of evapotranspiration determination. Prerequisites, Mathematics 126, Physics 123, Atmospheric Sciences 329.

NEW

531 Forest Fire Science Seminar (2)

Preservation and discussion of current issues in forest fire prevention and control, and use and discussion of on-going fire research. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

532 Planning, Management and Analysis of Forest Control Systems (3)

Study of plans, service, finance, line, and command functions. Forest fire control and production economics. Techniques of operations research and computer sciences applicable to planning and analyzing forest fire control systems. Prerequisites, Administrative Theory and Organizational Behavior 550, and Quantitative Methods 510.

NEW

537 Forest Fire Thermophysics (3)

Principles of combustion and heat transfer. Basic processes of ignition and flame spread; high intensity fires. Emphasis is on free burning fires in cellulose fuels. Prerequisites, Mathematics 105, Physics 114, 115.

NEW

538 Forest Fire Behavior (3)

Basic combustion and heat transfer processes related to behavior of free-burning fires. Forest fuels. Effect of fuel, weather, and topography on the spread, intensity, and difficulty of control of forest fires. Prediction of fire behavior. Prerequisites, 535, Atmospheric Sciences 301, 329.

NEW

577 Wood and Fiber Science Seminar (1)

Discussion of current topics in the science of wood and its various composites in the form of composition boards, laminates, and paper. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

205 Introductory Pharmacy Laboratory (1)

Introduction to pharmaceutical techniques. For majors only. May be taken concurrently with 204. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

328-329-330 Pharmaceutical Calculations (0-0-1)

The study of the practical calculations used in pharmacy. Prerequisite, third-year standing.

NEW

465 The General Practice of Pharmacy (2, max. 4)

A study of pharmacy in the community and urban setting. Students spend variable periods under the tutelage of a pharmacist in his day-to-day practice and meet for weekly discussions of their experiences. Prerequisites, 332 and Pharmacology 302, or permission.

NEW

445 Radiopharmaceutics (3)

The fundamentals of radioactivity; properties of radiation; instrumentation used in nuclear medicine; problems associated with the formulation, production, and use of radiopharmaceuticals currently used for diagnosis and therapy. Prerequisite, 333 or permission.

NEW

452 Contemporary Problems (1)

An examination of trends in the field of pharmacy as influenced by social and economic factors. The effect of changing patterns of health care on professional practice. Prerequisite, fifth year standing.

NEW

485 Clinical Pharmacy (5)

The pharmacist on the health-care team; lectures and conferences; laboratories in various clinical areas of the hospital. Students associate symptomology observed in patients with textbook descriptions of disease states, gain insight into problems of diagnosis and treatment planning, and relate disease states with complex drug therapy. Prerequisites, permission; Pharmacy 483 is recommended.

NEW

486 Clinical Pharmacy (4-10)

The pharmacist on the health-care team. Lectures, conferences, and laboratories in various clinical areas of the hospital and outpatient clinics. Students relate complex drug therapy to disease states and treatment planning. Consideration of the pharmacist's responsibilities for inpatient and outpatient care. Prerequisites, Pharmacy 485 and permission.

515 Topics in Nursing and Pharmacy (2)

Readings and discussions of assigned topics of current interdisciplinary interest in the fields of nursing and pharmacy. Subject matter changes from year to year. Offered jointly with Nursing 515. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

470 Design of Digital Data Systems (4)

Fundamental gating circuits are developed into large logic gating structures. The use of these structures in the design of central processing units, memories, and peripheral equipment is illustrated. Offered jointly with Electrical Engineering 470. Prerequisite, permission of instructor.

NEW

501 Programming Languages and Systems I (3)

Discussion of computer languages; machine language, assembly language, problem-oriented languages. Manipulation of symbols and strings. Formal definition of computer languages. Prerequisite, 478 or permission. (Offered jointly with Electrical Engineering 501.)

NEW

502 Programming Languages and Systems II (3)

Basic concepts and design of interpreters, assemblers, compilers, and operating systems for digital computers. Prerequisite, 501. (Offered jointly with Electrical Engineering 502.)

NEW

508 Representation and Handling of Data Structures (3)

Linear lists (stacks, queues, deques); sequential and linked allocation. Circular and doubly-linked lists. Trees, binary trees and threaded lists; traversal algorithms—analysis of flowcharts—path length on trees. Garbage collection. Dynamic storage allocation. Transferring algorithms. Data management on external media. Prerequisite, 478 or consent of the instructor.

NEW

541 Computer Measurements and Evaluation Techniques (3)

Viewpoints, problems, and techniques in assessment of computer systems and subsystems. Selection of models, analysis, simulation, and instrumentation, with problem assignments making use of computers available on campus. Prerequisite, 478, Electrical Engineering 478, or permission.

