# GENERAL INFORMATION

It is the University's expectation that a student will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the *General Catalog*. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and the student is persuaded that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, he or she may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which he or she is enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer the student to the proper office for a decision.

## GUARANTEED REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

University of Washington students who remain in good scholastic standing are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (Summer Quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate, etc. Once a student earns a baccalaureate degree, he or she must apply for readmission as a postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action, (2) students with a financial hold, or (3) students not meeting their departmental continuation policies.

If an undergraduate does not enroll for one or more quarters, or if a graduate student goes on-leave, he or she must file an application for readmission, including payment of \$25 application fee, with the Registrar's Office. Information on admission closing dates is available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall, or by calling 543-5920.

## FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT

To be considered a full-time student, an undergraduate must register for 12 credits and a graduate student must register for 9 credits. The full-time registration requirement varies for different agencies. Information on full-time requirements of the Veterans Administration, Immigration and Naturalization Service, and Social Security Administration may be obtained at 460 Schmitz. Consult the Financial Aid Office for its requirement on satisfactory student progress.

## NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS

Nonmatriculated students register March 26 and enroll only on a space-available basis. Because nonmatriculated students register after all other students, enrollment may be closed in the following areas: mathematics, English composition, beginning foreign languages (particularly French and Spanish), business, and art. Nonmatriculated students may participate in preregistration for the Summer Quarter.

## TUITION-EXEMPT FACULTY/STAFF

With the approval of their department heads, regularly admitted full-time UW faculty and staff members who have been employed six months or more may take up to 6 credits per quarter under the tuition exemption program. All registrations must be on a space-available basis after other students have registered. Faculty/staff who register before the last day will not be eligible to use a tuition exemption that quarter. Registration appointments are not required. New faculty/staff members who enroll must be officially admitted by the Office of Admissions. Faculty/staff members who are former students returning either in the same classification or as nonmatriculated students should apply at the Registration Office, Window 8, second floor, Schmitz Hall.

Employees should present their approved tuition exemption cards at Sections, Hutchinson Hall, according to the schedule listed below. A \$5 registration fee will be collected at the time of registration. The alphabetical priority changes each quarter. Regularly admitted faculty and staff members who are unable to meet this schedule may register late by paying \$25 if registering by the tenth day of the quarter; \$75 if registering after the tenth day of the quarter.

Graduate students enrolling under the tuition exemption program may be required to report the tuition exemption as income for federal tax purposes.

Tuition-exempt faculty/staff are not entitled to other student services such as those available at the Hall Health Center and the

Intramural Activities Building. Therefore, UW student cards will not be issued to faculty and staff. Faculty/staff identification cards may be used for library services.

## "ACCESS" PROGRAM FOR OLDER ADULTS

The University of Washington waives tuition for Washington residents sixty years or older who wish to attend classes as auditing students, on a space-available basis. The fee is \$5, whether one or two courses are attended. As auditors, they do not receive credit and are not expected to do laboratory work or to take examinations. Students who attend the University under the Access program are limited to two courses per quarter. Registration may be made in person on Wednesday, March 26, between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the Sections branch office, Hutchinson Hall. Interested students should proceed to the area marked *Access*. For additional information on mail-in registration or about the program in general, telephone Conference Management, 543-2300, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

## AUDITORS

Auditors, except Access program students, pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course. Although credits for audited courses will not be listed on the schedule of classes, they will be included in the billing on the fee statement. Such credits count in the calculation of fees.

Attendance in courses as an auditor is by consent of the instructor involved and is conditioned by the extent to which space is available. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. An auditor may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work, and his or her registration may be canceled at the discretion of the instructor.

No entry is made on the permanent record for courses audited. To receive credit for an audited course, the student must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors follow registration instructions below.

## DISABLED STUDENTS

Various support services, including priority registration, are available to students with disabilities. Contact the Coordinator for Disabled Student Services, 482 Schmitz, 543-8924, for information on equipment, technical aids, and accommodations to meet individual needs. *Access: University of Washington*, a guidebook to buildings on the campus, and an accompanying map may be obtained from the office.

Hutchinson Hall registration or add/drop area is reached by a full flight of stairs, so wheelchair users and other students with mobility limitations should go to the Sections Office at 264 Schmitz. Students using this location need no Change of Registration Appointment Card (although those registering for the first time do need a registration appointment).

Students with disabilities who register for a science laboratory class should telephone the Coordinator, 543-8924, and the academic adviser of that department immediately to evaluate whether some accommodation of the facilities will be necessary.

## ATHLETIC EVENTS

Students may purchase a Husky Season Pass at the Husky Ticket Office, 101 Graves, or at the HUB Ticket Office, for admission to the following athletic events: gymnastics, men's and women's basketball, baseball, track and field, and swimming. For additional information, telephone 543-2200.



# REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

## ACADEMIC ADVISER

See an academic adviser to discuss your educational objectives and to learn the procedures involved in registering at the University. Have an idea of the courses you would like to take before seeing an adviser by reviewing the *General Catalog* and the quarterly *Time Schedule*.

## PREREGISTRATION (Continuing Students)

### 1. Eligibility

Preregistration is reserved for all continuing students *except* tuition-exempt faculty/staff, older adults auditing under the Access program, and nonmatriculated students. These last three groups may register only during the last day of in-person registration (see Spring Quarter calendar).

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University.

### 2. Submitting the Preregistration Form

Mark-sense registration forms are available at advisory offices and at Registration Office, Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall. Please note that some courses listed in the *Time Schedule* have restricted enrollment and will require entry cards. Also, undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter. This is done to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

Students preregistering may turn in forms at:

### 3. If You Miss Preregistration

Obtain an in-person registration appointment and register by March 25 at Window 8, Schmitz Hall. After March 25 you will be required to register late and to pay a \$25 late registration fee at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, if registering by the tenth day of the quarter; \$75 after the tenth day of the quarter.

### 4. Schedule of Classes

All students who preregister will be scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), juniors, and sophomores.

Schedules will be mailed March 11.

### 5. Registered Students

Students who preregister but are not scheduled into any courses are not considered registered students, and are not eligible for preregistration the following quarter. Students in this category must submit a Former Student Application for the next quarter they wish to attend the University.

## IN-PERSON REGISTRATION (New and Returning Students)

### 1. Eligibility

In-person registration is primarily for newly admitted and returning former students. Continuing matriculated students who miss preregistration, tuition-exempt faculty/staff, older students in the Access program, and nonmatriculated students also register during in-person registration. All students, except Access students, must be admitted to the University and issued a registration appointment before attempting to register.

### 2. How to Register

On or before your registration appointment, obtain a *Time Schedule* and a Registration Instructions worksheet from your advisory office or from the Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall. (These may also be obtained in the Hutchinson Hall registration area while registration is in progress.) Obtain permission and/or course entry cards (if required) as indicated in the *Time Schedule* before attempting to register. Once your registration is completed by the Sections staff, you are obligated for tuition and fee payment unless you officially withdraw by the fifth day of the term. Undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

### 3. Submitting the Registration Form

- New and returning former students register by appointment

only on March 20, 21, 24, 25 at the sections branch office, Hutchinson Hall.

b) If you are a continuing matriculated student who did not preregister, you must obtain an in-person registration appointment and register by March 25. Continuing students who request in-person registration appointments and register after March 25 will be required to register late during the first ten days of school and pay a \$25 late registration fee; after the first ten days of the quarter, a \$75 late registration fee is assessed.

c) If you are registering March 20, 21, 24, 25 go to the Sections branch office, Hutchinson Hall, on the date and time indicated on your registration appointment. Students with a mobility disability must register in 264 Schmitz because there are stairs leading to the Hutchinson Hall gymnasium. Engineering students will register in Hutchinson Hall gymnasium.

d) Nonmatriculated students may register only on March 26. Appointments are available at Window 8, second floor, Schmitz Hall.

e) Tuition-exempt faculty/staff members and students in the Access program register only on March 26.

