# WHAT'S NEW FOR WINTER QUARTER 1993

## QUARTER OFF REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY POLICY

Undergraduate and professional students who completed spring quarter 1992 and did not enroll autumn quarter 1992, may return if in the same classification, and register during Registration Period I for winter quarter 1993 without reapplication. See page 6, Quarter-off Eligibility Policy for complete details.

## REGISTRATION PRIORITY

If your student number ends with 0, 1, 2, 3, or 4 you will have first priority within your class standing during Registration Period I for winter quarter. Students with numbers ending with 5, 6, 7, 8, or 9 will have second priority. Review the Registration Periods section of the Time Schedule for specific details. Registration priority alternates each quarter.

## HOW MANY SEATS ARE AVAILABLE IN A CLASS FOR REGISTRATION?

Beginning winter quarter 1993, the number of seats available in each course section will be divided in half for the first day of each priority period during Registration Period I. For example, if a course section has 30 seats available on the first day of the priority period for juniors, 15 seats will be reserved for the second day of that priority period. Any seats remaining after the first day will be added to those 15 seats. This change was made to give second-day priority students equal opportunity.

## ACCESS TO STAR

You may now call STAR to check course availability before your priority period. Courses may not be added until your assigned priority date.

# REGISTRATION PERIODS

**STAR REGISTRATION.** The University of Washington's touchtone telephone registration system is referred to as STAR-Student Telephone Assisted Registration. STAR registers students in course sections immediately and handles subsequent course adds and course drops, lists alternative sections available if the requested sections are closed or cancelled, reports the open/closed status of specified course sections, provides a spoken listing of the confirmed registration schedule, tuition balance, financial aid status, date and amount of last payment, and optional charges.

Students may call STAR from any touch-tone phone and register. Phones are available in the second floor lobby of Schmitz Hall, the T-Wing lobby in Health Sciences, 9 Communications, and the HUB on the ground floor level. These phones are part of the U.S. West phone system and have no special link to the STAR system. STAR will be available all weekdays (except holidays) and most weekends during the quarter. Weekend hours not specifically scheduled are not guaranteed and may be subject to equipment and software maintenance requirements. Beginning Period I you may call STAR at any time to complete section II of the STAR Worksheet and check course availability. STAR weekend hours are 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 Midnight.

**ELIGIBILITY.** This period is open only for continuing students currently enrolled Autumn Quarter 1992.

*Priority registration dates are based on your completed credits, your Autumn Quarter 1992 credits as of November 10, and the last digit of your student number. The number priority will be changed each quarter so that all students will have the earliest possible priority every other quarter. You may call STAR on, or after, your registration date to register and make changes to your schedule.*

**ELIGIBILITY.** This period is primarily for newly admitted students and returning former students. Advising/registration notices of dates are mailed to newly admitted or readmitted students. You may register on, or after, your date. Continuing students may access STAR any day during this period.

**REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION.** If you register by December 4 your Registration Confirmation will be mailed on December 8. If you register after December 4, your Registration Confirmation will be mailed in two working days. Call 543-3868 to record your correct address. Confirmations will not be mailed to addresses outside of the State of Washington during the last week of Period II and during Period III. If you are using an out-of-state address, you may claim your confirmation at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, within two working days.

You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L #). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

**CHANGE OF REGISTRATION CONFIRMATIONS.** Registration Change Confirmations will be mailed periodically. You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L #).

**ELIGIBILITY.** This period is open to all students for late registration and course adds and drops. To avoid a \$25 late registration fee, students are encouraged to call STAR and complete Section II of the STAR Worksheet before Registration Period III.

**ADD GUIDELINES.** Beginning Monday, January 11, an entry code is required to register or add any course. Friday, January 15 is the last day to add a course for Winter Quarter 1993.

STAR will accept entry codes for course overload authorization only up to 115% of classroom capacity to compensate for expected course drops. Although you received an entry code from the department, there is no guarantee that you can register in the course. If you have received an entry code to add a course, enter the data on your touchtone telephone in the following sequence:

**COURSE DROP.** You may drop courses through the tenth class day and receive no entry on your academic transcript. If you drop all courses, a complete withdrawal date is recorded on your transcript. Complete withdrawals must be made at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, or by mail. Some departments may require drop codes.