NEW

551 Operating Systems (3)

Description of design of operating requirements and design criteria for batch processing, real time, and time-sharing systems. Practical exercises and illustrations using Computer Science Research Facility. Prerequisite, 502 or permission.

NEW

552 Systems Programming Practicum (3)

Designed to give students experience in implementation of computer software for controlling equipment allocation . . . e.g. operating systems. Students must enroll for two quarters. A systems project will be selected, designed, and implemented using the Computer Science Teaching Laboratory equipment. Prerequisites, 551 and permission.

NEW

574 Artificial Intelligence II (3)

Continuation of studies of artificial intelligence systems, emphasizing theorem proving, symbolic problem solving, pattern recognition, and natural language data processing. Students will be required to do projects. Prerequisite, 573 or permission of instructor.

NEW

520 Seminar (1-2)

Review of current literature in geophysics and graduate student research with faculty participation. Prerequisite, graduate standing.

SCHOOL OF LIBRARIANSHIP

NEW

555 History of Children's Literature (3)
Literature for children from the earliest times through the nineteenth century. Consideration of significant qualities in the cultural context of the time, with attention given to representative authors and titles. Prerequisites, 451 or 550, and 554.

NEW

590 Special Topics in Librarianship (3)
Seminar dealing with various topics in librarianship. To be offered by visitors or resident faculty. Topics will change from quarter to quarter. May not be offered every quarter. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

299 Introduction to Bioengineering (1)
The scope of bioengineering will be presented for purposes of orientation by means of video tapes or motion pictures (about one-half hour) followed by presentation of problems and informal discussion to illustrate the nature and diversity of applications of engineering disciplines to biology and medicine.

NEW

460 Wave Effects in Bio-Materials (3)
Ultrasonic, electromagnetic, and optical wave effects in biological materials. Applications to biomedical uses in diagnosis, therapy, and surgery. Offered jointly with Electrical Engineering 460. Prerequisite, 323 or other course in wave propagation, as approved by instructor.

QUANTITATIVE SCIENCE

NEW

291, 292 Analysis for Biologists (3, 3)
Differentiation; integration including multiple integrals and partial derivatives. Numerical and computing techniques in analysis. Emphasis on biological problems, particularly in ecology. Prerequisites, Mathematics 105 for 291; 291 or Mathematics 124 for 292.

CHG

381 Elements of Statistical Design and Analysis (3) Replaces 485 Introduction to Experimental Design (3)

CHG

396 Operations Research in Resource Utilization I (3)

Introduction to fundamental concepts of operations research and the application of these tools in examining, defining, analyzing, and solving complex problems of resource management and resource product manufacturing. Emphasis is placed on mathematical programming, network analysis, and decision theory. Prerequisites, 281 or 381, 291 or Mathematics 124, or permission.

NEW

487 Analysis of Quantal Data (3)

Analysis of quantal data by parametric and non-parametric methods. Analysis of quantitative data using parallel line assays, slope ratio assays, and inverse prediction. Combination of estimates, experimental design, transformations, and methods of assessing validity. Use of computer programs in standard bioassay problems. Prerequisites, Mathematics 126 and Quantitative Science 383, or permission.

NEW

491 Systems Analysis in Resource Management (4)

Nature of systems; systems goals and objectives; models; transformation of inputs to outputs; control systems; information; survey of

methods of optimization; general systems; comparative systems; fishing systems; design and analysis of actual systems. Prerequisites, Mathematics 124.

CHG

496 Operations Research in Resource Utilization II (3)

Introduction to additional tools of operations research, particularly inventory models, waiting-line models, dynamic programming, Markov chains, and simulation. Application of these techniques to management and control of natural resources or in resource product manufacturing. Prerequisite, 396.

NEW

502 Interdisciplinary Quaternary Investigations (2-6)

Course provides for individual or group work that cuts across departmental boundaries.

UNIVERSITY CONJOINT

NEW

410 Study of Interdisciplinary Evaluation and Management of Handicapped Children (3)

Multidisciplinary study of handicapped children, including identification of children with problems, clinical assessment by a multidisciplinary team, formulation of plans for management, and reassessment in terms of progress made. The primary emphasis in this course will be on the mentally handicapped child. Prerequisite, permission. (Course offered cooperatively by Dentistry, Education, Home Economics, Nursing, Pediatrics, Psychiatry, Psychology, Social Work, and Speech.)