## 4. Schedule of Classes

a) If you register February 11-14, 18-21, your schedule of classes will be mailed to the address you indicate on the registration form. All students registering during this period are scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, postbaccalaureate (fifth year) students, juniors, and sophomores. Schedules will be mailed March 11.

b) If you register March 20, 21, 24, 25 your courses will be scheduled while you wait and you will be given a copy of your completed program when you have finished registering.

## ENTRY CARDS

Certain courses and sections require entry cards for registration. Students who request these courses (and/or sections) on their registration request forms will not be registered in the courses unless the requests are accompanied by entry cards. An entry card alone is not sufficient. The course and schedule line number (SLN on entry card) must also be requested on the mark-sense registration form. Obtain course entry cards for courses designated with the symbol >>> in the margin of the *Time Schedule*. Information on where to obtain entry cards is found in the body of the *Time Schedule*, either as a comment before the course listing or just after the title of the course.

## LATE REGISTRATION

Students who register after the official registration period will be charged a \$25 late registration fee, payable at the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz, if registering by the tenth day of the quarter; \$75 after the tenth day of the quarter.

## REGISTRATION CHANGES

### 1. Change Appointments and Late Fee

a) Changes to a student's program should be completed during the following change periods: March 20, 21, 24-26, and March 31-April 4.

Appointments are not required to (1) drop a course, (2) change to or from S/NS or C/NC, (3) change variable credits, (4) add classes with course entry cards. Evening-only students do not need appointments for the 5-6 p.m. change period during the first week of the quarter.

Unless otherwise indicated, all change of registration during these dates will be done in Hutchinson Hall.

Wheelchair users and other students with mobility limitations should use the sections office at 264 Schmitz; no Change of Registration Appointment card is required.

Students will be expected to present Spring Quarter 1986 UW student identification cards when requesting appointments. No more than one change appointment will be issued to a student at a time. Additional change appointments will be issued only after the initially assigned appointment has been used or the date has expired.

Graduate students may change their programs during the first week of the quarter without an appointment or register late with an appointment, at 264 Schmitz.

Students in the schools/colleges of Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing, Pharmacy, Public Health and Community Medicine, Ocean and Fishery Sciences, and Forest Resources, and the Department of Biology may make changes during the first week of the quarter, without an appointment or register late with an appointment, in the

fourth floor lobby of the T-wing, Health Sciences Building.

Engineering students may make changes without an appointment or register late with an appointment, in 209 HUB, during the first week of the quarter.

Changes made after the official change period are restricted and, if permitted, cost \$20 and may result in fee forfeiture (see item 3 of this section).

b) Undergraduates in the College of Arts and Sciences must have their adviser's signature to carry more than 22 credits; 30 credits is the limit per quarter.

## 2. Grades in Dropped Courses and Drop Restrictions

a) *Undergraduates.* Undergraduate students who drop courses after the change periods receive no entry on their academic record if the drop is made during the first two weeks of the quarter, except if all courses are dropped then a university withdrawal date is entered. Drops made during the third and fourth weeks of the quarter will be recorded with a "W." No drops are permitted after the fourth week except a limited number may be dropped as determined by the number of credits earned at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, a student has three drops permitted after the fourth week. Any of these three drops not used at the time 45 credits are earned are forfeited. After 45 credits have been completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. These may be accumulated and used as necessary. No drops, other than hardship withdrawals may be made after the last day of instruction.

b) *Graduate Students.* Graduate students who drop courses after the first two weeks of the quarter receive a grade of "W." No drops are permitted after the seventh week of instruction.

c) Students may petition the Registrar for a hardship withdrawal after the regular drop deadline if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the regular drop deadline. Petitions must be filed promptly after the occurrence of the event that gave rise to the need for dropping the course. Hardship withdrawals are for dropping individual courses only. See section on Withdrawal from the University for the procedure to follow for dropping all courses for the quarter; no petition is required.

## 3. Fee Forfeitures or Refunds

a) Students will be billed for the number of credits, including audit hours, on their programs at the end of the first week of the quarter. Only partial fee reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter.

b) Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition and fees associated with that course. Example: An undergraduate originally registered for 5 credits. The fee for 5 credits is \$265 (resident). The student then drops a 3-credit course in the second week of the quarter. The total number of credits for which the student remains registered is 2. Tuition and fees are due for the 2 credits (\$106) and one-half the difference between 5 credits and 2 credits, in this case an additional \$79.50. Total fees owed are \$185.50. The student has been registered in the dropped course for more than one week and therefore must pay half the fees for the course.

c) Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund. Example: A student is registered for a 3-credit course. The student drops that course after the thirtieth calendar day. No refund is available. If the student adds a different 3-credit course at the time the original 3-credit course is dropped, he or she will pay tuition and fees for 6 credits.

d) The effect of fee forfeitures on the over-18-credit surcharge is as follows: forfeitures for courses dropped that exceeded 18 credits are charged the same as in (b) and (c) above. Also, if a student drops a course after the thirtieth calendar day and adds another, an additional fee per credit will be charged as appropriate. Example: if a student is registered for 15 credits, drops one 5-credit course and then adds another 5-credit course, after the thirtieth calendar day, he or she will be charged for 20 credits although the student's class schedule will show only the 15 registered credits. As a result, he or she will pay for 2 credits above the 18-credit limit.

e) Drops become effective the date received in Sections.

## 4. Courses Added After the Official Change Period

a) As a general rule, no courses may be added after the official change period. Exceptional cases may be approved if both the instructor of the course and the dean of the student's college consent.

b) Courses audited may not be changed to a credit registration after the first two weeks of the quarter.

## FEE PAYMENT

1. You should indicate your choice of permanent or local address on your mark-sense registration form for fee statement mailing. If you have not received a fee statement by the end of the second week of the quarter, contact the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office for the amount of tuition due.

2. You may pay your fees in person in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office or mail them to UW, Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz, PE-10, Seattle, WA 98195, before the tuition due date. Fees must be paid by Friday of the third week of the quarter whether or not you have received a statement. Payments postmarked on or before the due date are accepted without a late fee. Metered mail received after the due date is subject to penalties as described in # 3 below.

3. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your fees, with a \$30 late fee, for one week following the due date. If fees have not been received in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by this time, your registration will be cancelled. Students permitted to reregister after cancellation for nonpayment will be charged a \$75 fee in addition to their tuition.

