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# GENERAL INFORMATION

It is the University's expectation that a student will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the *General Catalog*. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and the student is persuaded that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, he or she may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which he or she is enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer the student to the proper office for a decision.

## GUARANTEED REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

University of Washington students who remain in good scholastic standing are assured the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (Summer Quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate, etc. Once a student earns a bachelor's degree, he or she must apply for readmission as a postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to this general policy are: (1) students under disciplinary action, (2) students with a financial hold, and (3) students who do not meet their major department's continuation policy.

If an undergraduate does not enroll for one or more quarters, or if a graduate student goes on-leave, he or she must file an application for readmission with the Registrar's Office. Information on admission closing dates is available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall, or by calling 543-5920.

## FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT

Many students think that because they pay full fees they are considered full-time students. This is incorrect. To be considered a full-time student, undergraduates must register for 12 credits and graduates must register for 9 credits. The full-time registration requirement varies for certain agencies, such as Immigration and Naturalization Service, Veterans Administration, and Social Security Administration. Consult the Registrar's Office for Social Security requirements, the International Services Office for immigration requirements, and the Veterans Affairs Office for VA benefits.

## NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS

Nonmatriculated students may register only on the in-person registration day designated for nonmatrics. Enrollment is on a space-available basis. Because nonmatriculated students register after all other students, enrollment may be closed in the following areas: mathematics, English composition, beginning foreign languages (particularly French and Spanish), business, and art. Nonmatriculated students may participate in preregistration for the Summer Quarter.

## TUITION-EXEMPT FACULTY/STAFF

Regularly admitted full-time faculty and staff members who have been employed six months or more may take up to 6 credits per quarter, under the tuition exemption program, with the approval of their department head. According to legislative action, all registrations must be on a space-available basis after other stu-

dents have registered. Members of the faculty and staff who wish to utilize the exemption may not preregister; registration may occur no earlier than the last day of the registration period. Faculty/staff who register before the last day will not be eligible to use a tuition exemption that quarter. Registration appointments are not required. Instead, employees should present their approved tuition exemption cards at Sections, Odegaard Undergraduate Library, according to the schedule listed below. A \$5 registration fee will be collected. This alphabetical priority will change each quarter.

Tuition exempt faculty/staff are not entitled to other student services such as Hall Health Center and Intramural Building. Therefore, UW student cards will not be issued to faculty and staff. Faculty/staff I.D. cards may be used for library services.

## AUDITORS

Auditors pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course.

Attendance in courses as an auditor is by consent of the instructor involved and is conditioned by the extent to which space is available. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. An auditor may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work, and his or her registration may be canceled at the discretion of the instructor.

No entry is made on the permanent record for courses audited. To receive credit for an audited course, the student must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors follow registration instructions below.

## PHYSICALLY DISABLED STUDENTS

Various support services, including priority registration, are available to students with physical disabilities. Contact Phyllis Bolt Bannister, Counselor/Program Coordinator for Disabled Students, 468 Schmitz Hall, 543-8924, for information on equipment, technical aids, and accommodations to meet individual needs. # REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

## ACADEMIC ADVISER

See an academic adviser to discuss your educational objectives and to learn the procedures involved in registering at the University. Have an idea of the courses you would like to take before seeing an adviser by reviewing the *General Catalog* and the quarterly *Time Schedule*. Nonmatriculated students enrolled primarily in evening classes may see an academic adviser through the Continuing Education Credit Class Office, 209 Lewis Hall, 8:30-10 a.m. and 3-7 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Friday hours are 8:30-10 a.m. and 3-5 p.m.

## REGISTRATION FORMS

Obtain a mark-sense registration form from your advisory office and mark the courses you are requesting on the form in accordance with directions on the form. Please note that some courses in the *Time Schedule* have restricted enrollment and you must obtain entry cards for these courses. Undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter. This is done to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

## ENTRY CARDS

Certain courses and sections require entry cards for registration. Students who request these courses (and/or sections) on their registration request forms will not be registered in the courses unless the requests are accompanied by entry cards. An entry card alone is not sufficient. The course and schedule line number (SLN on entry card) must also be requested on the mark-sense registration form. Obtain course entry cards for courses designated with the symbol >>> in the margin of the *Time Schedule*. Refer to the Entry Card Distribution Points list for information on where to obtain the entry card for a given course.

## SUBMITTING REGISTRATION FORM

1. If you are a continuing matriculated student registering November 9-21, you may deposit your form at any of the following places:

2. If you are a continuing matriculated student who did not preregister, you must obtain an in-person registration appointment by December 19. Continuing students who request in-person registration appointments after December 19 may be required to register late during the first week of school and to pay the \$15 late registration fee.

3. If you are registering December 17-19, go to the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library, on the date and time indicated on your registration appointment.

4. Nonmatriculated students may register only on December 19. Appointments are available at Window 8, second floor, Schmitz Hall.

5. Tuition-exempt faculty/staff register only December 20. See page iii for instructions.

**LATE REGISTRATION**

Students who register after the official registration period will be charged a \$15 late registration fee.

**SCHEDULE OF CLASSES**

1. If you register November 9, 13-16, 19-21, your schedule of classes will be mailed to the address you indicate on the registration form. All students registering during this period are scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), juniors, and sophomores. Schedules will be mailed December 10.

2. If you register December 17-20, your courses will be scheduled manually and you will be given a copy of your completed program when you have finished registering.

**REGISTRATION CHANGES**

**1. Change Appointments and Late Fees.**

a) All changes to a student's program should be completed during the official change periods (see calendar). Changes are made by appointment only. Appointments are available at Window 3, second floor lobby, Schmitz Hall, for all but engineering students; engineering students go to 353 Loew Hall. A student who arrives more than a half-hour late will be required to make a new appointment. Changes made after the change periods cost \$5 and may result in fee forfeiture (see item 3 of this section).

b) Students will be expected to present Winter Quarter 1980 University of Washington student I.D. cards when requesting appointments. Faculty/staff must present I.D. staff cards and a copy of their class schedule. No more than one change appointment will be issued to a student at a time. Additional change appointments will be issued only after the initially assigned appointment has been used or has expired.

**2. Grades in Dropped Courses and Drop Restrictions.**

a) *Undergraduates.* Undergraduate students who drop courses after the change periods receive no entry on their academic record if the drop is made during the first two weeks of the quarter. Drops made during the third and fourth weeks of the quarter will be recorded with a "W." No drops are permitted after the fourth week except for a limited number determined by the number of credits earned at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, the student has three drops permitted after the fourth week, but before the last day of instruction. After 45 credits have been completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. All but the first three late drops may be accumulated and used as necessary. The first three late drops must be used prior to earning 45 credits or they are forfeited. *No drops of any kind are permitted after the last day of instruction.*

b) *Graduate Students.* Graduate students who drop courses after the first two weeks of the quarter receive a grade of "W." No drops are permitted after the seventh week of instruction.

c) Students may petition the Registrar to drop a course after the regular drop deadline if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the regular drop deadline. Petitions must be filed promptly after the occurrence of the event that gave rise to the need for dropping the course.

**3. Fee Forfeiture or Refunds.**

a) Students will be billed for the number of credits on their programs at the end of the first week of the quarter. Only partial fee reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter.

b) Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition and fees associated with that course. Example: An undergraduate originally registered for 5 credits. The fee for 5 credits is \$114 (resident). The student then drops a 3-credit course in the second week of the quarter. The total number of credits for which the student remains registered is 2. Tuition and fees for 2 credits are \$45. However, additional fees are due for half the difference between 5 credits and 2 credits, in this case an additional \$34.50. The student has been registered in the dropped course for more than one week and therefore must pay half the fees for the course.

Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund. Example: A student is registered for a 3-credit course. The student drops that course after the thirtieth calendar day. No refund is available. If the student adds a different 3-credit course at the time the original 3-credit course is dropped, he or she will pay tuition and fees for 6 credits.

c) Drops become effective the date received in Sections.

**4. Courses Added After the Official Change Periods.**

a) As a general rule, no courses may be added after the official change period. Exceptional cases may be approved if both the instructor of the course and the dean of the student's college give their consent.

b) Courses audited may not be changed to a credit registration after the first two weeks of the quarter.