GRADUATE SCHOOL OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

PUBLIC POLICY

NEW

561, 562 Urban Politics and Administration (3, 3)

A two-quarter graduate course in the structures, functions, and processes of government in cities, with special emphasis on the origin, content, and implementation of public policies. Major focus is on the political process at the municipal level: the distribution of influence, the political actors, the decision-making machinery, and the policy outputs. Of special interest to graduate and professional students preparing for careers in urban government. Prerequisites, Public Administration 501, 502 or Political Science 584, 585, or equivalent.

NEW

565 Seminar in Urban Public Policy Analysis (3)

The use of methodology from Public Administration, Political Science, and Economics to examine urban public policies. Emphasis on the relationships between research and public policy. Topic announced in advance. Prerequisites, Economics 416, Political Science 584, Public Policy 560, and permission.

NEW

583, 584, 585 Seminar in Science and Public Policy (3,3,3)

Issues and problems relating to the interaction of science and scientists with the public policy-making process and public policy makers. Nature and values of science versus the nature and values of political processes, and the continuing tensions between the two. The evolving interaction between scientific and technical knowledge and political power: scientific versus ethical judgments. Role of science in the establishment of national goals. Plans and proposals for increasing governmental competence to deal with public policy issues involving science and technology. Prerequisite, permission.

505 Social Welfare Organization (2)

This seminar seeks to deepen the students understanding of the policies and organizations that are the context of social work practice. Prerequisite, 504.

NEW

521 Teaching and Administration of Technic Courses in Operative Dentistry (4)

Study of course content, organization and presentation, laboratory procedures, teaching aids, and textbook selection. Consideration is given to professional responsibility for promotion and maintenance of high standards of dental health care. (Alternates with 522.)

NEW

522 Teaching and Administration of Clinic Courses in Operative Dentistry (4)

Selection of standards of performance and evaluation of teaching methods to promote student achievement. Discussion of public relations, legal, ethical, and executive responsibilities involved in administering an undergraduate dental operator. (Alternates with 521.)

523 Teaching Observation (1, max. 6) Replaces 590- Teaching Training (1-3-)

CHG

524 Teaching Practice (4, max. 12) Replaces -591- Teaching Training (-1-3-)

550 Clinical Operations (1-4, max. 20)

Clinical procedures in all phases of operative dentistry; varied clinical experience under supervision.

572 Dental Amalgam Restorations (3) Replaces 567 Operative Dentistry Literature Review (2)

ORAL BIOLOGY

NEW

200 Dental Caries (1)

An integrated treatment of the anatomical, microscopic, ultrastructural, biochemical, and microbiological aspects of dental caries, together with discussions concerning the current

theories of etiology and the contributing factors of this disease. Prerequisite, 431 or equivalent.

NEW

500 Dental Caries (2-3)

A series of lectures outlining the morphological, biochemical, and microbiological aspects of dental caries with the additional requirement of participation in a seminar for purposes of review of the current literature and discussion of research in this field. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

560 Biomineralization (2)

A series of lectures outlining the current state of knowledge concerning the formation and metabolism of mineralized tissues of the human body, with particular emphasis on the hard tissues of the tooth and alveolus. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

565 Comparative Odontology (2)

A broad view of the dentition in terms of its evolution and its morphologic, functional, and ecological relationships. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

570 Oral Facial Development (2-3)

The embryological development of the tissues and organs of the human face and oral regions. Contribution of embryonic primordia to adult structures will be studied. Mechanisms resulting in abnormal development will receive special emphasis. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

581 Biological Structure and Functions of Exocrine Glands (1-3)

The development and structure of the salivary glands will be traced in a number of mammalian species. Morphologic details will be related to function. The effect of environment on morphology will also be shown. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

582 Physiology of Exocrine Glands (3)

The autonomic innervation of salivary glands. The action of drugs, changes in blood flow and metabolism during activity as well as the processes involved in the transport of water and electrolytes through the glands will be explored in depth. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

583 Biochemistry of Exocrine Glands (2)

Survey of the protein products synthesized and secreted by exocrine pancreas and salivary glands. Structure-function relationships of the digestive enzymes and other proteins secreted by these glands will be examined. The biochemical events of biosynthesis, transport, and secretion will be explored and the relationship of pancreatic and salivary heteroenzymes will be discussed. Prerequisite, permission.

ORTHODONTICS

NEW

301-302 Orthodontics (0-1)

This course is designed to provide a clinical background in orthodontics diagnosis and treatment planning. The student will be required to participate in graduate-level seminars from 7:30 to 8:30 a.m. and clinical examination and treatment planning from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. Prerequisites, 300 for 301; 301 for 302.

PERIODONTICS

NEW

560 Morphology of the Periodontium (1)

Study of the structure of the periodontium. This course is designed to correlate closely with 599. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

561, 562, 563 Periodontal Case Management (1, 1, 1)

A didactic presentation of clinical periodontics to provide a comprehensive view of the field and a grasp of modern therapeutics.