4. If you reregister, you must reregister for all classes on your schedule at the time of registration cancellation. (Fees will include appropriate charges for classes dropped during the forfeiture period.) All fees for reregistration must be paid by cash, money order, or cashier's check. No reregistration will be possible after the last day of instruction. *Please note: Even if your registration is canceled you will continue to owe one-half your tuition and fees if you are a continuing student or, if you are a new or returning student, \$50 or one-half your tuition and fees, whichever is greater.*

5. Credit card checks are not accepted.

## Special Course and Laboratory Fees

The amounts charged for tuition and fees normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs.

## CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If you change your address be sure to complete a change of address form at the Registration Office. Forms are available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall and during registration at Hutchinson Hall, T-wing Health Sciences Building, and 209 HUB. It is not necessary to turn in a form each quarter *unless* your address or address usage has changed. *You are responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office of any address change.*

## STUDENT INSURANCE

UW students who remain registered through at least the first six days of instruction in the quarter are eligible to enroll in the student health insurance plan. The following students are not eligible:

1. Those enrolled only in programs administered by University Extension, including but not limited to extension, correspondence, independent study, continuing studies, noncredit courses, or the Access program; or

2. UW employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption program.

Students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish student insurance automatically will be enrolled and billed for *student only* medical, surgical, and hospital insurance.

If you are billed for student insurance and wish to cancel your coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance copy of the billing statement and pay the amount billed less the indicated amount for insurance. If you wish to change or add coverage, you must do so in person in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by the date tuition is due. Tuition/fees and the student health insurance premium must be paid in full by the due date to be eligible for health insurance.

### International Students

International students must subscribe to the student insurance plan. Penalties for not paying insurance fees by the tuition due date are the same as tuition penalties under #3 of Fee Payment section. Exceptions may be granted by the International Services Office if the student presents proof of other medical insurance coverage. Students are responsible for obtaining a waiver *each Autumn Quarter* (or upon initial admission if other than Autumn Quarter), because waivers are valid only through Summer Quarter each year. Students holding insurance policies that expire during the academic year are responsible for obtaining new waiver cards, as necessary. Insurance waiver cards submitted during the late payment period require a \$30 late fee. To be eligible for the student health insurance plan, the student must pay, in full, tuition, fees, and the student health insurance premium by the due date. International students who want coverage during the Summer Quarter and are not enrolled Summer Quarter must prepay the Summer Quarter premium during one of the preceding quarters.

## WASHPIRG

An optional \$2 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the regular tuition and fees. If you want to support WASHPIRG, pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$2.

## WASHINGTON STUDENT LOBBY (WSL)

An optional \$1 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Student Lobby (WSL), a voluntary, independent organization of university students whose purpose is to influence the state legislative process on matters of special interest to students. Students not wishing to support this activity simply pay the regular tuition and fees. Students supporting WSL pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$1.

## WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY (DROPPING ALL COURSES FOR THE QUARTER)

1. Obtain an approved withdrawal form from your adviser or from the Withdrawal Office.

2. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz. *Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Registrar's Office.* Fees owed will be based upon the date the withdrawal is received in the Registrar's Office. No withdrawals accepted after the last day of instruction, June 6.

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University. For example, a student who withdraws during the first week of Spring Quarter and Autumn Quarter must reapply as a returning former student for Winter Quarter.

3. Students are required to turn in their student I.D. cards when they withdraw and are not eligible to continue using University services or facilities after their withdrawal.

The forfeiture schedule for withdrawing from the University is as follows:

### a) Continuing Students

(1) Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition or fees.

(2) Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition and fees.

(3) Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe full tuition and fees.

### b) New and Returning Students

(1) Students withdrawing through the sixth day of the quarter forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.

(2) Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter must pay one-half of the regular tuition and fees or forfeit the \$50 enrollment service charge, whichever is greater.

(3) Students who withdraw officially after the thirtieth calendar day must pay full tuition and fees, including the \$50 enrollment service fee.

4. Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal in time may petition the Comptroller's Office. Petition forms are available at the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz.

5. Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed during the first two weeks of a quarter receive no grade and no entry except date of withdrawal is made on the student's permanent academic record. Withdrawals completed after the first two weeks result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W."

## GRADING SYSTEM

The University of Washington uses a numerical grading system with certain exceptions in the schools of Dentistry, Law, and Medicine. Instructors may report grades from 4.0 to 0.7 in 0.1 increments and the grade 0.0. The number 0.0 is assigned for failing work or unofficial withdrawal. Grades in the range 0.6 to 0.1 may not be assigned. Grades reported in this range will be converted by the Registrar's Office to 0.0. For graduate students, grades reported in the range 1.6-0.1 will be converted to 0.0; 100-200-level courses are excluded from credits earned and grade-point averages although such grades are recorded on the transcript; for 300-level courses and courses numbered 600, 601, 700, 750, and 800, grades are recorded and credit is allowed but grades are not included in the grade-point averages. Numerical grades may be considered equivalent to letter grades as follows:

### Repeating Courses

With the approval of the academic department offering the course, an undergraduate student may repeat a course once. Both the original grade and the second grade will be computed in the student's grade-point average but credit will be allowed once. Students repeating courses should so indicate on their registration form.

### The Grade of Incomplete

In order to obtain credit for a course in which an Incomplete has been awarded, an undergraduate student must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the following quarter. An Incomplete grade for a Spring Quarter course must be made up by the last day of Autumn Quarter or the Incomplete will be converted to a grade of 0.0 by the Registrar, unless the instructor has indicated when assigning the Incomplete grade that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. This time limitation may be extended up to one year maximum with instructor approval. Such approval must be received by the Registrar's Office before the end of the next quarter.

A graduate student who receives an Incomplete must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the next quarter *in residence*. An Incomplete received by a graduate student does not automatically convert to 0.0 but remains an Incomplete if the course work is not completed. This time limitation may be waived by the dean of the college in which the course was offered only if the nature of the uncompleted work is such as to make the fulfillment of this requirement impossible. In no case can an Incomplete received by a graduate student be converted to a passing grade after a lapse of two years. The Incomplete grade entry remains on the record permanently. The final grade is posted under the quarter in which the original grade is received.

Incomplete grades may only be awarded if the student is doing satisfactory work up until the last two weeks of the quarter. Undergraduate students must not reregister for courses in which they have

received an Incomplete. A grade earned in a repeat course will not be recorded as an incomplete conversion grade.

### Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis. A course in which an "S" is earned may not be used to satisfy any department, college, or University requirement, except that the credits may be applied to the minimum of 180 credits required for graduation (electives only). Each instructor will report conventional grades to the Registrar, who will convert satisfactory grades (2.0 or greater) to "S," and unsatisfactory grades (less than 2.0) to "NS" for the student's transcript. *S/NS must be elected during initial registration or during the official change of program period.* Undergraduate students earning grades of 2.0 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory) while grades below 2.0 are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory).

Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). With the approval of his or her graduate program adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairperson, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on an S/NS basis.

In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS are included in the grade-point average, N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

### Credit/No Credit-Only Courses

Some courses are offered on a CR/NC-only basis. It is not necessary to register S/NS to take these courses, because the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

Final examinations should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule.

The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed:

1. With the dean's permission, the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for changing the date of a final examination.
2. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.
3. A student absent from any examination through sickness or other cause, judged by the instructor to be unavoidable, shall be given an opportunity to take a rescheduled examination or perform work judged by the instructor to be the equivalent. If the instructor determines that

neither alternative is feasible during the current quarter, the instructor may exempt the student from the requirement. Examples of unavoidable cause include death or serious illness in the immediate family, illness of the student, and, provided previous notification is given, observance of regularly scheduled religious obligations.