**FEE PAYMENT**

1. A fee statement will be mailed to the address you indicate on your mark-sense registration form.

2. Mail your fee payment to the Student Accounts Office in the envelope provided before the due date indicated. *Fees must be paid by Friday of the fourth week of the quarter (February 1, 1980).*

3. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your fees, with a \$15 late fee, for three weeks following the due date. If fees are not paid by this time your registration will be canceled. Students permitted to reregister after cancellation for non-payment will be charged a \$50 fee. *Please note: Even if your registration is canceled you will continue to owe one-half your tuition and fees if you are a continuing student or, if you are a new or returning student, \$50 or one-half your tuition and fees, whichever is greater.*

**CHANGE OF ADDRESS**

If you change your address after you have turned in your mark-sense registration form, be sure to complete a change of address form at the Registration Office. Forms are available at Window 3, second floor of Schmitz. *You are responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office of any address change.*

**STUDENT INSURANCE**

All students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish

student insurance will automatically be enrolled and billed for *student only* medical, surgical, and hospital insurance.

If you are billed for student insurance and wish to cancel your coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance copy of the billing statement and pay the amount billed less the indicated amount for insurance.

International students must subscribe to the University's medical insurance. Exceptions may be granted by the International Services Office if the student presents proof of other medical insurance coverage.

#### WASHPIRG

An optional \$2 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the regular tuition and fees. If you want to support WASHPIRG, check the payment card and pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$2.

#### WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY (DROPPING ALL COURSES FOR THE QUARTER)

1. Obtain an approved withdrawal form from your adviser.
2. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz Hall. *Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Registrar's Office.* Fees owed will be based upon the date the withdrawal is received in the Registrar's Office. No withdrawals will be accepted after the last day of instruction, March 14.

The fee schedule below will be followed.

#### Continuing Students

a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition or fees.

b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition and fees.

c. Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund of tuition or fees.

#### New and Returning Students

a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.

b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter must pay one-half of regular tuition and fees or forfeit the \$50 enrollment service charge, whichever is greater.

c. Students who withdraw officially after the thirtieth calendar day must pay full tuition and fees, which includes the \$50 enrollment service fee.

3. Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal in time may petition the Comptroller's Office for additional refund. Petition forms are available at the Student Accounts Office, 129 Schmitz Hall.

4. Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed during the first two weeks of a quarter receive no grade and no entry. Withdrawals completed after the first two weeks result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W."

#### GRADING SYSTEM

The University of Washington uses a numerical grading system, with certain exceptions in the schools of Dentistry, Law, and Medicine. Instructors may report passing grades from 4.0 to 0.7 in 0.1 increments. The number 0.0 is assigned for failing work or unofficial withdrawal. Grades in the range 0.6 to 0.1 may not be assigned. Grades reported in this range will be converted by the Registrar's Office to 0.0. Numerical grades may be considered equivalent to letter grades as follows:

#### The Grade of Incomplete

In order to obtain credit for a course in which an Incomplete has been awarded, an undergraduate student must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the following quarter. An Incomplete grade for a Winter Quarter course must be made up by the last day of Spring Quarter or the Incomplete will be converted to a grade of 0.0 by the Registrar, unless the instructor has indicated when assigning the Incomplete grade that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. This time limitation may be extended up to one year with instructor approval. Such approval must be received by the Registrar's Office before the end of the next quarter.

A graduate student who receives an Incomplete must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the next quarter *in residence*. An Incomplete received by a graduate student does not automatically convert to 0.0 but remains an Incomplete if the course work is not completed. This time limitation may be waived by the dean of the college in which the course was offered only if the nature of the uncompleted work is such as to make the fulfillment of this requirement impossible. In no case can an Incomplete received by a graduate student be converted to a passing grade after a lapse of two years. The Incomplete grade entry remains on the record permanently. When the final grade is received it is recorded as an incomplete removal grade and is entered under the quarter in which it is received.

#### Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis. Advisers should be consulted, and in no case are students allowed to register for more than one course or 6 credits on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter. No more than 25 credits will apply to an undergraduate degree. **S/NS must be elected or dropped during the official change of program period.** Undergraduate students earning grades of 1.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory) while grades below 1.7 are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are NS (Not Satisfactory). In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS is included in the grade-point average. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar. With the approval of his or her Graduate Program Adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairman, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on the Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory system.

### Credit/No Credit-Only Courses

Some courses are offered on a CR/NC-only basis. These courses may be taken only on this basis and it is not necessary to be in the special Credit/No Credit program to take these courses. It is not necessary to register S/NS to take these courses as the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC are included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

### Credit/No Credit Program

The University offers an undergraduate grading option called Credit/No Credit. Students entering this program automatically take all courses on a CR/NC basis. This program is not applicable to certain degrees and advisers should be consulted. Students must enter and exit the CR/NC program no later than the last day of the change of program period for the quarter the change is to be effective. Further information is available at the Grade Information Window, 248 Schmitz.

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION FOR NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS, by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (use cafeteria entrance).

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION FOR TUITION-EXEMPT FACULTY/STAFF at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (use cafeteria entrance). See *Time Schedule* for appointment times which are assigned according to last name.

OFFICIAL CHANGE OF REGISTRATION PERIOD by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (engineering majors at 353 Loew) for all students.

Deadline for: (1) changes to or from S/NS grading or CR/NC program; (2) adding a course without instructor's permission; (3) adding or dropping a course without being assessed a \$5 change fee. Courses dropped after this date will be included in the tuition calculation (see refund schedule on page iv). A service fee of \$5 will be assessed after this date.

Last day for official withdrawal from the University without owing tuition or fees.

Last day to drop a course without entry on permanent record.

Last day to add a course without dean's permission. (Arts and Sciences students do not need permission of the dean to add a class at any time during the quarter.)

Fee statements mailed to all registered students.

Last day for undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), or nonmatriculated students to drop a course.

Fee payment deadline for all registered students.

Last day for graduate students to drop a course.

Instruction begins.

Last day to return approved applications to 207 Schmitz for credit by examination.

Final examination should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule.

The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed.

1. With the dean's permission, the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for changing the date of a final examination.

2. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.

3. A student absent from any examination, or other required class activity, either by permission of the dean or through sickness or other unavoidable cause, shall be given an opportunity to complete the required work, or its equivalent, at some other time. If

the instructor determines this is not feasible during the current quarter, the instructor shall exempt the student from the requirement or give the student a grade of Incomplete if his or her work in the course is otherwise satisfactory. The student may remove this Incomplete in the manner provided for the removal of Incomplete grades. In all other cases of absence from the scheduled final examination, a student should be given a grade of 0.0.

4. Classes that meet on the hour use the first full hour of instruction to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that meets at 10 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.

5. Classes that begin on the half hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the exam time. For example, a class that meets at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9 a.m. would use the 7:30 time.

6. Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may use that room at 8:30 or 2:30 for a three-hour examination. All other exams are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.

7. If an examination is held at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure that the room is going to be available.

# NEW COURSES FOR WINTER QUARTER 1980

## COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

### AMERICAN INDIAN STUDIES

#### AIS 215 Puget Sound Indian Literature in English (3)

Traditional and modern stories, life and tribal histories from various Indian groups of the Puget Sound area, including Tulalip, Swinomish, Skagit, Snohomish, Duwamish, Muckleshoot.

### ANTHROPOLOGY

#### ANTH 458 Cross-Cultural Perspectives on Textiles and Costumes (3)

Offered jointly with TSCS 458. See TSCS 458 for course description and prerequisites.

#### ANTH 486 Human Family Systems: Biological and Social Aspects (3)

Offered jointly with SOC 486. See SOC 486 for course description and prerequisites.

### ART

#### Art

#### ART 230 Introductory Photography I (3)

Introduction to the basic theory, techniques, and processes of still photography. Emphasis on camera, film, and exposure. Student must provide camera with lens, shutter, and aperture controls. Prerequisite: art majors only or permission.

#### ART 231 Introductory Photography II (3)

Introduction to basic black and white darkroom procedures, equipment and techniques. Emphasis on both darkroom printing and the camera. Student must provide camera with lens, shutter, and aperture controls. Prerequisite: 230 or permission.

#### ART 246 Images on Paper (5, max. 10)

Combines traditional printmaking with drawing and painting. Experimental in nature. Involves working with various media and translating an image from one medium to another, understanding and dealing with the unique characteristics of each medium. Prerequisites: 107 and 110.

#### Art History

#### ART H 200 Ideas in Art (5)

Selected monuments of art and architecture in the western tradition, from the Greeks to the twentieth century, studied in relation to the intellectual background of the ages and civilizations that produced them. Slide lectures accompanied by discussion of assigned readings in philosophical, religious, scientific, political, literary, and artistic texts.

#### ART H 428 East Asian Calligraphy (3, max. 9)

Classical calligraphy tradition of China and Japan in history and practice. Prerequisite: permission of undergraduate advisor.

#### ART H 491 Aesthetics of Modern Architecture (3)

Focuses on 20th century aesthetic issues; artistic aims and accomplishments of particular individuals, e.g., Wright, Mies, Kahn, Ph. Johnson, effect of their art on trends in architecture, and conflicts which occur when artistic sensibilities of the individual are at odds with those of the public that the architect must please. Prerequisite: Upper division standing.