**\$20 CHANGE FEE.** A \$20 change fee will be assessed for any number of add, drop or change transactions processed during a given day beginning Monday, January 11. This fee will be billed to students. This fee is in addition to any tuition increase or forfeiture as a result of the change.

**WORKING STUDENTS ASSISTANCE.** If you need assistance with non-STAR transactions and you work during the day, you may call the Registration Office at 543-8580 and make arrangements to have a staff person stay no later than 5:30 p.m. to assist you. 24 hour advanced notice is required.

## PERIOD IV - FOR DROPPING COURSES AND ELECTING AUDIT GRADE OPTION ONLY, NO ADDS ACCEPTED

**ELIGIBILITY.** This period is open for dropping courses and electing audit grade option only. A \$20 change fee will be assessed for all changes occurring during the same day. This fee is in addition to any tuition increase or forfeiture as a result of the change.

**DROP GUIDELINES.** A course drop or change in grade option made during this period will be recorded on undergraduate academic transcripts with a "W" and a number designating the week of the quarter in which the course drop occurred; for graduates and professional students a "W" will be recorded for course drops.

## TUITION EXEMPTION PROGRAMS FOR UW FACULTY/STAFF AND WASHINGTON STATE CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES

Students enrolling under these exemption programs must be full-time permanent employees and meet the criteria established for faculty and staff of the University of Washington or by the employing agency of the state of Washington for non-university employees. University of Washington employees must have been continuously employed full time for six months or more with the university immediately prior to the academic quarter in which they are enrolling. Those who meet the requirements and are admitted to the University of Washington may take up to 6 credits per quarter under the tuition exemption programs. According to legislative action, all registration must be on a space-available basis after other matriculated students have registered. Students cannot register for graduate-level independent study courses numbered 600, 700, or 800. Students admitted as nonmatriculated in order to use one of these exemption programs may only register for classes when using the exemption and the exemption request form has been submitted. Matriculated students will be permitted to register even when they are not using the exemption: full tuition and fees will be charged. Deadlines and registration dates are listed below by category:

### UW Faculty/Staff

Friday, December 11— Tuition exemption request card due to Registration, 225 Schmitz, PD-10.

Wednesday, January 6— Registration begins on STAR. Open from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight.

Friday, January 22— \$5 registration fee due. Fee is billed if a student successfully registers.

### Washington State Classified Employees

Friday, December 11— Tuition exemption request card due to Registration, 225 Schmitz, PD-10.

Thursday, January 7— Registration begins on STAR. Open from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight.

Friday, January 22— \$30 registration fee due. Fee is billed if a student successfully registers.

Students enrolling under these exemption programs may attend class beginning the first class day if space is available. Please check with the department offering the course to determine the correct classroom location. The building and room number may have been changed by the department since the *Time Schedule* was printed.

**ADMISSION STATUS.** Program participants who wish to enroll as new matriculated students or in a new matriculated category must apply to the Office of Admissions, 320 Schmitz Hall, by the regular admission closing date; November 1 is the closing date for winter applications. Students applying to the Graduate School must contact the applicable academic department for application information.

Program participants who are applying as new nonmatriculated students should apply at the Office of Admissions. Applications will be accepted up to the beginning of the quarter.

Program participants who are former students returning in the same classification or as nonmatriculated students should apply at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. Applications will be ac-

cepted up to the beginning of the quarter.

Graduate nonmatriculated-program participants apply through the intended academic department.

**HOW TO REGISTER.** If the tuition exemption request has been received by the Registration Office in time, program participants may call STAR on or after the appropriate eligibility dates listed above. Registration continues through Sunday, January 10, on STAR without assessment of late fees. Effective Monday, January 11, a \$25 late registration fee is billed if the student is initially registering for the quarter and a \$20 change fee is charged for registration changes. Students participating in the exemption programs listed above will be billed these fees if applicable plus the registration fee when registration in a course is successful.