4. Classes that meet on the hour use the first full hour of instruction to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that meets at 10 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.
5. Classes that begin on the half hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the examination time. For example, a class that meets at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9:00 a.m. would use the 7:30 a.m. time.
6. Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may use that room at 8:30 a.m. or 2:30 p.m. for a three-hour examination. All other examinations are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.
7. If an examination is held at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure that the room is going to be available.

# NEW COURSES FOR SPRING 1986

The following list includes new courses that will be offered Spring Quarter 1986, which were added to the University curriculum after publication of the 1984-86 General Catalog. Consult the appropriate academic department for information on courses not listed below.

## COLLEGE OF ARCHITECTURE AND URBAN PLANNING

### PRE-PROFESSIONAL COURSES

#### CAUP 200 INTRODUCTION TO ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN AND PLANNING (9)

Laboratories, lectures, demonstrations introducing basic curricular elements. Emphasizes development of basic skills in methods and graphic expression of design and planning process - analysis, synthesis, evaluation. Additional areas: building technology; simulation, modeling; person-environment relations; history; theory; policy; professional roles. Prerequisites: ENV S 204, ENV S 205, or permission of program director.

### ARCHITECTURE

#### ARCH 494 ROME STUDIES (9)

While resident in Rome students study the urban fabric, art, and architecture of Italy aided by illustrated lectures, walking tours, museum visits, and field trips to important sites around Rome and in northern and southern Italy. Projects and lectures supplemented with language classes, sketching sessions, and group workshops.

#### ARCH 581 HISTORIC PRESERVATION OF ARCHITECTURE, USA (3)

Study and critical investigation of American achievements in historic preservation and restoration of architecture. Prerequisite: specialization in preservation design or permission of instructor.

### BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

#### B CON 402 BUILDING ESTIMATING II (3)

Estimating the major CSI divisions for work for large-scale projects. Discussion of labor rates, specifications, budget estimating, assembling bids, use of estimating manuals, and estimating change orders. Prerequisite: 401.

#### B CON 403 COMPUTER APPLICATIONS IN CONSTRUCTION (2)

An introduction to microcomputer applications in the construction industry. A discussion of available hardware and software is combined with practical assignments using estimating and scheduling programs designed for contractors, architects, and developers.

#### B CON 405 HEAVY ESTIMATING TECHNIQUES (3)

An introduction to the principles and techniques of estimating and bidding heavy/highway projects. Prerequisite: 401.

### LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

#### L ARC 590 SEMINAR IN LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE (1-3, MAX. 12)

Study and research in advanced topics of landscape architecture with focus on unpublished areas of research. Conducted by department faculty and visiting professors. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

#### L ARC 601 INTERNSHIP (3-9, MAX. 9)

### AMERICAN ETHNIC STUDIES

#### AFRO-AMERICAN STUDIES

#### AFRAM 260 BLACK MALE/FEMALE AND FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS (5)

The Black family in the United States as a social institution. Effects of residence in a race-conscious society on the interpersonal relationships between Black men and women. Exploration of proposals for strengthening the Black family in the United States. Recommended: 100, 105, or 150.

### ANTHROPOLOGY

#### ANTH 405 PEOPLES OF THE SOVIET UNION (5)

Offered jointly with SISRE 405. See International Studies for description.

### APPLIED MATHEMATICS

#### AMATH 502 APPLIED MATHEMATICS CLINIC (1-2)

Provides consulting service for problems from different academic units requiring assistance in formulation, analysis, and interpretation of mathematical models. With faculty assistance, students actively learn to delineate sources of difficulties, identify or devise a method of solution, and effectively communicate it to clients. Prerequisites: 584, 568, and 569.

#### AMATH 506 APPLIED PROBABILITY AND STATISTICAL INFERENCE (4)

Offered jointly with STAT 506. See Statistics for description.

#### AMATH 509 THEORY OF OPTIMAL CONTROL (3)

Offered jointly with MATH 509. See Mathematics for description. (Last quarter offered Sp 86)

#### AMATH 516 NUMERICAL OPTIMIZATION (3)

Offered jointly with MATH 516. See Mathematics for description. (Last quarter offered Sp 86)

### ART

#### ART HISTORY

#### ART H 386 ART OF WASHINGTON AND THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST (5)

History of painting, sculpture, printmaking, and the decorative arts from the mid-nineteenth century to the present. Emphasis on Seattle and the Puget Sound region; major developments in Oregon and British Columbia noted.

### CHEMISTRY

#### CHEM 299 SPECIAL PROBLEMS AND REPORT WRITING (1, MAX. 6)

Problems relating to experimental chemistry. For chemistry majors only. Includes requirement for work on scientific report writing. Prerequisites: permission of chemistry adviser and a chemistry grade point average above 3.0.

**CHEM 399 UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH (\*, MAX. 12)**

For qualified chemistry majors in the bachelor of science curriculum, especially those planning graduate work. Not open for credit to graduate students. Prerequisites: permission of chemistry adviser and a chemistry grade point average above 3.0.

**CHEM 521 ANALYTICAL ELECTROCHEMISTRY (3)**

The theory and practice of modern electrochemistry with an emphasis on instrumentation and applications in the area of chemical analysis.

**COMPARATIVE LITERATURE****C LIT 272 THE VISUAL TEXT: GENRE IN FILM (5)**

Introduction to the study of film genre. Literary, music, and historic aspects of film genre are examined. 270, 271, 272 are designed ideally to be taken in sequence, but may be taken individually.

**C LIT 518 COLLOQUIUM IN MEDIEVAL STUDIES (5)**

Salient literary aspects of the European Middle Ages, taught by representatives from various literature departments as well as related disciplines such as philosophy, art history, history, and comparative religion.

**COMPUTER SCIENCE****C SCI 444 INTRODUCTION TO DATABASE SYSTEMS (3)**

Fundamental concepts, system organization, and implementation of database systems. Topics include the relational, hierarchical, and network data models; file organizations and data structures; query languages; query optimization; database design; concurrency control; security; and issues involving distributed database systems. Prerequisite: 326.

**C SCI 457 COMPUTER GRAPHICS (3)**

Overview of the techniques of computer image synthesis, including both hardware and software. Line drawing and color raster graphics. Homogenous coordinates, hidden surface, and smooth shading algorithms. Prerequisite: 326

**C SCI 549 HIGH-PERFORMANCE COMPUTER ARCHITECTURES (3)**

Algorithm design, software techniques, and computer organizations for high-performance computing systems. Selected topics from: VLSI complexity for parallel algorithms, compiling techniques for parallel and vector machines, large MIMD machines, interconnection networks, reconfigurable systems, memory hierarchies in multiprocessors, algorithmically specialized processors, dataflow architectures. Prerequisite: 548 or permission of instructor.

**DRAMA****DRAMA 450 REHEARSAL LABORATORY (2, MAX. 6)**

Acting in projects directed by graduate directing students. Prerequisites: one year of acting and an audition.

**DRAMA 564 ADVANCED DIRECTING - REHEARSAL (2, MAX. 6)**

Exploration of rehearsal techniques that can be used in defining style in a variety of contemporary and historical plays. Prerequisite: completion of first year of graduate directing program.