PROSTHODONTICS

NEW

578 Prosthodontic Technique Practice Teaching (1)

Designed to provide practical experience, under supervision, in the teaching of technical procedures in undergraduate dental laboratory courses. The primary course involved will be Prosthodontics 131. The graduate student will assume an active role as instructor, being supervised by full-time staff.

NEW

580 Prosthodontic Dental Materials (2)

A study of common materials utilized in the fabrication of dental appliances. Emphasis is placed on resin systems and various precious and base metal alloys.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

ANESTHESIOLOGY

NEW

481 Advanced Anesthesiology Clerkship (6)

This course is designed to meet the specific needs and goals of the individual student who desires greater exposure to anesthesiology. Individual programs are arranged with the student's interest in mind, including the areas of respiratory care, regional anesthesia, obstetrical anesthesia, and dolorology. Full time for four weeks. Prerequisite, 480.

BIOMEDICAL HISTORY

NEW

421 The Theory of Evolution in Historical Perspective (3)

A detailed examination of the development of the theories of organic evolution from antiquity to the present, emphasizing the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. The works of Buffon, Cuvier, Lamarck, Darwin, and Mendel will be considered, in addition to those of lesser figures.

NEW

422 Revolutions in the Biomedical Sciences (3)

Major shifts in biological concepts, interpreted as paradigm revolutions. Under consideration will be the theory of the circulation of the blood, the theories of generation in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, the germ theory of disease, and the theory of organic evolution, among others.

NEW

423 History of Biological Classification (3)

A detailed examination of biological classification in historical perspective. Emphasis will be given to the philosophical foundations of the discipline in antiquity and to the subsequent development of biological classification since the Renaissance. Attention will be paid to such problems as the conflict over the Natural System, the impact of evolutionary concepts on classification, and the historical and philosophical background of contemporary disputes in taxonomy.

NEW

600 Independent Study or Research (*)

Independent study or research in biomedical history. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

700 Thesis (*)

Prerequisite, permission.

CONJOINT

NEW

473 Musculoskeletal Pathology (2)

Advanced musculoskeletal pathology with electron microscopic, light microscopic, x-ray, and clinical correlation. Subjects will include normal histology and electron microscopy of the MS system, biochemistry and physiology of normal and abnormal specialized connective tissues, embryology of the MS system, repair, infections, and circulatory disturbances. Offered alternately with Conjoint 474 in even- and odd-numbered years. The courses need not be taken in sequence. Offered by the Departments of Orthopedics and Pathology. Prerequisites, Human Biology 460, Orthopedics 481, or permission.

NEW

474 Advanced Musculoskeletal Pathology (2)

Advanced musculoskeletal pathology with electron microscopic, light microscopic, x-ray, and clinical correlation. Subjects will include tumors of the musculoskeletal system, benign and malignant, and hematomas. This course is offered alternately with Conjoint 473 in even- and odd-numbered years. The courses need not be taken in sequence. Offered by the Departments of Orthopedics and Pathology. Prerequisites, Human Biology 460, Orthopedics 481, or permission.

CHG

505 Histochemical and Cytochemical Methods (3) Replace Pathology 505, 506

Introduction to principles and techniques of tissue fixation, sectioning, and staining; theory and application of histochemical methods for carbohydrates, lipids, nucleic acids, minerals, and proteins, including enzyme histochemistry and fluorescent antibody methods. Prerequisites, Human Biology 410 and permission.

MEDICAL PRACTICE

NEW

401 Externship in Medical Practice (1)

To provide opportunity for first- and second-year medical students to gain personal experience with and insight into the medical practice situations. During this introductory period the student would be stationed with carefully selected clinical faculty members in their offices in accordance with the student's preference of discipline, i.e., medicine, pediatrics, general practice, etc.

MEDICINE

NEW

435 Basic Hematology (2)

A physiological approach to the diagnosis of disorders of the red cell and coagulation systems. Emphasis is placed on a logical, systemized approach to diagnosis using case development problems. Prerequisite, Human Biology 451, which may be taken concurrently.

MICROBIOLOGY

NEW

236 Microbiology Laboratory for Students of Dentistry (2)

A laboratory and demonstration course in medical microbiology designed to supplement the laboratory exercise given with 235 and intended for second-year dental students with a special interest in microbiology. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

447 Fundamentals of Immunology (4)

Broad coverage in immunology with stress on fundamentals. For students in specialized areas of medicine and dentistry and various undergraduates and graduates with interests in areas requiring substantial knowledge in immunology. Occurrence and properties of antigens and haptens; synthesis, nature, fate, and activities of antibodies; antigen-antibody interaction; immunologic injury; tissue transplantation; blood groups and transfusion;

tumor immunology; Rh diseases; allergic and autoimmune diseases; and immunity to parasites. Prerequisites, 10 credits of zoology or biology, 5 credits of organic chemistry, and upper-division standing.

