# GENERAL INFORMATION

It is the University's expectation that a student will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the *General Catalog*. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and the student is persuaded that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, he or she may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which he or she is enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer the student to the proper office for a decision.

## GUARANTEED REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

University of Washington students who remain in good scholastic standing are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (Summer Quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate, etc. Once a student earns a bachelor's degree, he or she must apply for readmission as a postbaccalaureate, nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action and (2) students with a financial hold.

If an undergraduate does not enroll for one or more quarters, or if a graduate student goes on-leave, he or she must file an application for readmission with the Registrar's Office. See appropriate readmission closing dates.

## FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT

Many students think that because they pay full fees they are considered full-time students. This is not true! To be considered a full-time student, undergraduates must register for 12 credits and graduates must register for 9 credits. Full-time status requirements vary for certain agencies, such as Immigration and Naturalization Service, Veterans Administration, and Social Security Administration. Consult the Registrar's Office for social security requirements, the International Services Office for immigration requirements, and the Veterans Affairs Office for VA benefits.

## ENROLLMENT SERVICE FEE

The \$50 Enrollment Service Fee is not required for Summer Quarter. If a payment has been made for the coming Autumn Quarter, it cannot be credited to Summer Quarter fees. Summer Quarter fees are entirely separate from fees collected for the regular academic year and, therefore, credit balances in student accounts may not be applied to Summer Quarter tuition. Student account credit balances must be ei-

ther refunded or applied to another quarter of the regular academic year.

## AUDITORS

Auditors pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course.

Attendance in courses as an auditor is by consent of the instructor involved and is conditioned by the extent to which space is available. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. An auditor may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work, and his or her registration may be cancelled at the discretion of the instructor.

No entry is made on the permanent record for courses audited. To receive credit for an audited course, the student must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors follow registration instructions below.

## PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED STUDENTS

Students with severe physical handicaps are given the highest registration priority. A Building Accessibility Guide is available for those who need information on wheelchair access to classrooms and University offices. In many cases, classes are moved to accommodate students with ambulatory handicaps. To obtain assistance and information, students should contact Duke Washington, Director of Student Services, Office of Student Affairs, 466 Schmitz Hall, telephone 543-4893. Students may also consult Room Assignments, telephone 543-1080, for information on classrooms and their accessibility to the handicapped.

## NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS

During summer, nonmatriculated students receive the same priority as matriculated students for registration appointments, have equal access to summer classes and to departmental advisory offices, and may participate in preregistration for summer classes if they have applied early enough to receive their admission notification by May 1.

# REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

## ACADEMIC ADVISER

Using the *Summer Quarter Bulletin* and the quarterly *Time Schedule* select courses you would like and plan your program of study for the summer. See an academic adviser if you have questions about registration procedures, the courses you wish to take, or if approval of your quarterly program of study is required.

Nonmatriculated students may consult advisers in the academic department offering the course or courses they wish to take (adviser approval of summer programs is not required, however). Students enrolling primarily in evening classes may consult an adviser in the Continuing Education Division of Academic and Professional Programs.

## REGISTRATION FORMS

1. Obtain a mark-sense registration form from your advisory office or from the Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall, and mark the courses you are requesting on the form in accordance with directions on the form. Please note that some courses in the *Time Schedule* have restricted enrollment and

you must obtain entry cards for these courses. Undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter. This is done to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

2. If you are registering for a course "out of quarter," obtain the required permission form from your advisory office and make a request for the course during the change of registration period.

3. Summer Quarter courses offered for variable credit (this does not include variable credit courses offered for fixed credit this summer) must be taken for a whole number of credits; fractional credits that vary from student to student in a single quarter cannot be processed.

## ENTRY CARDS

Certain courses and sections require entry cards for registration. Students who request these courses (and/or sections) on their registration forms will not be registered in the courses unless the requests are accompanied by entry cards. An entry card alone is not sufficient. The course and schedule line number

(SLN on entry card) must also be requested on the mark-sense registration form. Obtain course entry cards for courses designated with the symbol > > > in the margin of the *Time Schedule*. Refer to the Entry Card Distribution Points list for information on where to obtain the entry card for a given course.

### SUBMITTING REGISTRATION FORM

1. If you are a continuing student registering during the preregistration period, you may deposit your form at any of the following places:

- a. Registration lobby, second floor, Schmitz Hall
- b. B10 Padelford Hall
- c. Fourth floor student lounge, T-wing, Health Sciences Building
- d. 353 Loew Hall (engineering students only)

See the cover of the *Time Schedule* for registration dates.