**ECONOMICS****ECON 100 PRINCIPLES OF ECONOMICS (5)**

Fundamental concepts of economic analysis with application to contemporary problems. No credit if taken after 200 and/or 201.

**ECON 468 CHINA'S ECONOMIC REFORMS - INTEGRATION INTO WORLD ECONOMY (5)**

Offered jointly with SISEA 468. See International Studies for description.

**ECON 582 ECONOMETRICS III (3)**

Methods, tools, and theory of econometrics as the basis for empirical investigation in economics. Specification, testing, and use of econometric models with reference to examples in the literature. Prerequisite: 581.

**ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES****ENV S 221 THE PROBLEM OF NUCLEAR ARMS (3)**

Properties and effects of nuclear weapons; delivery and command systems; strategic thought; interplay between technical and nontechnical issues with emphasis on proposals to reduce the risk of nuclear war.

**GEOGRAPHY****GEOG 494 SENIOR ESSAY (3)**

Supervised individual research and writing of major paper during senior year. Prerequisites: senior standing and permission of faculty sponsor and undergraduate adviser.

**GEOG 496 INTERNSHIP IN GEOGRAPHY (3/5, MAX. 12)**

Internship in the public or private sector, supervised by a faculty member. Prerequisites: sophomore standing or above in geography and permission of faculty sponsor and undergraduate adviser.

**GEOLOGICAL SCIENCES****GEOL 550 THEORETICAL STRUCTURAL GEOLOGY (4)**

Analysis of finite deformation; elastic, plastic, and viscous behavior; dislocations and crystal deformation; deformation mechanisms and flow laws for rocks; formation of folds, boudinage, and mullions; tensile fracture and the growth of joints, dikes, and veins; mechanics of faulting; large-scale crystal deformation. Prerequisites: 340 and 455 or equivalents.

**GEOPHYSICS****GPYS 435 SEISMIC EXPLORATION (4)**

Introduction to theory and practice of seismic exploration. Application of refraction and reflection techniques to problems in engineering geology and mineral exploration. Emphasis on constraints in the interpretation of subsurface structure. Prerequisites: MATH 126, PHYS 123, GEOL 340.

**GPYS 540 SEISMOLOGY I - PRINCIPLES OF SEISMOLOGY (3)**

Introduction to theoretical and observational seismology. Basic theory of wave motion. Elastic waves; their dispersion and attenuation. Seismic surface waves and eigenvibrations. Seismic ray theory and application to earth structure. Observational seismology. Large-scale structure of earth's interior. Prerequisite: PHYS 321 or permission of instructor.

**GERMANICS****GERM 355 GERMAN LITERATURE AND FILM IN ENGLISH (5)**

Relationship between literature and film in the German tradition. Content varies; focus may be on a particular time period, director, or theme. Special attention paid to the critical and analytical skills required for interpreting the two mediums.



## HISTORY

### **HST 335 THE UNITED STATES AND VIETNAM (5)**

American involvement in Vietnam, including: (1) the complex of negotiations; (2) strategies and objectives of both sides; (3) military, political, and economic operations of the United States; (4) efforts at pacification; (5) impact of Vietnam on American affairs.

### **HISTORY OF THE AMERICAS**

#### **HSTAA 416 AMERICAN LAW AND THE AMERICAN INDIAN (3)**

Relationship between Indians and the United States from 1789 to the present. Concentration is on significant constitutional, legislative, and judicial actions. Legal events are explored within their political, military, social, and cultural context. Comparisons with other minority group experiences. Offered jointly with LAW 467.

### **MODERN EUROPEAN HISTORY**

#### **HSTEU 480 EUROPEAN SOCIALISM (5)**

Origins and development of socialist theory and practice in Europe since the French Revolution. Emphasis on socialism as a political movement. Prerequisite: at least one course in the history of Europe since 1789.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

### **SIS -512 PRACTICUM: METHODS IN INTERNATIONAL STUDIES (-3)**

Assumptions underlying the leading methodologies for the comparative study of societies and other large-scale social entities. Quantitative and nonquantitative methods illustrated by recent research. Recommended: course in introductory statistics.

### **EAST ASIAN STUDIES**

#### **SISEA 468 CHINA'S ECONOMIC REFORMS - INTEGRATION INTO WORLD ECONOMY (5)**

A systematic survey of China's economic reforms since 1978, including China's increasing integration into the world economy. Offered jointly with ECON 468. Prerequisite: ECON 390 or ECON 493 or permission of instructor.

### **RUSSIAN AND EAST EUROPEAN STUDIES**

#### **SISRE 405 PEOPLES OF THE SOVIET UNION (5)**

Traditional culture and social organization of Russians and some other USSR peoples, including larger nationalities (e.g., Ukrainians, Estonians) and some smaller ethnic groups in Siberia. Explores the role of traditional culture in shaping contemporary lifestyles in a multi-ethnic, diversified setting. Offered jointly with ANTH 405. Prerequisite: ANTH 202 or permission of instructor.

## LINGUISTICS

### **LING 444 PHILOSOPHY OF LANGUAGE - PRAGMATICS (3)**

Offered jointly with PHIL 444. See Philosophy for description.

### **LING 540 PHONOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENT (3)**

Selected topics in the developmental sequence of phonological systems in normal speaking children. Relationships between possible phonological inventories and rule systems in different languages. Offered jointly with SPHSC 540. Prerequisites: 451, 452, or permission of instructor.

## MATHEMATICS

### **MATH 107 MATHEMATICS: A PRACTICAL ART (5)**

The exponential function; how it applies to a wide variety of phenomena. Elementary probability and statistics; their

use in variety of applications. For students not planning to take additional mathematics. Prerequisites: one and one-half years high school algebra and qualifying test, or equivalent.

### **MATH 509 THEORY OF OPTIMAL CONTROL (3)**

Trajectories obtained from ordinary differential equations with control variables. Controllability, optimality, the maximum principle. Relaxation and the existence of solutions. Techniques of nonsmooth analysis. Offered jointly with AMATH 509. Prerequisites: real analysis on the level of 426; background in optimization corresponding to 515. (Last quarter offered: Sp 86)

### **MATH 516 NUMERICAL OPTIMIZATION (3)**

Methods of solving optimization problems in finitely many variables, with or without constraints. Steepest descent, quasi-Newton methods. Quadratic programming and complementarity. Exact penalty methods, multiplier methods. Sequential quadratic programming. Cutting planes and nonsmooth optimization Offered jointly with AMATH 516. Prerequisite: 515. (Last quarter offered: Sp 86)

## MUSIC

### **MUSIC APPLIED**

#### **MUSAP 205 STRING TECHNIQUES (2, MAX. 12)**

Group instruction of performance techniques, methods, and materials for orchestral string instruments.

#### **MUSAP 210 WIND TECHNIQUES (2, MAX. 12)**

Group instruction of performance techniques, methods, and materials for orchestral wind and brass instruments.

#### **MUSAP 218 GUITAR TECHNIQUES (1, MAX. 3)**

### **MUSIC ENSEMBLE**

#### **MUSEN 472 OPERA WORKSHOP (1, MAX. 6)**

Preparation of music theatre repertoire. Intended for the mature voice student. Prerequisite: 373 or permission of instructor.