ORTHOPEDICS

NEW

477 Musculoskeletal Trauma (6)

Open to medical students who have completed the basic curriculum. Teaching will be at Harborview Medical Center, where a large amount and considerable variety of trauma to the musculoskeletal system is treated. First-hand experience in the Emergency Room and Trauma Center, in the wards, the Operating Room, and with outpatients will be available. Emphasis will be placed on the examination of the patient and the eliciting of clinical signs. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460. Four weeks, full time.

NEW

478 Pediatric Orthopedics and Musculoskeletal Trauma Combined (*)

Open to medical students who have completed the basic curriculum. Time will be divided equally between Harborview Medical Center and Children's Orthopedic Hospital and Medical Center. Four weeks, full time. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460.

NEW

481 Correlative Pathology of the Musculoskeletal System (½)

A review of the pathology of the musculoskeletal system as it involves common clinical problems. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460 or Surgery 465. Required course with Orthopedics 475, 476, 477, 478, 480, or 481. No additional credit given with clerkships. One one-and-one-half-hour conference weekly for four weeks.

NEW

482 Correlative Anatomy of the Musculoskeletal System (½)

Review of gross anatomy relating to the clinical problems affecting the musculoskeletal system; an anatomic, clinical, and radiologic correlation of disease processes. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460 or Surgery 465. Required course with Orthopedics 475, 477, 478, 480, or 481. No additional credit given with clerkships. Two one-and-one-half-hour conferences weekly.

NEW

483 Surgical Management of Joint Disease (1)

An introduction to the principles and techniques of reconstructive surgery utilized in acute and chronic joint disease. Special emphasis will be placed on the diagnosis and evaluation of functional deficits amenable to surgical reconstruction. Prerequisite, 478. One three-hour conference weekly for four weeks.

OTOLARYNGOLOGY

NEW

484 Otolaryngology Clerkship (4½)

The student will participate in evaluation and care of outpatients and inpatients at Harborview Hospital, and he will assist in surgery. In addition, he will attend department conferences at both Harborview and University Hospitals in conjunction with department training. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

485 Otolaryngology Externship (6)

To give medical students additional training in pediatric otolaryngology at Children's Orthopedic Hospital and Medical Center. Students will assist in patient work-ups, surgery, post-operative care and study general otolaryngologic problems with special emphasis in childhood disease entities. One student for four weeks. Prerequisite, Surgery 465 or Human Biology 460.

NEW

496 Otolaryngology Seminar (1)

An advanced course on diseases of the ear, nose, and throat intended for those physicians

interested in the field in more depth than provided in the core. Open to sophomore, junior, and senior medical students. Prerequisite, Human Biology 431.

NEW

497 Otolaryngology Rounds (1)

Weekly rounds are held alternately at the University Hospital and the U.S. Public Health Service Hospital, during which the most interesting cases seen at the University and affiliated hospitals are seen and discussed. Prerequisite, Human Biology 431 or equivalent.

PATHOLOGY

NEW

471 Neuroanatomic Pathology (2½)

The particular diseases occurring in specific parts of the nervous system are considered in terms of the segmental (motor, sensory, and association plates), intersegmental (reticular formation) and suprasegmental (cerebellum, colliculi, and forebrain) components. Clinico-pathologic correlations are emphasized. Prerequisite, Human Biology 432.

NEW

472 Neuropathologic Reactions (2½)

The reactions of the nervous system, only more or less similar to those of other organs of the body as summarized in the course in general pathology, are considered in terms of congenital malformations, inflammations, vascular, traumatic, metabolic-toxic-degenerative, and neoplastic diseases peculiar to the nervous system as a whole. Clinico-pathologic correlations are emphasized. Prerequisite, Human Biology 432.

PEDIATRICS

NEW

410 Community Night Clinics (2)

Students will attend at least two night clinics per week for youth and young adults with medical and social problems. Treatment and rehabilitation will be emphasized. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460.

NEW

440 Pediatric Infectious Diseases (1)

Syllabus and lecture series on tape which will be illustrated by slides, and/or seminars combined with clinic and laboratory experience. Emphasis will be placed on diagnosis and management of infectious diseases in children. Prerequisites, Human Biology 420, 421 and Microbiology 446.

NEW

451 Pediatric Electrocardiography (1)

Theory and practice of electrocardiography will be reviewed in seminars. Electrocardiograms from children will be read by the student and reviewed with the appropriate faculty member. Prerequisite, Human Biology 440.