Students enrolling under these exemption programs will not be permitted to convert to the tuition exemption program if they have already registered for the quarter, and they will be required to pay regular tuition for those credits.

Students participating in these programs are not entitled to other student services such as those available at the Hall Health Center and the Intramural Activities Building. Faculty/staff identification cards may be used for library services. Washington State employees participating in the program may contact the Student ID Center, 229 Schmitz Hall for an ID card to be used for library services.

The University of Washington waives tuition for Washington residents sixty years or older who wish to attend classes as auditing students, on a space-available basis. Courses marked with a greater than sign (>) require an entry code to register. Contact the offering department to obtain entry codes. The fee is \$5 whether one or two courses are attended and will be billed if registration in a course(s) is completed. The payment is due by Friday, January 22. As auditors, students do not receive credit and are not expected to do laboratory work or to take examinations. ACCESS students are not eligible to enroll in courses which are 500-level and above, Extension and correspondence courses, studio and laboratory courses, or honors sections. A transcript is not maintained. Students who attend the University under the Access program are limited to two courses per quarter.

## REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

### ALL STUDENTS

**GUARANTEED REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY.** All students at the University who remain in good standing and in compliance with other rules and

regulations, with no outstanding financial obligations, are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (summer quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate, etc. Once a student earns a baccalaureate degree, he or she must apply for readmission as a postbaccalaureate (fifth year), nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action, (2) students with a financial hold, (3) students not meeting their departmental continuation policies, or (4) students not meeting the University's satisfactory progress policy (see *General Catalog*).

## UNDERGRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENTS

**QUARTER-OFF ELIGIBILITY POLICY.** Subject to college, school and departmental enrollment policies, undergraduate and professional students who have completed a quarter at the University of Washington may take the following quarter off and remain eligible to register in Registration Period I for the subsequent quarter without reapplication as returning students. For example, a student completing spring quarter may, without registering for or completing autumn quarter, register during Registration Period I for winter quarter without reapplication. Any quarter from which a student has completely withdrawn, or from which he/she is cancelled, does not constitute a completed quarter. Summer quarter enrollment is not required to maintain continuous registration eligibility.

## GRADUATE STUDENTS

**ON-LEAVE STATUS.** The quarter-off eligibility policy is not available to graduate students. Graduate students who do not maintain continuous enrollment (summer quarter excepted) must file a Petition for On-Leave Status with the Graduate School. Students who are registered for any portion of a quarter, may not go on-leave for that quarter unless they officially withdraw at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall prior to the first day of the quarter. On-leave graduate students returning to the University on or before the termination of their authorized periods of leave must reapply as returning former students (through the Registration Office by the published deadlines).

## ACADEMIC ADVISING

Students are strongly encouraged to see an academic adviser to discuss their educational objectives, to assess progress toward completion of requirements, and to learn procedures involved in registering at the University. It is wise for students to make appointments with advisers and to have ideas of courses they would like to take by reviewing the *General Catalog* and the quarterly *Time Schedule* before the advising session. If students fail to maintain contact with their advisers and problems develop with degree programs, these problems are the students' responsibilities. The consequence may be additional time to complete degree programs. Advising offices are generally open Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

# ADDITIONAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION AND NOTICES

**1. ADDRESS CHANGE TELEPHONE SERVICE - CALL 543-3868.** Students are responsible for notifying the Office of the Registrar when their address changes. The Address Change Telephone Service is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week for changes of local and permanent addresses and telephone numbers, restricting release of directory information, and where to mail registration confirmations, tuition billing statements, and final grades. Students should always leave a forwarding address with the U. S. Postal Service whenever they move. Addresses may also be changed at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall.

Students who have applied for financial aid, must also report their address change to the Office of Financial Aid.

**2. CLASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES.** To provide enrollment space for others, students who do not attend regularly scheduled class meetings during the first week of the quarter are subject to being dropped at the discretion of the teaching departments. Affected courses may be identified in the *Time Schedule* and posted in departmental offices.

Students must not assume that departments will automatically initiate a drop for nonclass attendance. Students who register for courses they do not attend are themselves responsible for officially dropping the courses through STAR. The consequence of not officially dropping courses is a 0.0 grade.