## PHILOSOPHY

### **PHIL 241 TOPICS IN ETHICS (5)**

An introduction to ethics through a study in depth of one or more selected topics, e.g., the limits of moral community, moral education, conscience, shame and guilt, virtue and vice, purity, saintliness and heroism, friendship, veracity, manners and morals, freedom, rights, collective responsibility. Topics vary.

### **PHIL 444 PHILOSOPHY OF LANGUAGE - PRAGMATICS (3)**

Language as communicative activity. Speech act theory in Austin, Grice, and contemporary writings. Applications to problems of reference, presupposition, metaphor, relativism. Offered jointly with LING 444.

## POLITICAL SCIENCE

### **POL S 212 PHILOSOPHY OF FEMINISM (5)**

Offered jointly with PHIL and WOMEN 206. See Women Studies in the General Catalog for description.

### **POL S 561 LAW AND POLITICS (5)**

Points and levels at which law and politics intersect. Objective: to discover what is distinctive about legal forms; to understand how these legal forms influence, and are influenced by, politics. Topics include conception of law, courts and public policy, law and bureaucracy, civil and criminal justice, and the legal profession.

## PSYCHOLOGY

### PSYCH 438 SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY OF MOTOR BEHAVIOR AND SPORT I (4)

Emphasis on reciprocal effects of interpersonal and group influence processes. Topics include social facilitation, social reinforcement, observational learning, individual versus group performance, group cohesion, leadership, and group conflict. Prerequisite: 101.

## ROMANCE LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

### SPANISH

#### SPAN 353 CERVANTES' DON QUIXOTE, IN ENGLISH (5)

Cervantes' *Don Quixote de la Mancha*: close study of this comic masterpiece, and the life, times, and works of its author. Consideration of the work's enduring influence and vitality.

## SCANDINAVIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

#### SCAND 515 PRE-NINETEENTH CENTURY SCANDINAVIAN LITERATURE (3)

Seminar on Scandinavian literature of the 16th, 17th, and 18th centuries.

## SLAVIC LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

### RUSSIAN

#### RUSS 424 SONGS AND SINGERS OF SOVIET UNDERGROUND (3)

Works of major and lesser figures in the Soviet dissident song-poetry movement of the 1960s and 1970s. Vysotskii, Galich, Okudzhava, Dol'skii, and Kim are among those discussed.

## SPEECH AND HEARING SCIENCE

#### SPHSC 540 PHONOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENT (3)

Offered jointly with LING 540. See Linguistics for description.

#### SPHSC 588 PROSEMINAR (1, MAX. 3)

Consideration of professional issues and student/faculty research in specific areas of interest.

## SPEECH COMMUNICATION

#### SPCH 555 INSTRUCTIONAL COMMUNICATION (5)

Communication in instructional environments. Nature of instructional communication, paradigms for instructional communication research, quantitative and qualitative approaches to instructional communication, verbal and nonverbal classroom interaction.

## STATISTICS

#### STAT 506 APPLIED PROBABILITY AND STATISTICAL INFERENCE (4)

Overview of probability models, random variables, independence and conditional probability, Markov chains, stationary time series, statistical inference, estimation and testing. Offered jointly with AMATH 506. Prerequisite: some advanced calculus and linear algebra.

## ZOOLOGY

#### ZOOL 471 MODELS IN BIOLOGY (4)

Explores the use of models in biology in a wide range of topics including morphogenesis, nerve signals, ecological interactions, population biology, and evolutionary theory. Emphasis on the biological insights models can provide rather than mathematical techniques. Prerequisites: BIOL 210, BIOL 211, MATH 124, MATH 125.

## SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

## ACCOUNTING

#### ACCTG 490 SPECIAL TOPICS IN ACCOUNTING (3)

Study of special topics of current concern to faculty and students. Offered only when faculty is available and there is sufficient student interest. Class announced in advance of scheduled offerings.

## INFORMATION SYSTEMS

#### I S 490 SELECTED TOPICS IN INFORMATION SYSTEMS (4, MAX. 12)

Information systems topics of current concern to faculty and students. Potential topics include: networks and distributed information processing systems, office automation, artificial intelligence and knowledge based systems, new approaches to systems development, fourth and fifth generation languages, economics of information systems. Prerequisite: 320.

#### I S 571-572 RESEARCH REPORTS (3-3)

Independent study in information systems; critical evaluation of business analysis and research methods. Effective communication of ideas emphasized. Methods and content of independent research studies being completed by the students are subjected to critical evaluation. Prerequisites: instructor's approval of preliminary research topic outline for 571-; 571- for -572.

#### I S 599- DOCTORAL SEMINAR (1-1-1, MAX. 12)

Study and research in advanced topics of information systems. The seminar is generally concerned with unpublished areas of research and is conducted by visiting professors and departmental faculty. Prerequisites: doctoral students only, permission of graduate office.

## COMMUNITY DENTISTRY

#### COM D 521P P-PROFESSIONAL ISSUES: MANAGEMENT OF PATIENT BEHAVIOR (1)

Application of techniques and principles learned in 530, involving a project of managing a patient's preventive care habits.

#### COM D 535P P-PROFESSIONAL ISSUES: SCIENTIFIC LITERATURE IN CLINICAL DECISION MAKING (1)

Introduction to critically reading individual articles in professional journals and integrating the findings of several articles. Emphasis on using the literature to assist the practicing dentist in making clinical decisions.

## DENTISTRY

#### DENT 640P P-EXTRAMURAL CLINICS IN GERIATRIC DENTISTRY (2)

Extramural geriatric clinical experience, including choice of hospital, nursing home, community clinic, and brief didactic component.

## ORAL SURGERY

#### O S 522P P-SEDATION AND PAIN CONTROL (2)

Comprehensive survey of techniques of sedation (oral, inhalational, intravenous) and pain control.

## PEDIATRIC DENTISTRY

PEDO 645P P-PROFESSIONAL ISSUES: CAI PATIENT MANAGEMENT (1)

Utilizes computer instruction including computer literacy, word processing, data base management, analysis of outcomes of clinical practice, clinic scheduling, project management, and clinical simulations.

## PERIODONTICS

PERIO 526P P-PREVENTION/PERIODONTICS (2)

Overview of preventive dentistry, introduction to periodontal therapy.

## RESTORATIVE DENTISTRY

RES D 542P P-NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN DENTAL MATERIALS (1)

Dental materials recently introduced to dental profession reviewed, compared to current materials, and clinically demonstrated.

## COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

### CHEMICAL ENGINEERING

CH E 590 ADVANCED TOPICS IN BIOMATERIALS (3)

Offered jointly with BIOEN 590. See Bioengineering for description.

### CIVIL ENGINEERING

STRUCTURAL AND GEOTECHNICAL ENGINEERING AND MECHANICS

CESH 512 ADVANCED PRESTRESSED CONCRETE DESIGN (3)

Prestress loss. Design of statically indeterminate prestressed concrete structures; continuous beam, frame, and slab structures, (cast-in-place or assembled from precast units). Prerequisite: 482 or equivalent.

CESH 516 DESIGN FOR WIND (3)

Wind effects on structures, including: atmospheric boundary layer flow, bluff body aerodynamics, structural dynamics, and aeroelasticity; development and use of ANSI standards; estimation of along-wind, across wind, and torsional response of tall buildings; design strategies for avoiding wind-induced discomfort in humans. Fundamentals of wind tunnel testing. Prerequisites: 501, 502.