2. If you are a new or returning student participating in preregistration, you must deposit your form at Schmitz Hall.

3. If you are a continuing student who did not preregister, you must obtain an in-person registration appointment from the Registration Appointment Office, Window 8, second floor, Schmitz Hall. Appointments are available beginning May 15 and should be obtained before June 8. Students registering after June 13 must pay a \$15 late registration fee.

4. If you are registering during the in-person registration period, go to the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library, on the date and time indicated on your registration appointment. Engineering students go to 353 Loew Hall.

### LATE REGISTRATION

Students who register after June 13 will be charged a \$15 late registration fee. See *Summer Quarter Bulletin* for additional information.

### SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

1. If you are a preregistrant, your schedule of classes will be mailed on June 2 to the address you indicate on the registration form. All preregistrants are scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), juniors, sophomores, and nonmatriculated students.

2. If you register during the in-person period you will be scheduled manually and will be given a copy of your completed program when you have finished registering. Be prepared to pay fees when registering during this period.

### DROPPING AND ADDING COURSES

All changes to a student's program should be completed during the official change periods (see calendar). Changes are made by appointment only. Appointments are available, beginning June 1, at Window 2, Schmitz Hall. Change of program (drop/add) requests are also available there or at advisory offices. Engineering majors go to 353 Loew Hall. A student who arrives more than a half-hour late will be required to make a new appointment. Changes made after the change periods cost \$5 and may result in fee forfeiture (see item 2 of this section).

The official change period takes place during the first week of the quarter for term *a* and full-quarter courses, and the first week of term *b* for term *b* only courses. After the official change period, a service charge of \$5 will be assessed for any number of changes that are made to a program at the same time.

Credit changes in variable credit courses and changes to or from S/NS grading may be accomplished without change appointments during the change periods. Changes to or from S/NS (Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory) grading must be made during the official change periods.

Undergraduates in the College of Arts and Sci-

ences must have the Dean's permission to carry more than 20 credits.

### 1. Grades in Dropped Courses and Drop Restrictions

After the Official Change Period, courses may be dropped under the following conditions:

#### Full-Quarter courses

a. Dropped courses will not be entered on the student's record—through June 30.

b. Dropped courses will be entered on the student's record with a grade of W—July 3–14 (graduate students: July 3–August 4).

c. Undergraduate student deadline to drop full-quarter courses—July 14.

d. Graduate student deadline to drop full-quarter courses—August 4.

#### Term *a* courses

a. Dropped courses will not be entered on the student's record—through June 23.

b. Dropped courses will be entered on the student's record with a grade of W—June 26–30 (for both undergraduate and graduate students).

c. Undergraduate student deadline to drop term *a* courses—June 30.

d. Graduate student deadline to drop term *a* courses—June 30.

#### Term *b* courses

a. Dropped courses will not be entered on the student's record—through July 26.

b. Dropped courses will be entered on the student's record with a grade of W—July 27–August 2 (graduate students: July 27–August 4).

c. Undergraduate student deadline to drop term *b* courses—August 2.

d. Graduate student deadline to drop term *b* courses—August 4.

Undergraduate students may make a limited number of drops after the aforementioned deadlines. The number of late drops permitted depends upon the number of academic credits the student has completed at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, the student has three drops permitted after the deadline, but before the last day of instruction. After 45 credits have been completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. All but the first three late drops may be accumulated and used as necessary. The first three late drops must be used prior to earning 45 credits or they are forfeited. *No drops of any kind are permitted after the last day of instruction.*

Graduate students do not earn late drops but may drop courses only until the date specified.

Any student may petition the Registrar to drop a course after the regular drop deadline if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question due to a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual and extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the regular drop deadline. Petitions must be filed promptly after the occurrence of the event that gave rise to the need for dropping.

### 2. Fee Forfeitures or Refunds

Students who drop one or more courses may qualify for a lower level of fees, depending on the number of credits he or she continues to carry and when the change was made. Students who drop full-quarter and term *a* courses June 19–23 will receive a full refund of fee differential; students who drop full-quarter and term *a* courses June 26–30 will receive a half refund of fee differential. Students who drop term *b* courses June 19–July 26 will receive a full refund of fee differential; students who drop term *b* courses July 27–August 2 will receive a half refund of fee differential. After these final dates, there is no reduction in the amount of tuition and fees owed.

Dropped courses become effective the date received in Sections.

### 3. Courses Added After the Official Change Periods

The instructor's signature is required for adding a full-quarter course after June 23; a term *a* course after June 20; a term *b* course after July 21. The dean's signature is also required to add a full-quarter course after June 30, a term *a* course after June 23; a term *b* course after July 26.