#### Hindi

#### HINDI 312 Elementary Hindi (5)

Formerly HD UR 202 Elementary Hindi-Urdu. See General Catalog for course description.

#### HINDI 322 Intermediate Hindi (5)

Formerly HD UR 302 Intermediate Hindi. See General Catalog for course description.

#### HINDI 502 Studies in Hindi (3)

Formerly HD UR 502. See General Catalog for course description.

#### Japanese

#### JAPAN 332 Intensive Second-Year Japanese (15)

Formerly JAPAN 232. See General Catalog for course description.

#### JAPAN 462 Advanced Japanese Readings (3)

Directed readings and translation of modern Japanese prose selections in fields reflecting interests of students related to language, linguistics, and the social sciences. Prerequisite: 313 or equivalent or permission.

#### JAPAN 540 Seminar on Japanese Linguistics (3, max. 9)

Problems in the history and structure of the Japanese language. Topics vary each quarter, according to the interests and needs of the students. Prerequisites: 405 and 406, or permission.

#### Korean

#### KOR 302 Elementary Korean (5)

Introduction to the modern standard Korean spoken and written language.

#### Tamil

#### TAMIL 312 Elementary Tamil (5)

Formerly TAMIL 202. See TAMIL 202 in General Catalog for course description.

#### TAMIL 322 Intermediate Tamil (5)

Formerly TAMIL 302. See TAMIL 302 in General Catalog for course description.

#### Tibetan

#### TIB 305 Colloquial Tibetan (5)

Formerly TIB 202. See TIB 202 in General Catalog for course description.

## BIOLOGY

### BIOL 593 Instructional Methods in University Science Teaching (1)

Traditional and innovative methods in university science teaching: lecture method, use of media, discussion method, testing, individualized instruction and educational technology, inquiry methods and other innovations. Design of college science courses at different levels. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

## BLACK STUDIES

### BLK S 280 Creative Expression for African-American Children (5)

Explores new and developing theories and practices of creative expression for African-American children. Prerequisite: 200.

## CHEMISTRY

### CHEM 435 Introductory Biophysical Chemistry (3)

Survey of the statics and dynamics of biophysical chemical processes. Prerequisites: organic and physical chemistry.

## COMMUNICATIONS

### CMU 471 National Systems of Broadcasting (3)

Broadcast systems in countries throughout the world: origins, development, and present operations compared with the U. S. system. Each quarter the focus is on a certain national system. Consult Communications Advising office for schedule of offerings. Open to non-majors. Prerequisites: 150, 214, or permission.

### CMU 543 Seminar in Advertising in Society (3)

Directed reading and research on advertising as a social institution. Consideration of the interacting historical, social, economic, and legal influences shaping institutional character. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

## DANCE

### DANCE 108 Beginning Dance Techniques (3)

Team taught class in Ballet and Modern/Contemporary Dance Technique. Basic concepts and elements of each idiom taught by a teacher specializing in that idiom; the technique of both idioms taught with awareness of their relationships and their differences. Prerequisites: 107 for 108, or permission of instructor; 108 for 109, or permission of instructor.

### DANCE 250 Exploring the Articulate Body (3)

Basic body connections and joint articulations. Principles of dynamic body alignment, apatterning efficient lines of muscular use, weight initiation, connections from lower body support to upper body freedom. Based on the Bartenieff Fundamentals as developed by the Laban Institute of Movement. Prerequisites: permission of instructor and concurrent registration in a basic dance technique course.

### DANCE 254 Effort/Shape (3)

Laban's Effort/Shape concepts. What makes movement expressive, how to see movement textures clearly, how to broaden the dynamic range of one's movements. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

### DANCE 271 Choreographic Workshop (2, max. 6)

Logical extension of the basic dance techniques, folk-ethnic, and special techniques classes, in order to provide a performing experience for students enrolled in any of these classes. Prerequisite: enrollment in basic technique class, folk-ethnic or special techniques class.

### DANCE 322 Repertory (2)

Learning and performing pieces from professional dance repertoire, including reconstructions from notated scores. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

### DANCE 365 Dance Composition (2, max. 6)

Formerly DANCE 355. See DANCE 355 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

### DANCE 471 University of Washington Dance Theatre (3)

A performing company for advanced level students. Open only by audition and/or invitation of the Artistic Director. Maintains a seven hour a week rehearsal schedule with regularly scheduled performances during the academic year. Prerequisites: audition and permission of instructor.

## DRAMA

### DRAMA 330 Children's Theatre (3)

History, theory, and techniques of performance for children's theatre. Emphasis on play selection, critical analysis, and rehearsal procedures. Prerequisites: 230 and sophomore standing, or permission.

### DRAMA 337 Fundamentals of Creative Dramatics (3)

Introduction to concepts and principles of creative dramatics. Intensive personal involvement in activities and exercises which illuminate the foundations of learning through drama. Emphasis on sensory awareness, play theory, creativity, and playmaking through improvisation. Prerequisite: 230 or permission.

### DRAMA 434 Playwriting for Young Audiences (3)

Basic principles of dramatic structure and play construction with special attention to the demands of writing for young audiences. Adaptation of narrative material. Prerequisite: permission.

### DRAMA 535 Graduate Colloquium in Child Drama (1, max. 6)

Analysis, discussion, and critique of special studies, productions, research and thesis projects being done in the field of child drama by graduate students in the School of Drama. Prerequisite: graduate standing or permission.

## ECONOMICS

### ECON 483 Econometric Modeling (5)

Availability of Washington state economic statistics, processing techniques and econometric models. Build econometric models to meet stated assumptions in order to forecast regional economic variables. Offered on a CR/NC basis only. Prerequisites: 381, 482.

## ENGLISH

### ENGL 300 William Blake and the Romantic Age (5)

Romanticism as an intellectual and artistic movement with emphasis on the poetry and visual art of William Blake. Concerns the relationship of romanticism to modernism. Offered Winter quarter 1980 only.

### ENGL 502 Background of Modern Literature (5)

Intensive study of selected issues in considering modern literature, concentrating on a few influential English and American texts written after 1750.

### ENGL 556 Methods and Materials for Teaching English as a Second Language (5)

Analysis and exposure to second language teaching methodologies and development of a principled basis for choosing among them. Overview of teaching materials in English as a second language and techniques for adaptation of these to particular teaching situations. Prerequisite: LING 445 or permission.

### ENGL 585 Advanced Poetry Workshop (5)

Advanced seminar in the craft of poetry, with professional focus on the planning, writing, and revising of a publishable set of poems preliminary to the graduate thesis. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

## ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

### ENV S 532 Internship Seminar (3)

Post-internship seminar with focus on a detailed analytical paper concerning the role of science in analysis and decision making in the agency or firm in which the student served as an intern. Prerequisites: 530, 531.

## GENETICS

### GENET 463 Statistics for Genetics Research (3)

Statistical theory and applied statistics oriented towards applications in genetics. Discrete and continuous distributions, means, variances, transformation of variables, theory of estimation, hypothesis testing, tests on small samples, regression and correlation, analysis of variance. Offered alternate years. Prerequisites: graduate standing and permission.

## GEOGRAPHY

### GEOG-436 Geographical Exploration (5)

Comparative study of discoveries made by the world's great explorers and expeditions, their motivations, and the effect on geographical thought, relations between cultures, and the development of civilization. Prerequisite: 100 or permission.

## GERMANICS

### GERM 220 Conversational German for German House Students (1, max. 6)

Intensive conversational German for participants of German House only. Prerequisites: 103 or equivalent and permission.

## HISTORY

### History of the Americas

#### HSTAA 577 History of Canada (3-6)

Canadian historiography and bibliography from the foundation of New France to the present.

### Ancient and Medieval History, including Byzantine HSTAM 205 Military History of the Ancient World (5)

Military history from prehistoric times to the fall of the Roman Empire, with special emphasis on the Graeco-Roman period and the campaigns of Alexander the Great, Hannibal, Scipio Africanus, and Julius Caesar.

## HONORS--

### ARTS & SCIENCES

#### H A&S 200-- Humanistic Understanding and Human Culture (3-)

Study of a topic related to linguistic, artistic, or other humanistic activities as ways of knowing, methods of inquiry, and systems of cultural association and exchange. (Last time offered: Spring quarter, 1981)

#### H A&S -203 Empirical Thought and Human Culture (-3)

Study of a topic involving scientific modes of thought and inquiry as they are related to human culture. (Last time offered: Spring quarter, 1981)

## INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

### East Asia

#### SISEA 442 Political Economy of Postwar Japan (5)

Political and economic problems of Japan since 1945. Evaluates utility of competing theoretical approaches to analysis of government and economy of Japan. Focuses on policymaking processes and effects of policies adopted. Prerequisites: Some knowledge of postwar Japan desirable; 440 suggested.