NEW

452 Fetal and Neonatal Physiology (1)

Lecture reviews the normal and abnormal physiology of the developing mammalian fetus and postnatal physiology including adaptation to extrauterine life. There will be a series of ten one-hour lectures. Topics to be included are: fetal lung development and neonatal function, cardiopulmonary adaptation at birth, fetal endocrinology including relationships between fetal and maternal hormones, uterine and placental physiology, immunologic development and developmental assessment of the nervous system. Prerequisites, Human Biology 422 and 440.

CHG

465 Pediatric General Clerkship (*, max. 16)

General inpatient and outpatient pediatric clerkship, including experience with newborn babies. Besides his clinical experience, the student will have a faculty preceptor and attend seminars on major pediatric subjects. The 12-week clerkship will be broader and allow for more individual selection of rotations. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460.

CHG

469 Neonatal Pediatrics Clerkship (*) Replaces Pediatrics 472 Pediatric Pulmonary Physiology and Neonatal Pediatrics (*)

Participation in the activities in the Newborn and Premature Divisions: ward rounds, seminars, conferences, and familiarization with certain laboratory techniques; particularly those relating to acid-base balance. Prerequisite, 465.

CHG

472 Clinical Experience in Child Growth and Development (*) Replaces 481 Research and Clinical Experience in Child Growth and Development (*)

Experience at the Clinical Training Unit in the common problems met in clinical practice among children from infancy. Emphasis is on normal development and behavior. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460.

NEW

477 Pediatric Clerkship—Fircrest School for the Mentally Handicapped (*)

Total care involvement with mentally-handicapped patients; incorporating general pediatric knowledge of mental retardation and neurology.

CHG

479 Replaces 485

NEW

480 Pediatric Clinics (*)

Elective part- or full-time experience in pediatrics and subspecialty clinics for 12 weeks. From one to ten ½-day sessions may be elected each week in the following areas: general pediatrics, endocrinology, neurology, immunology, arthritis, cardiology, congenital defects and retardation, well-child, teratology, adolescent medicine, allergy, cystic fibrosis, hematology, and prematurity. For further information apply to departmental office. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460. Limited enrollment.

CHG

482 Replaces 488

NEW

485 Pediatric Hematology and Oncology (*)

Laboratory and conference participation with the hematology and oncology unit at Children's Orthopedic Hospital and Medical Center. Prerequisite, 465.

CHG

488 Replaces 490

NEW

490 Advanced General Pediatrics—Madigan Hospital (*)

Outpatient, ward and/or newborn experience, especially with the more common types of pediatric problems. Advanced responsibility and instruction. Prerequisite, 465.

CHG

491 Advanced Pediatric Elective Clerkship (*) Replaces Pediatrics 475 Senior Pediatric Elective Clerkship, Including Outpatient Experience

PHARMACOLOGY

NEW

442 General Pharmacology (3)

A study of drugs acting on the autonomic nervous and cardiovascular systems. Emphasis will be placed on physiological and biochemical mechanisms; consideration of their therapeutic and adverse effects will be discussed. Prerequisites, 441 or Human Biology 440 or permission.

NEW

443 General Pharmacology (2)

Lectures and discussions on the pharmacology of the kidney, gastrointestinal tract, endocrine system, and chemotherapy of parasitic, microbial, and neoplastic disease. Prerequisite, 441 or Human Biology 441 or permission.

NEW

444 General Pharmacology (3)

Advanced elective neuropsychopharmacology

as a basis for therapeutic applications of drugs for use in neurology, psychiatry, and anesthesiology. Neuropharmacological and psychopharmacological correlates will be presented with clinical demonstration material, where applicable and available, in an attempt to understand drug choice, efficacy, mechanism of therapeutic action, drug interactions, safety, and limitations of therapeutic effectiveness. Prerequisite, 441 or Human Biology 432 or permission.

PHYSICAL MEDICINE AND REHABILITATION

NEW

340 Spinal Orthotics (3)

Instruction in, and experience with, the use of orthotic components and materials, including the layout, measurement, and fitting of orthoses for management of spinal pathology. Each student plans, fabricates, and fits orthoses for lumbar, dorsolumbar, thoracic, and cervical regions. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

341-342 Upper Extremity Prosthetics I, II (6-5)

Instruction in, and experience with, the use of prosthetic components and materials, including preprosthetic care, prosthetic components, principles of fabrication and harnessing, and techniques of check-out and prosthetic training for all amputation types. Required for prosthetic-orthotic major; others by permission.