Students should contact the instructor or teaching department if they plan to be absent any day during the first week of the quarter.

No person, other than a faculty member attending informally with the approval of the instructor, may attend a University course in which that person has not been officially registered through STAR. An instructor may allow a student to attend his or her class only if the student's name appears on the official class list from the Registrar's Office. Instructors may permit students attending class under a faculty/staff tuition exemption or the Washington State classified employee tuition exemption program to attend class prior to registration on Wednesday or Thursday respectively of the first week of the quarter provided space is available.

**3. REGISTRATION TAMPERING.** A student who tampers or attempts to tamper with the registration records of another student, including but not limited to dropping courses and adding courses, may be subject to disciplinary sanctions as defined in the Student Conduct Code (WAC 478-120).

**4. PRIVATE ACCESS CODE TO SECURE YOUR REGISTRATION AND GRADE DATA.** Students who, for any reason, believe that another person might tamper with their registration or hear their grades on STAR and want to avoid this possibility, may go to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall and request a private access code (PAC). Ask for the Private Access Code and identify the 6 digit code to use instead of date of birth when calling STAR each quarter.

**5. FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT.** To be considered full-time, an undergraduate or professional student must register for 12 or more credits and a graduate student must register for 9 or more credits. However, it is important to note that differing criteria and standards for full-time enrollment exist for eligibility in certain programs. Consult the Financial Aid Office for its requirement on satisfactory student progress.

This tuition schedule does not reflect full-time credit requirements for loan deferments, teaching assistantships or other programs. For more information, consult the Additional Registration Information and Notices section of this *Time Schedule*.

**6. OVERLOAD GUIDELINES.** For reasons of public safety and instructional quality, course enrollment in each section will be limited to the approved classroom capacity. The Office of the Registrar monitors course enrollments throughout the quarter according to the following guidelines:

a. Through the seventh calendar day, a student may add a section without permission unless the class is full or requires permission; then an entry code is required. Beginning the sixth class day, entry codes are required to add any course. STAR will accept course overloads only up to 115% of classroom capacity to compensate for expected course drops.

b. No course adds are accepted after the 10th class day of the academic quarter.

**7. \$20 CHANGE-OF-REGISTRATION FEE.** The \$20 change-of-registration fee is assessed for any number of add, drop or change transactions (including change of grading option) made during a given day beginning the sixth class day of each quarter. The \$20 fee is a service charge, not a penalty, and is in addition to any change in tuition or forfeiture as a result of adds, drops or changes.

There is no charge for changes made in Registration Periods I, II and the first week of Period III. This "free" period gives students an incentive to complete their schedule before the quarter is too far advanced.

Fee waivers are rarely approved. If you think your change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request, you must pay the fee and submit a petition for a refund to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. Students will be notified of the decision by the Registrar's Office. The fee will be waived only if the change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request.

**8. UNDERGRADUATE SATISFACTORY PROGRESS.** Students admitted to the University to pursue baccalaureate degrees are expected to make satisfactory progress toward the attainment of that degree, and are expected to enter a major and graduate after completion of a reasonable number of credits. Refer to the *General Catalog* for additional information.

**9. COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL FROM THE QUARTER.** (Dropping all courses for the quarter.) It is the student's responsibility to withdraw completely if he or she is unable to attend for the quarter. Students may write the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, Mailstop PD-10, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington, 98195, or withdraw in person at 225 Schmitz Hall. Complete withdrawal for the quarter is not available via STAR. Withdrawals by mail are effective on the date of the postmark.

Tuition owed will be based upon the date the complete withdrawal is received in person at the

Registration Office or the postmark date for withdrawals received by mail. Students who withdraw prior to the second week of the quarter will owe a \$75 U-PASS fee unless they return their U-PASS to the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office by the tuition due date. No withdrawals are accepted after the last day of instruction for the quarter.

Students who withdraw before the first day of the quarter will be required to submit to the Registration Office, a Returning Student Reenrollment application by the published deadline. New students must reapply through the Admissions Office. See Registration Eligibility section of the *Time Schedule* for more information.