Courses audited may not be changed to a credit registration after June 30 for full-quarter courses; after June 23 for term *a* courses; and after July 26 for term *b* courses.

### FEE PAYMENT

1. If you preregister, you will be billed for tuition and fees based on the number of credits on your program at the end of the first week of the quarter, including courses added or dropped through June 23. The fee statement will be mailed on June 26 to the address you indicate on your mark-sense registration form. Payment is due at the Student Accounts Office on or before July 6 and should be mailed in the envelope provided for fee payment purposes. There is no late payment period.

If payment is not received by July 6, your registration will be cancelled. *Even if your registration is cancelled, you are obligated for one-half your tuition and fees unless you have officially withdrawn from your summer classes.*

2. If you register In-person, you must pay full fees when you register. Registration will not be completed without fee payment. If you add a course during the June 19-23 Official Change Period, you will be billed for any increase in fees or you may pay the difference in fees at the time the change is made. If you drop a course during this change period, a refund, if appropriate, will be mailed to the address provided on your mark-sense registration form.

3. If you have a scholarship or a grant, or will be receiving educational aid, you must pay the required fees if the notice of award is not on file at the Scholarship and Loan Fiscal Office.

### CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If you change your address after you have turned in your mark-sense registration form, be sure to complete a change of address form at the Registration Office. Forms are available at Window 3, 2nd floor of Schmitz. *You are responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office of any address change.*

### STUDENT INSURANCE

All students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish student insurance, will automatically be enrolled and billed for student only medical, surgical, and hospital insurance. Forms are provided at the registration area.

If you are billed for student insurance and decide that you do not want coverage, you may void the policy by completing the appropriate section on the fee payment card and by paying the amount billed less the indicated amount for insurance.

International students must carry student insurance. The International Services Office may waive the UW insurance requirement if the student subscribes to another adequate insurance plan. Obtain the insurance waiver card first because it has to be presented when you register and pay fees.

### WASHPIRG

An optional \$2 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the required fee. If you want to support WASHPIRG, check the payment card and pay the required fee plus \$2.

### GRADING SYSTEM

The University of Washington uses a numerical grading system with certain exceptions in the Schools of Dentistry, Law, and Medicine. Instructors report passing grades from 4.0 to 0.7 in .1 increments. The number 0.0 assigned for failing work or unofficial withdrawal. Numerical grades may be considered equivalent to letter grades as follows:

### The Grade of Incomplete

In order to obtain credit for a course in which an Incomplete has been awarded, an undergraduate student must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the following quarter. An Incomplete grade for a Summer Quarter course must be made up by the last day of Autumn Quarter or the Incomplete will be converted to a grade of 0.0 by the Registrar, unless the instructor has indicated when assigning the Incomplete grade that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. This time limitation may be extended up to one year with instructor approval. Such approval must be received by the Registrar's Office before the end of the next quarter.

A graduate student who receives an Incomplete must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the next quarter *in residence*. An Incomplete received by a graduate student does not automatically convert to 0.0 but remains an Incomplete if the coursework is not completed. This time limitation may be waived by the dean of the college in which the course was offered only if the nature of the uncompleted work is such as to make the fulfillment of this requirement impossible. In no case can an Incomplete received by a graduate student be converted to a passing grade after a lapse of two years. The Incomplete grade entry remains on the record permanently. When the final grade is received, a diagonal line is drawn through the Incomplete grade and

the final grade is posted under the quarter in which the final grade is received.

#### **Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory**

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis. Advisers should be consulted and in no case are students allowed to register for more than one course or 6 credits on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter. No more than 25 credits will apply to an undergraduate degree. **S/NS must be elected or dropped during the official change of program period.** Undergraduate students earning grades of 1.7 or above receive a grade of S(Satisfactory) while grades below 1.7 are recorded as NS(Not Satisfactory). Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S(Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are NS(Not Satisfactory). In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS are included in the grade-point average. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar. With the approval of his or her Graduate Program Adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairman, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on the Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory system.

#### **Credit/No Credit-Only Courses**

Some courses are offered on a CR/NC only basis. These courses may be taken only on this basis and it is not necessary to be in the special Credit/No Credit program to take these courses. It is not necessary to register S/NS to take these courses as the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

#### **Credit/No Credit Program**

The University offers an undergraduate grading option called Credit/No Credit. Students entering this program automatically take all courses on a CR/NC basis. This program is not applicable to certain degrees and advisers should be consulted. Students must enter and exit the CR/NC program no later than the last day of the change of program period for the quarter the change is to be effective. Further information is available at the Grade Information Window, 248 Schmitz.