NEW

343 Upper Extremity Orthotics (9)

Instruction in, and experience with, the use of orthotic components and materials. Students will evaluate and fabricate therapeutic and functional orthoses; including externally powered devices. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

420 Lower Extremity Prosthetics I (6)

Instruction in the fabrication, fitting, and alignment of the patellar-tendon-bearing prosthesis. Emphasis is placed on the biomechanics of below-knee fit and alignment, dynamic alignment, and the use of the below-knee adjustable leg and duplication devices, as well as methods of suspension. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

421 Lower Extremity Prosthetics II (11)

Instruction in stump casting, cast modification, socket fabrication, static and dynamic alignment, alignment duplication, and suspension systems. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

422 Lower Extremity Prosthetics III (6)

Instruction in, and experience with, the use of prosthetic components and materials, including casting techniques and alignment procedures used for hip disarticulation patients and the Symes prostheses. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

423 Lower Extremity Orthotics (11)

Instruction in, and experience with, the use of orthotic components and material, including the measurement and fitting of lower extremity orthoses and shoe modifications to patients. Each student will evaluate patients and plan, fabricate, fit, and check out several orthoses. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

424 Special Problems in Orthotics (2)

Instruction in alignment of mobile arm supports and control of devices by photoelectric cells, artificial muscles, pistons, and motors. The design of special adaptive devices as aids to daily living for the physically handicapped. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

425 Child Amputee Prosthetics (3)

Instruction in, and experience with, the use of special prosthetic components and materials, including the measurement and fitting of the patient who has congenital anomalies. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

426 Special Problems in Prosthetics (2)

Instruction in fitting and alignment techniques in amputees with flexion contractures, use of hydraulics and special components, wheel chairs and ambulation aids. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

NEW

427-428 Applied Prosthetics-Orthotics (4-7)

Further clinical experience in patient evaluation and in planning, fabricating, and fitting of prosthetic-orthotic devices; attendance at prosthetic-orthotic clinics at the University Hospital and affiliated Seattle hospitals; experience in immediate postoperative prosthetics. Required for prosthetic-orthotic majors; others by permission.

CHG

451, 452 Replace 451

NEW

453 First-Year Clinical Elective in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (3)

This course will emphasize comprehensive evaluation of the patient, his disability, and the interaction of the patient and his disability with his environment. Experience in the use of physical therapy for various disabilities, discussion of the psychological aspects of disability, and the evaluation of the patient for ability to function will be included. Prerequisite, medical student.

NEW

454 Second-Year Clinical Elective in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (18)

Special emphasis on the techniques of eliciting historical and physical evidence of ability of the patient to function in his environment. Topics will include transfer abilities, normal and abnormal gait, reambulation, communication disorders, modalities in physical medicine, psychological aspects of disability, learning aspects in chronic disease, vocational evaluation, principles of physical and occupational therapy, educational problems of the disabled, neuromuscular electrodiagnosis, braces and prosthetics. Patients with stroke, amputation, spinal cord injury, arthritis, and multiple disabilities appropriate with his level will be assumed by the student. Ten weeks full time. Completion of neurological and musculoskeletal systems required. Not open to students who have completed first-year clinical elective in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation.

NEW

456 Clinical Biomechanics and Kinesiology (3)

The physical and mechanical properties of the musculoskeletal system will be discussed. Mechanical principles used in the functional replacement utilizing ambulation aids, braces, and prostheses will be reviewed. Emphasized will be the basic understanding of the biomechanical principles involved, as well as discussion of the clinical application. Prerequisite, third-year medical student.

CHG

463 Replaces 463-464

NEW

486 Basic Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (4)

A combined outpatient, inpatient, and consultation experience, in which the human organism is studied as a social being. The concept of disease is broadened to include the external environment. The student will learn the functional consequences in the environment of disease or impairment, the need for modifying the environment to support maximal function, and the impact of the illness or disability on the people around the patient in his environ-

ment. The concern is with the relationship of disability to work, social functioning, and leisure time. Prerequisites, Human Biology 460. Not open to students who have had 454. NEW

487 Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Clerkship: Medical (9)

A clerkship experience for medical students in the specific rehabilitation approaches for the various "nonsurgical" diseases. Designed primarily for those interested in the medical, i.e., nonsurgical, specialties and tailored to the individual student's requirements. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460.

NEW

488 Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Clerkship: Surgical (9)

A clerkship experience for medical students in the specific rehabilitation approaches for the various surgical problems. Designed primarily for those interested in the surgical specialties and tailored to the individual student's requirements. Prerequisite, Human Biology 460.

NEW

522 Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (2)

A review of traditional neurophysiological concepts and an exposition of recent advances in neurophysiological research related to the practice of physical medicine. The mechanisms underlying facilitation techniques and other techniques used in neuromuscular re-education will be elucidated, and various techniques will be compared and evaluated. Prerequisites, Resident M.D. status and permission.