### Russia and Eastern Europe

#### SISRE 246 Assent and Dissent in Eastern Europe (5)

Art and literature of assent and dissent as used to analyze changing political problems in Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia; Hungary, Poland, Romania and Yugoslavia.

### Religious Studies

#### RELIG 301 Religious Thought Since the Middle Ages (5)

Survey of the development of religious thought in the West from the Middle Ages to the twentieth century. History of focal ideas: God, man, knowledge, and authority during this period and the relation of changes in these ideas to the ways in which basic issues in religious thought have been conceived. Recommended: 201.

#### RELIG 313 Jewish Mystical Traditions: Kabbalah and Its Influence (5)

Study of Jewish esoteric thought from Rabbi Moses Cordovero. Emergence of Safed as a center of this thought. Systematic presentation of the thought of Isaac Luria. Immense influence of this thought in Jewish history through other movements--specifically the mystical messiah, Sabbetai Sevi, and the rise of Hasidism. Recommended background: 201 or 210.

**RELIG 326 Gnosticism and Early Christianity**  
(5)

Study of a form of religion that swept the Mediterranean world during the period of earliest Christianity and which had a major impact on the development of Christianity and several other religious groups of that period. Readings are primarily from Gnostic apocalypses, gospels, treatises, and other forms of literature, dating from the first through the third centuries A.D. Recommended background: 201 or 200, or HST 307.

**RELIG 450 Tibetan Buddhism** (3)

Formerly IASIA 464. See course description in General Catalog.

**KINESIOLOGY**

**KINPE 503 Seminar in Sport Administration**  
(1, max. 3)

Issues and problems in the management of sport programs and facilities. Prerequisite: permission.

**KINPE 504 Seminar in Sports Medicine** (1, max. 3)

Current practice methods in athletic training and/or exercise prescription for cardio-pulmonary conditioning. Prerequisite: permission.

**KINPE 595 Internship in Sport Administration**  
(3-6, max. 12)

Supervised field experience. Nine hours minimum, eighteen hours maximum per week. Open to graduate students in M.S. Physical Education Sport Administration option only. Prerequisites: concurrent registration in 503 and permission.

**KINPE 596 Internship in Sports Medicine** (3-6, max. 12)

Supervised field/clinical experience. Nine hours minimum, eighteen hours maximum per week. Open to graduate students in M.S. Physical Education Sports Medicine option only. Prerequisites: concurrent registration in 504 and permission.

**MATHEMATICS**

**MATH 239 Elements of Differential Equations** (3)

Continuation of 238. Laplace transforms, linear systems, stability theory. Prerequisites: 238, and either 205 or 303.

**MUSIC**

**MUSIC 161 American Musical Theater** (5)

Historical and stylistic study of the development of the American musical theater. European roots in opera and operetta. Contributions from Jazz and popular music. Selected musicals will be studied. Primarily for non-majors. 160 recommended.

**MUSIC 445 Selected Topics in Ethnomusicology**  
(3)

Deals with topics not covered by regular courses in Ethnomusicology. Frequently taught by visiting lecturers. See individual instructors about course content. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

**NEAR EAST LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE**

**Hebrew**

**HEBR 312 Modern Hebrew Literature** (3)

Based on 111-112, 113, Conversational Hebrew, this course extends into the areas of modern spoken and written Hebrew, newspaper reading, and modern poetry and prose. Prerequisites: 111-112, 113, or permission.

**Textile Science and Costume Studies**  
**TSCS 427 Advanced Textile Dyeing** (4)

Theory of dyeing. Classification of systems for the specification of color. Commercial and economic aspects of dyeing. Instrumental analysis of color. Spectrophotometric and colorimetric analysis of dye solutions and dyed fabrics. Interrelationships between dye affinity and diffusion and polymer structure. Prerequisites: 325, 327, and inorganic and organic chemistry.

**TSCS 458 Cross-Cultural Perspectives on Textiles and Costumes** (3)

Technological, economic, social, ideological, aesthetic, and communicative aspects of textiles and costume of non-Western societies, analyzed from perspectives derived from anthropology and other social sciences. Modifications in the design and use of textile products due to the impact of industrial society. Offered jointly with ANTH 458. Prerequisites: 10 credits in anthropology or sociology.

**TSCS 460 Practicum in Apparel Manufacturing**  
(2, max. 10)

Supervised observation and participation in apparel design industry. Prerequisites: 325, 334, 434, 436.

**TSCS 499 Individualized Study** (\*)

For undergraduate students. Registrant must have a form from the School of Nutritional Sciences and Textiles, endorsed by the faculty adviser most appropriate for the project proposed. Students are expected to complete a written report explaining the results of their investigations. Prerequisite: permission.

**OCEANOGRAPHY**

**OCEAN 526 Marine Organic Geochemistry** (2)

Sources, reactions, and fates of organic molecules in the marine environment along with the stable isotope geochemistry of marine organic substances. Prerequisites: 421, CHEM 231, 232, or permission.

**OCEAN 580 Marine Science for Coastal Zone Management** (3)

Analysis of coastal marine scientific knowledge for use in the decision-making process of coastal zone management. Lectures and discussion of the biological, chemical, geological, and physical oceanography of the coastal zone. Techniques of generating data bases and using them to describe natural processes. Importance of considering natural processes in management schemes. Not open to oceanography students except by permission. Prerequisite: IMS 503 or permission.

## PHILOSOPHY

### PHIL 105 Ideas in the Medieval and Renaissance Periods (5)

Introduction to major ideas in Christian, Jewish, and Islamic thought from late antiquity to the beginnings of the modern period. Content and emphasis vary.

### PHIL 206 Philosophy of Feminism (3)

Philosophical analysis of the concepts and assumptions central to feminism. Theoretical positions within the feminist movement; views of the ideal society, goals and strategies of the movement, its relation to racial liberation and ethical issues. Offered jointly with WOMEN 206. Not open to students who have taken GIS 106.

## PHYSICS

### PHYS 543 Models of Physical Processes (4)

Development of mathematical descriptions of physical processes and systems. Examples from dynamics, fluid mechanics, electromagnetic theory, and optics. Topics include diffusion, wave guides and cavities, dispersion, and normal modes of oscillation.

## POLITICAL SCIENCE

### POL S 305 The Politics of Mass Communication (5)

Mass audiences in politics from the standpoint of the communication strategies used to shape their political involvement. Social structure and political participation, political propaganda and persuasion, political uses of public opinion, and mass media and politics.

### POL S 424 International and European Regional Courts (5)

Survey and comparison of formal dispute settlement procedures among sovereign states, i.e., various ad hoc arbitration tribunals, the Permanent Court of Arbitration, the Central American Court of Justice, the two World Courts, the two major International Military Tribunals (war crime trials), the Court of Justice of the European Community (Common Market), the European Court of Human Rights, projects for other regional courts (Arab, Latin American, Commonwealth) and the role of courts in early federal systems (USA, Switzerland, Canada). Prerequisite: 423 or equivalent suggested.

### POL S 496 Undergraduate Internship (5, max. 15)

Restricted to students serving in approved internships. Only five credits may count toward the minimum fifty credits required for the political science major. Prerequisites: sophomore standing or above and permission of undergraduate advisor.

### POL S 498H Honors Senior Research (5, max. 10)

Students individually arrange for independent study of selected topics under the direction of a member of the political science faculty. The research paper is the student's senior thesis. Students meet periodically as a group to discuss research in progress. Prerequisites: 15 credits in 398, senior honors standing, and permission.

## POL S -593 Research Practicum II (-3)

Directed design and execution of a piece of empirical research over a two-quarter period. Weekly seminar meetings and reports. Prerequisites: advanced graduate standing, 490 or equivalent, and permission of instructor.

### POL S 597 College Teaching of Political Science (1)

Survey of approaches, methods, and problems associated with teaching political science at the college level. Offered on a CR/NC basis only. Prerequisite: appointment as a teaching assistant in the Department of Political Science.

## PSYCHOLOGY

### PSYCH 209 Fundamentals of Psychological Research (3)

Introduction to psychological research methodology and techniques. Topics include hypothesis testing, influence of paradigms, experimental design, techniques of scientific writing, research techniques, ethical issues in psychological research, bias and expectation problems. Requirement for psychology majors. Prerequisite: 101 or 102 or equivalent.