Courses dropped as part of a complete withdrawal from the University during the first two weeks of a quarter are not recorded on the student's UW transcript; however, the date of the complete withdrawal is recorded.

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University. For example, a student who withdraws during the first week of Spring Quarter and Autumn Quarter must reapply as a returning former student for Winter Quarter.

The forfeiture schedule for the University is as follows:

- Students withdrawing before the eighth calendar day of the quarter do not pay tuition. New and returning students forfeit their \$50 enrollment confirmation deposit. Students who withdraw before the eighth calendar day of the quarter without returning the U-PASS sticker will owe \$75 for the U-PASS.
- Students withdrawing on the eighth calendar day through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition. Students who withdraw after the seventh calendar day will be charged the applicable forfeiture and may retain the pass for \$20 or return it no later than the tuition due date to have the \$20 fee waived. There will be no U-PASS refunds after the tuition payment deadline.
- Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe full tuition.
- Students whose registrations are cancelled for nonpayment of fees will continue to owe the University one-half their tuition and fees.
- International students who are registered for an English as a Second Language course must make a separate request for a refund for that course by contacting the ESL Office in 102 Lewis Hall at the same time they withdraw from the University.
- Students who drop classes on the 8th through the 30th calendar day of the quarter that result in lower tuition, will owe one-half of the tuition associated with the reduced credit hours.

**10. HARDSHIP WITHDRAWAL.** Hardship withdrawals are for dropping individual courses after the seventh week of the quarter. The \$20 change of registration fee will be assessed. (See section on Complete Withdrawal from the University for procedure to follow for dropping all courses for the quarter.)

A student may petition the Registrar for a hardship withdrawal if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the drop deadline. See the *General Catalog* for complete information.

**11. WITHDRAWAL FOR MILITARY SERVICE.**

Students conscripted into the Armed Forces or called to active military duty may withdraw through the end of the 7th week of instruction and receive a full refund but no academic credit. Students withdrawing after that date receive either a full refund or credit and no refund. Please consult with the Office of the Registrar for complete details.

**12. GRADUATE STUDENTS ON-LEAVE.**

Students who are registered for any portion of a quarter may not go on-leave for that quarter unless they officially withdraw at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall prior to the first day of the quarter. To avoid liability for tuition and fees, students must withdraw before the 6th calendar day of the quarter. Students who withdraw beginning the sixth day through thirtieth day pay 50% of tuition/fees. After the thirtieth calendar day students pay 100% of tuition/fees.

**13. STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION.**

The University will routinely release student directory information, unless requested otherwise by the student. Directory information is defined as student's name, address, telephone number, place of birth, major field of studies, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most recent previous educational institution attended by the student. Students who do not wish to authorize directory release and do not want their name and address to appear in the Student Directory, may call the address change service at 543-3868 to restrict access to this information. Students who wish to change their authorization and allow release, must go to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz and present photo identification.

**14. DISCLOSURE OF STUDENT RECORDS.**

As a general rule the University will not release a student's education records to a third party without written consent of the student. This includes tuition account information. The complete University policy on student education records and the location of such records may be found in the Washington Administrative Code under WAC 478-140. Manuals containing the Code are available at Reference Stations on campus, and at the Visitor's Information Center, 4014 University Way NE. The policy covers such items as accessibility, review and expunging of inaccurate records, and costs to be charged for copies of student records. Information release forms for tuition accounts information only may be obtained from the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, 129 Schmitz.

**15. NOTICE TO STUDENTS OF THEIR PRIVACY RIGHTS.**

Under the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), students have the right to 1) inspect and review information contained in education records, 2) challenge the contents of their education records, 3) a hearing if the outcome of the challenge is unsatisfactory, 4) submit an explanatory statement for inclusion in the education record if the outcome of the hearing is unsatisfactory, 5) prevent disclosure, with certain exceptions, of personally identifiable information (see item #11 above), 6) secure a copy of the institution policy (see item #12 above), and 7) file complaints with the Department of Education concerning alleged failures by institutions to comply with the Act. Written complaints should be directed to FERPA, Department of Education, Room 4074, Switzer Building, Washington, D. C. 20202.