#### **WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY**

1. To withdraw from all your Summer Quarter classes, obtain a withdrawal form from the Withdrawal Office, 264 Schmitz, or from your advisory office. Some colleges and schools require adviser approval to withdraw from classes, but most students (including students in the College of Arts and Sciences and all nonmatriculated students) may withdraw in person or by writing directly to the Withdrawal Office.

2. *If you preregister and subsequently withdraw from your summer classes, you must withdraw officially from Summer Quarter or you will be obligated for one-half your tuition and fees. This obligation is not changed by the automatic cancellation of your registration for nonpayment of fees by the July 6 deadline.*

3. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz Hall. *Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Withdrawal Office.* Fee refunds (or fees owed by preregistrants) will be based on the date with withdrawal is received in the Withdrawal Office.

The following fee schedule will be followed:

#### **Full-quarter or term a-only registration**

a. Withdrawal *before* the sixth class day of the quarter (before June 26): In-person registrants receive full refund; preregistrants owe no tuition and fees.

b. Withdrawal on the sixth class day through the tenth class day of the quarter (June 26–30): In-person registrants receive half refund; preregistrants owe one-half their tuition and fees.

c. Withdrawal after the tenth class day of the quarter (June 30): In-person registrants receive no refund; preregistrants owe full tuition and fees.

d. Preregistrants whose registration is cancelled for nonpayment of fees will continue to owe the University one-half their tuition and fees.

#### **Term b-only registration**

a. Withdrawal *before* the sixth class day of the term (before July 27): Students receive full refund.

b. Withdrawal on the sixth class day through the tenth class day of the term (July 27–August 2): Students receive half refund.

c. Withdrawal after the tenth class day of the term (August 2): Students receive no refund.

d. Term b-only preregistrants who did not pay their tuition and fees by the stated deadline (July 6) had their registration automatically cancelled. Because this date occurs before the official withdrawal period for term b-only registration, these students are not obligated for one-half their tuition and fees.

4. Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal on time because of extenuating circumstances may petition the Comptroller's Office. Petition forms are available at the Student Accounts Office, 129 Schmitz Hall.

5. If you have been accepted for Summer-Autumn, withdrawal from Summer Quarter *on or after June 19* does not affect your Autumn Quarter status. Withdrawal must, however, be official to guarantee Autumn Quarter space. Withdrawal from Summer Quarter *prior to June 19* invalidates summer registration and a new application for Autumn Quarter is required.

6. Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed by June 30 for full quarter registration and by June 23 and July 26 for term *a* and term *b* registration, respectively, receive no grade and no entry. Withdrawals after these dates result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W".

# SUMMER QUARTER 1978 CALENDAR

## *Registration Period* May 8-12

Preregistration for all matriculated and nonmatriculated students in school Spring Quarter and for new and returning students notified of preregistration eligibility.

**May 15**

In-person registration appointments available at Window 8, second floor of Schmitz, for continuing students who missed preregistration.

**May 16**

Registration authorization available on or after May 16 for new and returning students who missed the admission closing date. New students apply in person at the Office of Admissions, 320 Schmitz Hall. Former students apply in person at the Registration Office, second floor of Schmitz. Late applicant registration is scheduled for June 14. All fees, including the \$15 late fee, due at the time of registration.

**June 1**

Change of registration appointments for the June 19-23 change period available at Window 2 or 3, second floor of Schmitz (engineering majors do not need appointments and go to 353 Loew).

**June 2**

Programs of study mailed to summer preregistrants.

**June 8, 9, 12, 13**

In-person registration (by appointment only). Fee payment due at the time of registration.

**June 14**

In-person registration for new and returning students who missed the regular application closing dates. All fees, including the \$15 late fee, due at the time of registration.

**June 19-23**

Official change of registration period (by appointment only). Changes made after these dates cost \$5 for any number of changes made at the same time (extends through July 26 for term *b* courses).

**June 26**

Fee statements mailed to summer preregistrants.

**June 30**

Last day to drop a course without entry on permanent record for full quarter courses.

**July 6**

Fee payment deadline for summer preregistrants.

**July 26**

Last day to change a *b* term course without change fee.

## *Academic Period* June 12, Monday

School of Law instruction begins.

**June 19, Monday**

Instruction begins

**June 26, Monday**

School of Dentistry instruction begins.

**June 30, Friday**

Last day to return approved applications to 207 Schmitz for credit by examination in term *a* courses.

**July 4, Tuesday**

Independence Day holiday.

**July 7, Friday**

Applications for bachelor's degrees and certificates to be conferred Summer Quarter 1978 must be submitted to the Graduation Office, 207 Schmitz.

**Fourth week of *a* term**

Credit by examination. Students must make arrangements with the Educational Assessment Center, 543-1170.