### PSYCH 413 Developmental Psychobiology (3)

Introduction to neural basis of behavioral development in normal and abnormal manifestations; survey of research used to examine the relationship between structure and function in the nervous system; survey of brain development and effects of prenatal and postnatal experiences on the brain and behavior. Prerequisite: 222, 421 or 422, or permission.

### PSYCH 536 Behavioral Assessment (4)

Research, theory, and technique in the field of behavioral assessment. Emphasis on assessing for change with attention to the relationship between assessment and therapy. Procedures include: interviewing, observational techniques, self-monitoring, simulated environments, and physiological, self-report, and imaginal procedures. Offered on CR/NC basis only. Prerequisites: clinical psychology graduate students only and permission.

### PSYCH 539 Interviewing and Case Formulation (2, max. 6)

Offered jointly with PBSCI 539. See PBSCI 539 for course description and prerequisite.

### PSYCH 575 The Family Process (3)

Overview of the structures, relationships, and interactions within the family. Follows a developmental sequence based on the human life cycle, with two or more generations in synchrony. Prerequisites: second-year graduate major standing in clinical psychology and permission. (Offered alternate years.)

### PSYCH 598 Advanced Clinical Practicum (4)

Supervised psychotherapy involving several individual clients. Separate consultations with supervising instructor for intensive supervision of each case. Occasional meetings in small groups of instructors and students to discuss case material. Assigned readings appropriate to each case with opportunities to discuss these with instructor. Prerequisites: clinical psychology graduate students only and permission.

## ROMANCE LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

### ROMAN 600 Independent Study or Research (\*)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

## SCANDINAVIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

### SCAND 260 Scandinavian Cinema (5)

Formerly SCAND 360. See SCAN. 360 in General Catalog for course description.

## SLAVIC LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

### RUSS 341 Growing Up Russian: Childhood and Adolescence in Russian Fiction (5)

Examination of the unique character of childhood and adolescent experience as a recurrent theme in the work of major nineteenth- and twentieth-century writers, including Tolstoy, Aksakov, Turgenev, Dostoevsky, Gorky, Bely. For non-majors only.

### RUSS 574 Russian Literature to 1800 (5)

Representative works of East Slavic, Muscovite and Russian literature from the beginnings to 1800. Intended as an introduction to the study of modern literature for beginning graduate students in Russian literature.

## SOCIETY AND JUSTICE

### SO JU 418 Basic Investigative Methods in Institutionalized Crime (5)

Investigative research by persons involved in law enforcement; consumer protection; regulatory, private security, and investigative work; journalism; para-legal work; public interest research. Covers the existence, nature, and location of information; problems of access and dissemination; practical techniques for acquiring, documenting, recording, and organizing information; an outline of basic legal concepts of evidence; and ethical and public policy considerations about investigations. Prerequisites: SOC 110, or POL S 101 or 202 or equivalent, or permission. (Last time offered: Winter, 1982)

### SO JU 440 Criminal Law and Procedure (4)

Substantive and procedural criminal law for lay persons; analysis of the philosophy behind the law, with an emphasis on due process in adult and juvenile courts; case-analysis teaching technique. Prerequisite: POL S 464 or SOC 372, or permission. (Last time offered: Winter, 1981)

## SOCIOLOGY

### SOC 340 Symbolic Interaction (5)

The role of language and culture in changing the human organism into a socialized human being; interpersonal processes and how they are shaped by the symbolic environment. Prerequisite: introductory course in social psychology.

### SOC 373 Social Factors in White Collar Crime (5)

Concept and etiology of white collar crime, its forms, costs, victims, and innovative developments. Prospects for theoretical explanations and social control. Prerequisite: 110, or POL S 101, 201, or permission.

## SOC 486 Human Family Systems: Biological and Social Aspects (3)

Survey of the biological bases for human mating and reproduction, and an examination of the range of cross-cultural variability in human systems of kinship and marriage; comparisons between a wide range of human and non-human species, and between Western and non-Western human societies; interplay of biological, ecological, and sociocultural factors determining the structure and function of human family systems. Offered jointly with ANTH 486. Prerequisite: 110 or ANTH 100 or 201.

## STATISTICS

### STAT 311 Elements of Statistical Method (5)

Elementary concepts of probability, binomial and normal distributions; basic concepts of hypotheses testing and estimation; application to binomial and normal distributions; chi-square tests; linear regression theory. For non-majors only. Prerequisite: MATH 105. (Formerly MATH 281.)

### STAT 341 Elementary Probability (3)

Sample space, random variables, laws of probability; combinatorial probabilities; distributions: binomial, normal; expectation, variance. Not intended for nonteaching majors in the sciences or those desiring more than one quarter of probability. Not open for credit to students who have taken 394. Prerequisite: MATH 126 or MATH 136 H. (Formerly MATH 391.)

### STAT 342 Elements of Statistics (3)

Basic concepts of testing hypotheses and of estimation (interval and point); binomial and normal tests and estimates. Not intended for nonteaching majors in the sciences. Prerequisite: 341. (Formerly MATH 392.)

### STAT 382, 383 Statistical Inference in Applied Research (5,5)

Analysis of variance and covariance; chi-square tests; multiple and curvilinear regression; sampling theory; discrete distribution; experimental design and power of tests. Application to biological problems. Use of computer programs in standard statistical problems. Offered jointly with Q SCI 382, 383. Prerequisites: 381, MATH 124 or Q SCI 291, or permission for 382; 382 for 383.

### STAT 473 Statistical Inference (3)

Introduction to sampling and general theory of statistical inference; general theory of estimation and hypothesis testing; multivariate theory and correlation. Prerequisite: 395 or 471 for 472; 472 and MATH 205 for 473. (Formerly MATH 482 and 483.)

### STAT 512 Statistical Inference (5)

Introduction to sampling and general theory of statistical inference; general theory of estimation and hypothesis testing; multivariate theory and correlation. Prerequisites: 395 or 511, and MATH 205. (Formerly MATH 482 and 483.)

### STAT 574 Statistical Computing (3)

Application of numerical methods to statistical problems; generation of pseudo random numbers, design and execution of Monte Carlo studies, comparative evaluation of statistical algorithms, matrix methods, computation of distribution functions. Offered jointly with B10ST 574. Prerequisites: 483 and programming, or permission of instructor.

STAT 582 Advanced Theory of Statistical Inference (3)

Limit theorems, asymptotic efficiency, maximum likelihood statistics; sufficient and ancillary statistics; elements of decision theory; Neyman-Pearson theory, uniformly most powerful unbiased and invariant tests; sequential analysis; distribution-free statistics; linear hypotheses. Prerequisites: 473 or 475 for 581; 581 for 582; 582 for 583. (Formerly MATH 581, 582, 583.)

STAT 592 Special Topics in Statistics (3)

Advanced probability theory, stochastic processes, distribution-free inference, game and decision theory, advanced theory of estimation (including sequential estimation), robustness. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

WOMEN STUDIES

WOMEN 206 Philosophy of Feminism (3)

Offered jointly with PHIL 206. See PHIL 206 for course description and prerequisites.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

ADMINISTRATIVE THEORY AND ORGANIZATIONAL BEHAVIOR

A ORG 420 Human Relations in Organizations (4)

Formerly A ORG 460. See A ORG 460 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

BUSINESS, GOVERNMENT AND SOCIETY

BG&S 523 Commercial Law (3)

Graduate business law, including selected topics in the law of contracts, agency, partnership, corporations, commercial paper, sales, securities regulation. Opportunities for guided, independent study of recent legal developments of special interest to individual students. Prerequisite: entry card.

FINANCE

FIN 530 Financial Management of Banks (3)

Analysis of problems in the financial management of commercial banks and other financial institutions. Loan and investment policies, liability management, capital policies, and selected other issues are discussed. Prerequisite: B ECN 520 or permission.

HUMAN RESOURCE SYSTEMS

HRSYS 510 Human Resource Management (3)

Focuses on critical policy and practice questions in the human resource area such as fair employment practices and policies toward labor organizations. Examines the personnel/industrial relations function from a general management perspective. Topics include selection and appraisal interviewing, discipline, and compensation. A case/experimental method is used to foster the development of skills in managing employee relations effectively. Recommended for students without previous courses in personnel and human resource systems. Prerequisite: permission.

HRSYS 560 Dispute Settlement in Labor Relations (3)

Examines from an interdisciplinary perspective, techniques like mediation and arbitration that are used to resolve disputes between labor and management; recent innovations such as last offer arbitration and mediation-arbitration formats; understanding and skills necessary to function as a neutral third party in labor relations disputes.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

I BUS 550 International Business Environment (3)

Emphasis on understanding the underlying economic, political, and social forces in the international business environment and assessing the impact of these forces on international trade and investment. Attention to theories of international trade, foreign investment, international monetary relations and economic integration, and national policy response to international market forces. May be taken first year of MBA program, preferably after student has had B ECN 500 and 501 or equivalent.