CESH 565 SOIL DYNAMICS AND EARTHQUAKE ENGINEERING (3)

Wave propagation in elastic, homogeneous, isotropic medium. Layered ground response by wave propagation analysis. Nature of earthquake shaking; ground motion attenuation; soil conditions influence on ground motion; dynamic soil properties. Soil liquefaction, settlement; soil-structure interaction; effect on lateral pressures, slope stability. Prerequisite: 467 or equivalent, or permission of instructor.

### ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

E E 487 MOS TRANSISTOR PHYSICS AND TECHNOLOGY (3)

Physics and technology of MOS transistors and capacitors; scaling factors and various operating conditions. Development of device parameters and characteristics; CMOS technology. Prerequisite: 383 or equivalent.

E E 564 PARALLEL COMPUTER SYSTEMS (3)

Pipelined and vector processors; interconnection network for parallel processing, array and associative processors; multi-processors; data flow machines; systolic arrays and impact of the VLSI technology on parallel processors and processing. Prerequisites: 471 and permission of instructor.

## MECHANICAL ENGINEERING

M E 80 FINITE ELEMENT ANALYSIS (4)

Development of theory and concepts of finite element analysis. Applications in all areas of mechanical engineering including mechanics of solids, heat transfer, and design of dynamic systems. Weekly computer exercises. Prerequisites: 205 or 32, and 352, 374.

M E 80 INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTER-AIDED TECHNOLOGY (4)

Introduction to principles of computer-aided technology. Topics include: computer-aided design, engineering, drafting, manufacturing; CAD systems, geometry, computer graphics, hardware, computer-aided vehicle/system design synthesis. System demonstrations, labs, and site visits are included. Offered jointly with O ENG 480. Prerequisites: ENGR 3, ENGR 141.

M E 553 ADHESION MECHANICS (3)

Introduction to adhesive systems and test/evaluation techniques. Stress/strain analysis methods used with adhesive joints. Examples of practical applications. Prerequisite: graduate status or permission of instructor. (Offered even numbered years.)

## MECHANICAL ENGINEERING/INDUSTRIAL ENGINEERING

MEIE 326 METHODOLOGY OF OPERATIONS RESEARCH (3)

Fundamental concepts of mathematical systems theory. Application of general systems approach for specification of requirements, analysis, design, implementation of industrial engineering, information systems. Emphasizes generalized techniques and applications common to industrial, mechanical engineers and management scientists. Class project concerning analysis of large-scale systems problem utilizing operational research. Prerequisite: 325.

MEIE 482 ROBOTICS AND ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (3)

The application of robots and other flexible manufacturing equipment. Topics include sensors, mechanization of parts handling, automatic production and assembly, types of industrial robots, and industrial implementation. An introduction to artificial intelligence is included. Prerequisite: 481

## OCEAN ENGINEERING

O EN 480 INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTER-AIDED TECHNOLOGY (4)

Offered jointly with M E 480. See M E 480 for description.

O EN 562 STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS OF MARINE SYSTEMS (3)

Covers structural analysis of marine systems such as ships and offshore platforms. Topics include sections and loading conditions, structural dynamics, plating under lateral and in-plane loads, stress concentration and temperature effects. Prerequisites: ENGR 220, ME 352.

## SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION

STC 401 STYLE IN SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL WRITING (3)

Study and practice of style in scientific and technical discourse. Attention given to grammatical structures and stylistic strategies within specific professional contexts. Focuses on achieving clarity and conciseness through word choice and placement; using a variety of sentence structures for appropriate emphasis; handling details; and establishing effective tone.

STC 406 RESEARCH IN TECHNICAL WRITING (3)

To provide a basis for integrating skills acquired in other STC courses, students examine the research of various disciplines that impact technical writing. Structured around theoretical and empirical literature as it relates to different textual issues in technical writing.

## COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES

### BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

#### FOR B 445 LANDSCAPE PLANT MANAGEMENT (4)

Principles and practices of plant management in cultivated situations. Examines landscape design from the horticultural perspective, schedules and budgets, pruning, fertilization, transplanting and care of specialized plant material. Term project required. Prerequisite: BOT 331 or equivalent knowledge of woody plants.

#### FOR B 509 URBAN HORTICULTURE SEMINAR (1, MAX. 6)

Discussion by invited speakers on current topics dealing with urban horticulture.

#### FOR B 562 FOREST ECOSYSTEMS - NUTRIENT CYCLING (4)

Biogeochemistry of forest ecosystems. Role of mineral nutrients in regulating plant and ecosystem function. Nutrient conservation by ecosystems. Physical, biological, and successional factors influencing use, accumulation, and cycling of mineral nutrients. Prerequisites: 310 and 11 or equivalents.

### PHYSICAL SCIENCES

#### FOR P 516 SNOW HYDROLOGY (3)

Snow from formation to melt as it relates to the hydrologic response of watersheds. Includes measurement of snowpack properties, energy and mass balances, effects of vegetation manipulation on accumulation and melt, and the role of snowmelt in hydrologic modeling. Prerequisites: one course in hydrology and one course in meteorology.

## INTERDISCIPLINARY GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS

### NUTRITIONAL SCIENCES

#### NUTR 564 NUTRITION SUPPORT MANAGEMENT (3)

Administrative processes affecting health care, specific focus on management of nutritional support. Includes productivity and cost effectiveness of nutrition care, establishing and achieving quality of care, peer review, budgeting, working with other health care professionals and integrating health care systems. For clinical nutritionists working in standard health care systems.

## INTERSCHOOL/INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAMS

### BIOENGINEERING

#### BIOEN 511 BIOMATERIALS SEMINAR (1)

Weekly seminar for the presentation of student research results. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

#### BIOEN 590 ADVANCED TOPICS IN BIOMATERIALS (3)

Major, controversial issues in application of synthetic materials to medical problems covered. Includes blood compatibility, bioadhesion, intraocular lenses, contact lenses, polyurethanes, biodegradation, protein adsorption, corrosion, bone fixation, new materials, the artificial heart and medical device regulation. Utilizes lectures, discussion, literature research, problem solving. Offered jointly with CH E 590. Prerequisite: 490.

#### BIOEN 591 BIOTECHNOLOGY PRINCIPLES AND APPLICATIONS (3)

Recombinant DNA and monoclonal antibody processing, product applications, and economics in the medical, veterinary, and agricultural fields covered. Current literature critically reviewed.

#### BIOEN 800 DOCTORAL DISSERTATION (\*)

### QUANTITATIVE SCIENCE

#### Q SCI 599 RESEARCH IN QUANTITATIVE RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND ECOLOGY (\*, MAX. 12)

Topics can be theoretical in nature or combined theory and experiment. Research might be a prelude to thesis or dissertation research.

### UNIVERSITY CONJOINT

#### UCONJ 506 CELL AND MOLECULAR BIOLOGY AND DISEASE (3)

Integrates topics in 504 and 505, cell injury, inflammation, immunology and neoplasia. Prerequisite: 505.

## LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE

#### LIBR 498 SPECIAL TOPICS (1-5, MAX. 15)

Library service and information science subject matter in seminars, workshops, or other appropriate formats. Topics vary and may be repeated for credit. Prerequisite: junior standing or higher.

## SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

### BIOMEDICAL HISTORY

#### BI HS 483 THE RISE AND DEVELOPMENT OF SPORTS MEDICINE (3)

Survey of evolution of medical thought related to training for sport participation and treatment of sport-related injuries. Begins with ancient period, concludes with present. Emphasis on development of specialization in sports medicine, sport team physicians, concepts of fitness and wellness as related to exercise prescription, and sports medicine clinics.

### CONJOINT

#### CONJ 505P PAIN CLINIC PRECEPTORSHIP (1)

One morning per week spent observing patient care in either inpatient or outpatient settings at University Hospital; and associated readings. Prerequisite: first or second year medical students.

### MEDICAL EDUCATION RESEARCH

#### MEDED 499 UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH (\*, MAX. 12)

Investigative research or readings in medical education: topics include clinical reasoning, curriculum development, evaluation, use of computers in medical education, and educational research in medical settings. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

### UROLOGY

#### UROL 501P P-UROLOGY PRECEPTORSHIP (1)

Individualized experiences with one or more of the full-time faculty members of the Department of Urology covering research, teaching, and patient care. Students observe activities in clinic, hospital ward, operating room, and research laboratories. Prerequisites: first or second year medical student and permission of instructor.

## SCHOOL OF NURSING

### PSYCHOSOCIAL NURSING

#### PSN 507 BEHAVIOR AND ADAPTATION: ELDER ADULTS (3)

Theory and research of behavior and adaptation in elder adults examined. Functional impairments are related to and assessed within person-environment contexts. Intervention strategies-based psychodynamic, development, cognitive-behavioral, role theory, somatic, and self-help models are compared evaluated. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

## COLLEGE OF OCEAN AND FISHERY SCIENCES

### OCEANOGRAPHY

#### OCEAN 533 BIOLOGICAL OCEANOGRAPHY: BENTHOS (3)

Analysis of marine benthic communities, emphasizing new research questions and methods: ecologically important physics of benthic boundary layer; theories, mechanics, and observations; of deposit feeding; succession as consequence of physical processes and biological interactions. Environments include deep sea, continental shelves, estuaries and intertidal, focusing on soft substrata. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

#### OCEAN 535 SEMINAR IN BIOLOGICAL OCEANOGRAPHY (\*, MAX. 9)

Lectures, discussions, and work on selected problems of current interest. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

### MARINE STUDIES

#### INS 516 SEAPORT MANAGEMENT (3)

Role of port authorities in management of marine uses; cargo and trade, economic development, tourism and recreation, and fisheries. Management functions of planning, marketing, finance, engineering, stressed. Examples and guest speakers from the Port of Seattle, and other Puget Sound ports. Prerequisite: 500 or permission of instructor.

## SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

### MEDICINAL CHEMISTRY

#### MEDCH 540 SPECTROSCOPIC TECHNIQUES IN LIFE SCIENCES (3)

Basic principles and applications of spectroscopic techniques to problems in life sciences using UV, IR, NMR, CD/ORD, TLC, GC, LC, and scintillation spectrometry. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. (Offered alternate years; last quarter offered Sp 87)

### PHARMACEUTICS

#### PCEUT 410 PHARMACOKINETICS OF DRUG INTERACTIONS (3)

A survey of the common pharmacokinetic mechanisms underlying the clinically important interactions between drugs. Interactions involving gastrointestinal adsorption, serum drug protein binding, excretory, and metabolic clearance processes presented. Prerequisites: 405, 406.

#### PCEUT 510 PHARMACOKINETICS OF DRUG INTERACTIONS (3)

Taught with 410. See 410 for description.

### PHARMACY PRACTICE

#### PHARM 451 PHARMACY LAW UPDATE (1)

A review of changes in federal and state statutes and regulations relating to drugs, controlled substances, pharmacy practice, and licensing of practitioners and pharmacies. Complements the material provided in 450, and provides new information as statutes and regulations change. Prerequisites: 450.

## SCHOOL OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

#### PB AF 537 FOREIGN POLICY: STRATEGY, INTELLIGENCE, ARMS CONTROL (3)

The strategic relationship between the USA and the USSR in the Post World War II period. Emphasis on: the tools of intelligence and strategic analysis, arms control, and domestic and allied consensus on strategic objectives. Each student analyzes a major policy issues, and makes a policy proposal. Prerequisite: 534 or permission of instructor.

#### PB AF 550 PUBLIC ARTS POLICY AND MANAGEMENT (3)

Role of government in arts. Range of public support at federal, state, and local levels; reasons for its development and viability. Nature, evolution, functions of public arts agencies in implementing arts policy; relation of such agencies to their constituencies. Seattle, King County, and Washington state serve as case studies.

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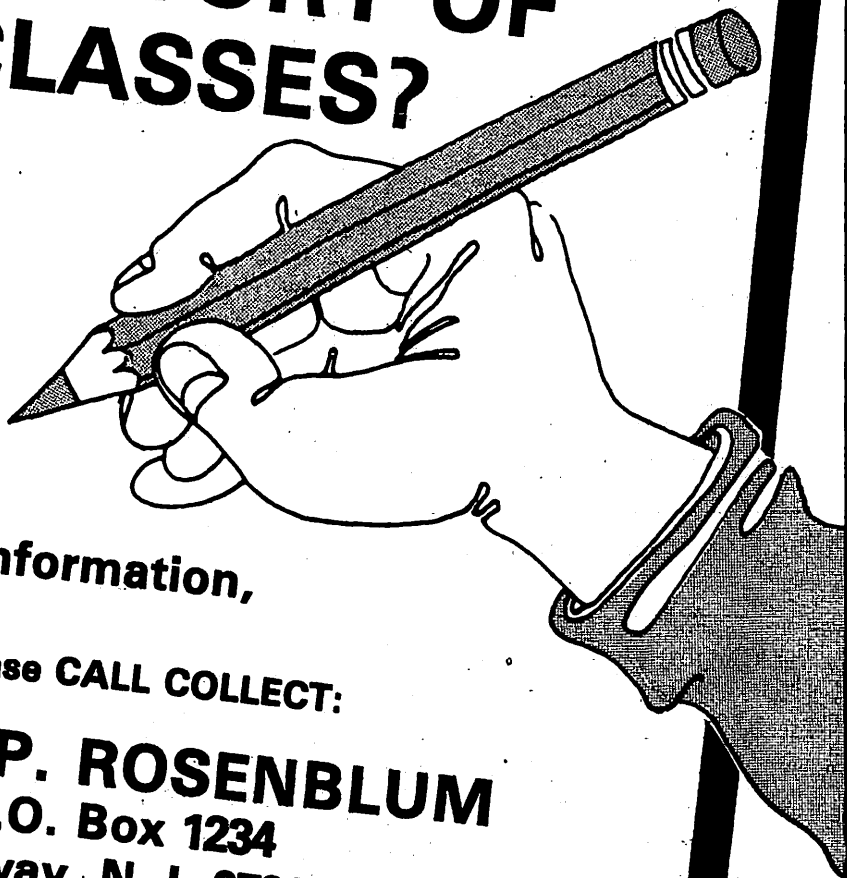
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