NEW

532 Clinical Affiliation for Rehabilitation Counselors (5-6)

Under the general preceptorship of the rehabilitation counseling professional staff, the student counsels patients who have severe physical and/or emotional problems, arranges for vocational testing and placement on job stations, and works with community resources in planning for vocational placement after followup. Prerequisite, permission.

PHYSIOLOGY AND BIOPHYSICS

NEW

420 Quantitative Methods in Physiology and Biophysics (3)

Selected areas in physiology where applications of physics and mathematics are useful and necessary to analyze biological function will be presented. Prerequisite, differential equations or permission.

PSYCHIATRY

NEW

449 Principles of Research in Psychopathology (2)

Review of current literature on selective aspects of personality deviation. Theoretically relevant research on the functional psychoses will be stressed. Open to medical students and to advanced undergraduate students with an equivalent of an introductory or abnormal psychology course. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

457 Theory of Learning and Behavior Modification (2)

This course will present the theory and technique of behavior modification as they are applied to behavioral adjustment problems of adults and children. Open to second-, third-, or fourth-year medical students. Prerequisite, Human Biology 433.

NEW

461 Workshop on Suicide and Crisis Intervention (1)

After a presentation of current theories on crisis, suicide, and crisis intervention, students will have an opportunity to learn and to practice various techniques of intervention at the emergency room of Harborview Hospital. Open to second-, third-, or fourth-year medical students or graduate students. Prerequisite, Human Biology 433.

NEW

470 Chemical Aspects of Behavior (2)

Behavior from the point of view of biochemistry and physiology, e.g., some genetic aspects of behavior, aberrant biochemistry and disease, brain biochemistry, learning and biochemistry, brain substances and drugs, and behavior. Open to third- and fourth-year medical students. Prerequisite, permission.

RADIOLOGY

NEW

460 Basic Radiology Clerkship (1)

A basic clerkship in both diagnostic and therapeutic radiology designed to familiarize with clinical radiology and to expand and to demonstrate application of knowledge acquired during Autumn and Winter Quarter basic courses. Prerequisite, first-year Autumn and Winter Quarters of basic curriculum.

NEW

477 Introduction to Radioactive Tracer Techniques (2)

To introduce the student to the basic concepts of the use of radioactive tracers in measuring the transfer between the compartments of a biological system. The theoretical analysis will be restricted to systems with no more than three compartments. The experiments are designed to permit the student to utilize the theory discussed and to make actual determinations of transfer coefficients. Offered jointly with Nuclear Engineering 447. Prerequisite, permission.

NEW

496 Nuclear Medicine Clerkship (3 or 6 or 9)

The student will participate daily in the Radioisotope Clinical Laboratory where diagnostic studies of various types are performed. He will have some responsibility for examining patients, will assist in the procedures, and will

also be expected to assist in examination and consultation of referred patients, attend daily clinical report rounds, and participate in the clinical ward rounds of the division. Prerequisite, Surgery 465 or Human Biology 460.

NEW

497 General Radiology Clerkship (6)

Four-week clerkship offering combined experience in diagnostic radiology, radiotherapy, and nuclear medicine. Prerequisite, completion of third year of medicine.

CHG

SURGERY

NEW

481 Peripheral Vascular Disease (4½)

This course will offer an intensive, in-depth look at peripheral arterial and venous problems. This will include (a) methods of clinical evaluation; (b) new diagnostic procedures; and (c) the available methods of treatment. The emphasis will be on active student participation in patient workup, performance of diagnostic studies, and presentation of case material to the staff. Two seminars will be held weekly with the staff to discuss the pathophysiology of vascular disease. Texts will be provided on a loan basis to the students. These will cover the entire field and should serve as useful source material for the student. Prerequisite, hospital clerkship.

NEW

483 Pediatric Surgery (9)

Students participating in the elective clerkship

of pediatric surgery will be based primarily at the Children's Orthopedic Hospital and Medical Center. Instruction will stress surgical conditions peculiar to the pediatric age group. There will obviously be a preponderance of various congenital and neoplastic conditions which are amenable to surgical treatment. It is desirable, therefore, that students who plan to take this elective prepare themselves by acquiring a reasonable background of knowledge in human embryology and genetics. Prerequisite, surgery clerkship.

NEW

484 Trauma and Emergency Care (4½)

Students who have completed the basic clinical clerkship will be assigned full time (five eight-hour periods per week) to either the Harborview Hospital or the University Hospital Emergency Department. Patients with acute illnesses or trauma will be evaluated and treated in the initial evaluation clinic and the emergency room. Weekly seminars with the surgical faculty will cover the subjects of resuscitation, shock, trauma, and major and minor surgical emergencies.