I BUS 560 Multinational Business Management (3)

Managerial responses to problem of international business organizations and operations. Emphasis on: (1) strategy formulation in an international context; (2) design and control of multinational organization; and (3) adaptation of management systems and policies to different economic, socio-cultural, and political environments. Prerequisite: 550 or equivalent or course in international economics or trade or international finance, or permission.

I BUS 570 International Business in Less Developed Countries (3)

Emphasis on understanding the economic, socio-cultural, and political environment in less developed countries. Problems of international trade and investment, North-South relations, commodities, technology transfer, foreign aid and capital flows. Prerequisites: 550 or equivalent and entry card; a course in international economics or trade or international finance, or permission.

SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY

DENTISTRY

DENT 460 Orthodontic Diagnosis (2)

Principles of orthodontic diagnosis and treatment planning for the pediatric patient.

PEDODONTICS

PEDO 491 Fieldwork in Applied Principles of Dental Care for the Disabled Child (2)

Formerly DENT 491. See DENT 491 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

RESTORATIVE DENTISTRY

RES D 424- Applied Dental Practice (1-)

Formerly DENT 420-. See DENT 420- in General Catalog for course description.

## COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

### EDUCATIONAL CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

#### EDC&I 457 Methods in Teaching English as a Second Language (3)

Prepares preservice and inservice teachers to teach English as a second language and to meet the educational and linguistic needs of students who have little or no English language skills. Emphasis on a survey of first and second language acquisition research and its educational implications, as well as instructional strategies consistent with the audio-lingual, cognitive, and creative construction approaches to second language learning. Includes diagnostic-prescriptive strategies for classroom application.

### HIGHER EDUCATION

#### EDHED 526 Higher Education and the Law (3)

The legal implications of University operations and an explanation of the legal and constitutional rights of students, faculty, and staff within the University. Special attention given to employment and termination decisions, student protections, and due process rights and University liabilities.

## COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

### AERONAUTICS AND ASTRONAUTICS

#### A A 476 Introduction to Design With Brittle Materials (3)

Offered jointly with CER E 476, CESM 476, and M E 476. See CER E 476 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

### CHEMICAL ENGINEERING

#### CH E 498 Special Topics in Chemical Engineering (1-4, max. 6)

Special topics in chemical engineering offered as a lecture and/or laboratory course. Prerequisite: permission.

### CIVIL ENGINEERING

#### Transportation, Construction and Geometronics Engineering CETC 400 Transportation Safety - Introduction Seminar (2)

Formerly CETC 500. See CETC 500 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

#### CETC 429 On-line Planning of Urban Systems (3)

Offered jointly with URB P 429. See URB P 429 for course description.

### OCEAN ENGINEERING

#### O ENG 580 Strain Measurements and Instrumentation (3)

Experimental determination of strain under static and dynamic loads; strain gauges; transducers for displacement velocity and acceleration; photo-elasticity, brittle coating and other methods; problems of instrumentation, data collection and analysis of data; use of modern I.C. electronic components and computers or microprocessors for data collection and analysis. Offered jointly with CESM 580. Prerequisite: graduate standing or permission.

## COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES

### MANAGEMENT AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

#### FOR M 450 Law Enforcement for Outdoor Recreation Professionals (2)

Burns  
Nature and methods of dealing with criminal conduct in recreational settings; survey of criminal laws and procedures; civil rights of citizens; rules and procedures for dealing with evidentiary material; role of recreation professional as a witness. Prerequisite: permission. (Offered alternate years.)

#### FOR M 576 Goal Programming (3)

The concepts and philosophy of goal programming as a tool in the evaluation of resource allocation among multiple, conflicting, often incommensurate objectives (goals). L. P. and G. P. computer programs are used to study impact of changes in relative importance of difficult goals. Goal programming applications in natural resource areas are discussed. Offered jointly with Q SCI 576. Prerequisites: familiarity with linear programming and permission.

## INTERDISCIPLINARY GRADUATE PROGRAMS

### APPLIED MATHEMATICS

#### AMATH 402 Analytical Methods in Engineering II (3)

The emphasis in these courses is on the acquisition of technique and experience in the application of those areas of mathematics commonly encountered in science and engineering. Techniques are illustrated by case studies drawn from a number of fields. Applications using advanced calculus, complex numbers, ordinary and partial differential equations, Laplace transforms, vectors and matrices, Fourier series, and probability and statistics are included. The course is appropriate for seniors and graduate students in engineering and science who require a survey of applied techniques but who are not prepared for, or who do not seek, advanced material at the 500-level. Prerequisites: MATH 238 or equivalent; also ENGR 401 for 402, 402 for 403. A knowledge of FORTRAN is desirable.

#### AMATH 501 Seminar in Applied Mathematics (1, max. 6)

Special topics and selected problems of current interest in applied mathematics. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

#### AMATH 563 Methods of Partial Differential Equations II (3)

First-order partial differential equations: characteristics, conservation laws, shocks, applications to geometrical optics and Hamilton-Jacobi theory. Elliptic equations: fundamental solution, Green's function, conformal mapping, boundary-value problems. Parabolic equations. Hyperbolic equations: characteristics, shocks, examples from fluid dynamics, approximate methods. Post-master's sequence. Offered jointly with AA 562, 563, 564. Prerequisite: 569. (Offered odd-numbered years.)

#### AMATH 568 Analysis in Engineering II (3)

Survey of properties and practical techniques for ordinary differential equations. Series expansions. Eigenvalue problems. Laplace transforms and applications. Variational methods. Asymptotic expansions. Perturbations, regular and singular. Difference equations. Numerical procedures. Offered jointly with A A 568. Recommended: 567.

**AMATH 585 Approximate and Numerical Analysis II (3)**

Approximation theory, curve-fitting. Numerical differentiation and integration. Linear and nonlinear algebraic equation systems. Ordinary differential equation methods. Asymptotic expansions. Perturbation methods. Matrix iterative techniques. Numerical methods for elliptic, parabolic, hyperbolic partial differential equations. Variational methods. Eigenvalue problems. Nonlinearities. Applications to practical problems in fluid flow, stress analysis, acoustics, electromagnetism. Offered jointly with A A 584, 585, 586. Prerequisites: 567, 568, A A 569. (Offered odd-numbered years.)

**COMPUTER SCIENCE**

**C SCI 322 Introduction to Formal Models in Computer Science (3)**

Finite automata and regular expressions; context free grammars and pushdown automata; nondeterminism; Turing machines and the halting problem. Emphasis on understanding models and their applications, and on rigorous use of basic techniques of analysis. Induction proofs, simulation, diagonalization, and reduction arguments. Prerequisites: 321, 241.

**C SCI 341 Programming Languages (5)**

Formerly C SCI 441. See C SCI 441 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

**C SCI 445 Computer Programming Laboratory (1)**

Focus on experienced computer programmers who want to learn Pascal quickly. Topics include the syntax and semantics of Pascal along with programming examples. Taught in a concentrated fashion during the first two weeks of the quarter with a number of programming assignments. No credit allowed if 241 has been taken. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: significant programming experience in a high-level language such as ALGOL, FORTRAN, BASIC, COBOL, or PL/I.

**C SCI 499 Reading and Research (1-24, max. 24)**

Available for special cases for advanced computer science majors to do reading and research in the field. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: senior standing and permission.

**C SCI 543 Analytic Models of Computer Systems (3)**

Emphasizes the use of queueing network models and tools for analyzing computer systems. Topics include useful results from basic queueing theory, selection of performance measures, modelling methodology, data acquisition, computational algorithms for queueing network models, approximation techniques, and decomposability and hierarchical modelling. A realistic case study is undertaken. 543 complements 540, and is a prerequisite for 541. Prerequisites: 378 and 451, or permission.

**INTERSCHOOL OR INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAMS**

**BIOENGINEERING**

**BIOEN 510 Bioengineering Seminar (1)**

Topics of current bioengineering interests presented by faculty, visitors, and students. Graduate students actively involved in bioengineering research must attend regularly, participate in discussions, and make presentations. Offered on CR/NC basis only. (Last time offered: Spring Quarter, 1981)

**BIOEN 532 Electron Microscopy (1-5)**

Theoretical and applied aspects of microscopy in biology with emphasis on newer methods. Offered jointly with B STR 532. Offered on CR/NC basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

**INSTITUTE FOR MARINE STUDIES**

**IMS -588 Research Seminar in Marine Resource Management (-3)**

For students who select marine resource management as an area of concentration within the marine affairs program. Topics are from living resources, ocean mining, energy production from the ocean, and other areas. Integration of multidisciplinary analysis and supervised student research, leading to completion of the thesis, are primary objectives. Offered jointly with PB PL 587-588.

**UNIVERSITY CONJOINT COURSES**

**UCONJ 411 Psychology of Aging (3)**

Interdisciplinary course with focus on developing the skills necessary for critically evaluating current psychological theories of aging, research findings in this area, and the implications of findings on the aging person. Special consideration given to the effects of socio-economic, sex, and ethnic differences in the psychology of aging. Open to upper-division undergraduates and beginning graduate students interested in the field of gerontology.

**QUANTITATIVE SCIENCE**

**Q SCI 576 Goal Programming (3)**

Offered jointly with FOR M 576. See FOR M 576 for course description and prerequisites.

**SCHOOL OF LIBRARIANSHIP**

**LIBR 510 Management for Librarianship (3)**

Management concepts critical to provision of library services. The planning process applied to library problems and opportunities. Communications awareness and skills in the professional environment. Organizational concerns include personnel, budgeting, control techniques, theories of management, and evaluation of effectiveness.

**LIBR 520 Organization of Library Materials - Introduction (3)**

Introduction to principles and techniques of standard methods of organizing library materials for use. Includes fundamentals of descriptive cataloging, primary systems of subject analysis, and developments in technical services. Prerequisite: 501.

**LIBR 528 Literature Searching (3)**

Survey of concepts and techniques of professional literature searching. Organization of computerized bibliographic files. Analysis and evaluation of data bases. Management and planning of library searching services. Specialized procedures in user interviewing and request analysis. Experience in design and online execution of literature searches, using a variety of standard searching languages, including the Dialog and Orbit systems. Offered on CR/NC basis only.

**LIBR 542 Information Access in the Social Sciences (3)**

Description and analysis of information problems and information sources in the social sciences. Fields considered are anthropology, business economics, education, geography, history, political science, psychology, and sociology. Prerequisite: 500, 501, or permission.

LIBR 547 Evaluation and Selection of Audio-visual Materials (3)

Develops competency in applying criteria to the evaluation, selection, and use of audio-visual materials and their accompanying technologies. Focuses on previewing the full range of audiovisual formats found in all types of libraries. Prerequisite: 501 or permission.

LIBR 549 Children's Materials: Evaluation and Use (3)

Study of library materials for children with emphasis on literature in its various forms. Attention also to criteria used in evaluation, issues in selection, and the use of materials with children.

LIBR 557 Advanced Legal Bibliography (2)

Formerly LIBR 540. See LIBR 540 in General Catalog for course description.

LIBR 562 The Design and Selection of Library Services (3)

The principles underlying library and information services, and the selection and design of services to meet user needs in all types of libraries and information centers. Emphasis on adult clientele in academic, public, and special libraries, but attention given to school library media centers and all age levels.

LIBR 568 Administration of the School Library Media Program (3)

Develops competency in administering materials, equipment, and services of the library media program as an integral part of the educational process of the School. Focuses on developing skills in acquiring, organizing and managing the full range of learning resources for access and use and communicating the program to users. Required for school library media specialists.

LIBR 593 Career Development for Librarians (3)

Review of the several components of the continuing education process: adult education, in-service training, staff development. Options for individual study are offered, such as planning and evaluating workshops, and designing in-service programs for specific work situations.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

BIOCHEMISTRY

BIOC 426 Basic Techniques in Biochemistry (3)

Introduction to basic biochemistry experiments. Designed to acquaint students with basic biochemical laboratory techniques and serve as a preparation for advanced biochemistry laboratory courses. Prerequisites: 405, 406 or 440, 441, 442 which may be taken concurrently.

BIOMEDICAL HISTORY

BI HS 411 The Development of Modern Pharmacy (3)

For pharmacy students. Surveys the evolution of the pharmaceutical profession from antiquity to the present. Attention given to the history of drug therapy, the changing of professional roles of pharmacists, the growth of professional education, literature, associations, and legislation, and the relations of pharmacists with other health professionals; particular emphasis on pharmacy in the United States. Prerequisite: pharmacy student or permission.

CONJOINT COURSES

CONJ 508 Ultrastructural Methods and Interpretation (6)

Introduction to the techniques used in transmission and scanning electron microscopy with emphasis on their practical application to the biological tissues. Detailed analysis of cell architecture as it can be related to the functional behavior of cells. Cellular membranes, organelles, and processes in relation to their ultrastructure. Prerequisite: permission.

FAMILY MEDICINE

FAMED 499 Undergraduate Research (\*)

Research activities are arranged with faculty members doing research in various areas related to Family Medicine. Areas include: clinical strategies, health care delivery, curriculum development at the undergraduate and residency levels, interdisciplinary activities, continuity of care, audit and retrieval strategies, and behavioral aspects of Family Practice. Research is generally clinically-oriented and centered around patient care.

HUMAN BIOLOGY

HUBIO 555P Medicine, Health, and Society (\*, max. 4)

Formerly HUBIO 543P. See HUBIO 543P in General Catalog for course description.

LABORATORY MEDICINE

LAB M 499 Undergraduate Research (\*)

Specific project in clinical laboratory investigation. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 502 Seminar (1, max. 6)

Current topics in the field of laboratory medicine. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Open to graduate students in laboratory medicine and other medical sciences. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 510 Clinical Chemistry Research Conference (1, max. 6)

Current projects under research and development in clinical chemistry and immunology. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Open to graduate students in laboratory medicine and other medical sciences. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 521 Advanced Laboratory Hematology (1, max. 2)

Lecture demonstrations of laboratory diagnosis in clinical hematology. Detailed description of laboratory instrumentation, special cytochemical and immunologic analyses for analysis of complex diagnostic problems in leukemia, lymphoma, gammopathies and red cell disorders. Emphasis on clinicopathological correlation. Intended for physicians and laboratory medicine graduate students with special interest in diagnostic clinical hematology. Students will be required to read literature in preparation for the lectures. Prerequisite: graduate and post-graduate students.

LAB M 522 Hematopathology Seminar (1, max. 3)

Monthly seminar on current topics in hematopathology featuring local and guest speakers with expertise in diagnostic hematopathology. Discussion following. Emphasis on critical analysis of special laboratory tests and histopathologic criteria for diagnosis of hematologic disorders. Recent literature and case material will be used to discuss controversial topics in hematopathology. Intended for physicians and laboratory medicine graduate students with special interest in hematopathology. Joint between Laboratory Medicine and Pathology. Students will be required to read extensively in preparation for the seminar. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: graduate and post-graduate students.

LAB M 590P Research Projects in Laboratory Medicine (\*)

Six or ten weeks to investigate one problem in a laboratory medicine subspecialty area. Topics are assigned by staff. Designed to demonstrate methods, tools, principles, and particularly problem-solving nature of laboratory investigations. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 680P Clinical Laboratory Testing: Methods and Interpretation (\*)

Methods, tools, and principles used in the modern clinical laboratory. Choice of one to three specialty areas including chemistry, coagulation, computers, hematology, immunology, microbiology, and virology. Course investigates the methodologies in the specialty areas, identifies their limitations, and explores their usefulness in clinical medicine. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 700 Master's Thesis (\*)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

MICROBIOLOGY AND IMMUNOLOGY

MICRO 576 Basic Tumor Immunology (1, max. 15)

Weekly one-hour seminar. Current research findings. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

MICRO 577 Cellular Immunity (1, max. 10)

Weekly one-hour seminar in which cellular aspects of B and T cell differentiation and their role in disease processes are discussed and current research findings presented. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY

OB GY 669P Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Swedish (12)

Clerkship, equivalent to 665P, offered at Swedish Hospital, Seattle, Washington. Prerequisite: HUBIO 552P. (Six weeks; limit: three students.)

OB GY 670P Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Group Health (12)

Clerkship, equivalent to 665P, offered at Group Health Cooperative of Puget Sound, which is a prepaid medical plan facility in Seattle, Washington. Prerequisite: HUBIO 552P. (Six weeks; limit: three students.)

OB GY 671P Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Anchorage (12)

Clerkship equivalent to 665P but offered at Anchorage, Alaska (WAMI). Includes experience in several private physicians' offices as well as Providence Hospital and Elmendorf Air Force Base. Prerequisite: HUBIO 552P. (Six weeks; limit: three students.)

OB GY 685P Obstetrics Gynecology Preceptorship (\*, max. 8)

Consists of a close working relationship with a physician engaged in the private practice of obstetrics and gynecology, including: hospital rounds, surgery, deliveries, and office and business aspects of private practice as individually arranged with the practitioner. Forty hours per quarter is the minimum time required; can be arranged as one-half day per week for 12 weeks (2 credits) up to four-half days per week for 12 weeks (8 credits), or as four weeks full-time or other combinations, not to exceed 8 credits. Prerequisites: 665 or equivalent and permission. (Limit: 2 students per quarter.)

OPHTHALMOLOGY

OPHTH 686P Ophthalmology Externship (4)

Student works with a clinical faculty member in the diagnosis and treatment of ocular diseases in outpatients. Each week the student is assigned to the Group Health Cooperative Ophthalmologist responsible for the care of walk-in and urgent patients (most likely to demonstrate findings pertinent to the future practice of primary care physicians). Opportunity to learn examination techniques including tonometry, ophthalmoscopy, and biomicroscopy. Prerequisite: HUBIO 563P.

PATHOLOGY

PATH 514 Comparative Pathology Conference (1, max. 6)

Focus on the histopathology of naturally-occurring and experimentally-induced lesions of primates, laboratory and domestic animals, fish, wildlife, and birds. Participants discuss the lesions and the basic pathogenetic mechanisms which underlie them. Prerequisites: 500 or equivalent, and permission.

PATH 522 Hematopathology Seminar (1, max. 3)

Offered jointly with LAB M 522. See LAB M 522 for course description and prerequisite.

PATH 666P Renal Pathology Conference (1)

Conference-seminar on the histopathologic aspects of renal disease. May be taken concurrently with MED 693. For third- and fourth-year students. Prerequisite: permission.

PSYCHIATRY AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES

PBSCI 539 Interviewing and Case Formulation (2, max. 6)

Sessions alternate between intake interviewing of a patient one week and a case presentation on the following week, with emphasis on developing interviewing skills that facilitate psychiatric classification (by the Research Diagnostic Criteria), case formulation, treatment planning, and case presentation. Offered jointly with PSYCH 539. Prerequisite: permission.

PBSCI 549P Assessment of the Older Patient (3)

Seminar with focus on a special methodology for studying cognitive and affective dysfunction in the elderly and basic methods for diagnosis, management, and assessment of change during treatment. Open to medical students and graduate students in the allied health sciences. Prerequisites: HUBIO 563P and permission.

PHYSIOLOGY AND BIOPHYSICS

P BIO 402 Basic Human Physiology: Transport and Exchange Organ Systems (3)

Covers cardiovascular system, respiration, acid-base balance, renal system, temperature regulation. Prerequisites: general chemistry, elementary physics.

P BIO 406 Human Physiology (-3)

Intensive coverage of advanced physiology through lectures and demonstrations. Applied systems: cardiovascular, respiratory, renal, endocrine, and gastrointestinal. Required for first-year dental students; also offered for graduate students. Entry card required.

## SCHOOL OF NURSING

### NURSING

#### NURS 503 Seminar in Psychosocial Family Theory (4)

Examination of theories relevant to psychosocial family intervention into problems of children, adults, and the aged. Analysis of appropriateness of theories for nursing theory development, practice, and research.

#### NURS 564 Nursing Administration (3)

This course considers elements of the administrative process as applied to organized nursing service. Concepts related to organizational structure, administrative behavior, personnel management, and the technology of administration are explored. Prerequisites: ADMIN 510, graduate standing, and permission.

#### NURS 585 Individual Adaptations to Wellness and Illness (3)

Survey and analysis of current theory and research in health and illness awareness, in health seeking and maintaining behaviors, and coping responses to illness and disability. Topics include psychological and physiological responses to pain, grief, acute illness, recovery, chronic illness, pre-illness factors which influence responses, and individual patterns of adaptations to illness and wellness. Prerequisites: admission to Graduate School, completion of 520 and 521 or equivalent, and instructor's permission.

#### NURS 800 Doctoral Dissertation (\*)

## SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

### PHARMACEUTICAL SCIENCES

#### PHSCI 527 Drug Metabolism (3)

Considerations of the biochemical mechanisms for the biotransformation of drugs and foreign compounds. Includes reaction mechanisms, ultrastructural considerations, induction mechanisms, methodology, kinetics of inhibition and activation, steroid and amine metabolism, and implications in modern therapy. Open to medical and graduate students. Offered jointly with PHCOL 527. Prerequisite: one year of graduate or medical biochemistry, or permission. (Offered alternate years.)

### PHARMACY PRACTICE

#### PHARM 333 Dispensing Practice (2)

Dispensing of drug products on prescription order. Includes laboratory exercises, patient drug profiles, and patient counseling. Familiarization with commercial drug products. Prerequisite: 331.

#### PHARM 460 Principles of Professional Practice Management (3)

Topics include organization of time and objectives, management of financial resources, management of inventory, and marketing management. Emphasis on developing specific skills, such as burden rate analysis, and financial ratio analysis. Primarily for students who are interested in managerial careers in community pharmacy practice. Offered on CR/NC basis only. Prerequisite: third-year professional standing or permission of instructor.

#### PHARM 507 Topics in Clinical Pharmacokinetics (1, max. 12)

Weekly seminar concerning new and important findings and trends in pharmacokinetics, biopharmaceutics, drug metabolism and drug toxicity, with particular emphasis on clinical significance and applicability. Offered on CR/NC basis only. Prerequisite: PHSCI 405 or equivalent.

## SCHOOL OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

### PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

#### PB AD 509 Social Theory and the Public Policy Process (3)

Formerly PB AD 541. See PB AD 541 in General Catalog for course description.

### PUBLIC POLICY

#### PB PL -588 Research Seminar in Marine Resource Management (-3)

Offered jointly with IMS -588. See IMS -588 for course description.

## PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE

### ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

#### ENVH 448 Environmental Health in the Third World (3)

The course considers the appropriate technology for water supply, excreta disposal, and pollution control for urban and rural communities. Program implementation, economic and institutional requirements, and the health issues related to development are discussed. Prerequisite: graduate standing or permission.

#### ENVH 545 Drinking Water and Health (3)

Study of health implications of drinking water collection, treatment, and distribution, including the presence of organic and inorganic pollutants, toxicants, and biological agents in water supplies; their entry, prevention of their entry, and removal by treatment processes. The conceptual design and operation of the system will be related to the size of the water supply (Class I-IV) and surface water or ground water origin. Routine and incidental monitoring requirements in light of the Safe Drinking Water Act will be evaluated. The purpose is to develop the skills and knowledge for sanitarians, engineers, or operations supervisors to function effectively in their respective roles to assure the community a safe water supply. Prerequisite: 440 or CEWA 456.

#### ENVH 563 Psychological Foundations of Safety and Health (2)

Overview of contemporary psychological models explaining accident etiology and subsequent counter-measures. The three major schools of psychological thought (psychoanalytic, phenomenological, and behavioral) discussed in relation to accident etiology. Special topics: risk taking, psychophysics, stress, attitudes, and ergonomics.

#### ENVH 576 Occupational Dermatology (2)

The anatomy, physiology, and pathology of skin from the point of view of occupational health practitioners: diagnosis and treatment of a variety of industrial skin diseases; plant surveys, medical-legal problems, dermatitis prevention, and rehabilitation problems.

## HEALTH SERVICES

### HSEPV 459 Principles of Patient Management for the Primary Care Practitioner I (2)

Systematic approach to patient management applicable to a primary care setting. Half of the course will be devoted to drug therapy and its administration, and will employ a programmed text developed specifically for the course. Other half of the course includes record keeping by a problem oriented system, health maintenance, risk factor identification, and non-pharmacological therapeutic modes. Prerequisite: admission to the MEDEX program or permission of course chairperson(s).

## SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

### SOCIAL WORK

#### SOC W 200 Introduction to Social Work Practice (5)

Introduction to the practice of social work, the theoretical concepts and institutional framework that guides practice, and the conceptual organization of the discipline of social work. Three weekly lectures and two hours per week in field observation sessions. Lectures supplemented by audio-visual aids and by special guest practitioners.

#### SOC W 402 Human Service Counseling (3)

Builds basic interviewing skills learned in 401. Emphasis on short- and long-term counseling skills, such as goal setting for clients, goal attainment and revision, referral and termination. Seminar/laboratory; participation in role playing and simulations. Prerequisite: 401 or permission of instructor.

#### SOC W 475 Introduction to Social Work Practice in Health Care (3)

Social impact of illness described, including issues in service delivery and interdisciplinary team functioning. Evaluation of social workers' contribution to comprehensive health care. Prerequisite: upper-division standing.

# INDEPENDENT STUDY THROUGH CORRESPONDENCE

The Office of Independent Study provides University courses for extension credit primarily by correspondence instruction to persons who wish individual instruction. Fees for Independent Study courses are separate from resident tuition and are \$20 per credit. Enrollment is not based on the quarter system but is continuous throughout the year, with one calendar year allowed to complete a course.