**16. DISABLED STUDENTS.** Various support services, including priority registration, are available to students with disabilities. Contact Disabled Student Services (DSS), 448 Schmitz, 543-8925 voice/TDD, for information on equipment services, accessibility, and accommodations to meet individual needs.

Students with disabilities who require special accommodations for science labs, internships, etc., should contact the DSS Director and the academic adviser of that department to work out appropriate services.

The STAR Work Sheet and Instructions are available from DSS in alternate media, including tape recording, large print and braille. Students with disabilities which would limit their ability to use STAR may register through DSS or at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall.

**17. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS** must subscribe to the student insurance plan unless they are covered by another plan. Refer to the STUDENT INSURANCE section for more details.

**18. ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON (ASUW).** The Associated Students of the University of Washington is a voluntary association of students designated by the University Regents to carry out a variety of student activities. In order to vote in ASUW elections or hold ASUW office, students must be members. A student's membership choice will not affect tuition payment in any way. Information about the ASUW can be obtained from the ASUW Office in Room 204L Student Union Building.

**19. CENTER FOR CAREER SERVICES.** The Center for Career Services provides comprehensive career and job search information and services for students and alumni to facilitate their transition from academic programs of the UW to the broader society. Services are available to UW students and alumni who are registered with the office. Registration is free for students; alumni must pay applicable fees for the period of time during which services are desired.

Types of services offered include individual career counseling, job search seminars, a career information library, a Minority Job Placement Program, on-campus interviews, job opportunity bulletins, a placement/credential file service, and career- and degree-related summer jobs/internships. To participate in the on-campus interview program, students must attend an orientation session. For more information, please come to the Center for Career Services at 301 Loew Hall, FH-30, or call (206)543-0535.

**20. UW ID CARD.** Students should carry their UW ID Card with them at all times since it is required for a variety of transactions and services on campus. In some situations, students' may be asked to provide additional pieces of identification, including one containing their photo. A quarterly validation sticker is mailed with students' registration confirmation. The sticker should be affixed to the permanent ID Card as soon as it is received. Lost ID Cards may be replaced at the Student ID Center, 229 Schmitz. A \$5.00 fee is charged for replacement of non-photo ID cards or \$10.00 for replacement of photo ID cards.

**21. U-PASS INFORMATION.** A U-PASS validation sticker is mailed with students' registration confirmation each quarter. The U-PASS is valid on all regular Metro routes and most Community Transit routes at all times and provides parking privileges

to carpoolers, riding privileges to vanpool and Night Ride passengers, and merchant discounts. The quarterly fee of \$20 will be included on the tuition bill. Students who do not wish to participate in the U-PASS program must return the validation sticker to the university by the tuition payment deadline. The sticker can be returned by mail in the return envelope provided, or mailed with your tuition payment, or returned in person at the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office.

Students who withdraw through the seventh calendar day of the quarter without returning the U-PASS sticker will owe \$75 for the U-PASS. Students who withdraw after the seventh calendar day will be charged the applicable tuition and may retain the pass for \$20 or return it no later than the tuition due date to have the \$20 fee waived. There will be no U-PASS refunds after the tuition payment deadline.

Students who did not receive their U-PASS in the mail will be asked to sign a certifying statement and will be issued a replacement sticker at no charge through the first week of the quarter. Replacement stickers issued after the first week will cost \$10. Lost ID cards bearing a U-PASS sticker will be replaced for a \$15 fee, which includes a new U-PASS sticker. Replacement fees are nonrefundable. Students issued replacement stickers will not be permitted to cancel the \$20 U-PASS fee by returning a sticker.

Eligible students who have not already purchased a U-PASS sticker may do so at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, anytime during the quarter. The fee will remain \$20 throughout the quarter.

The U-PASS is not transferable. The U-PASS program and replacement policies are subject to change without notice.

## SPECIAL COURSE AND LABORATORY FEES

The amounts charged for tuition and fees normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs.

## TUITION FORFEITURES OR REFUNDS

Students will be billed for the number of credits, including audit hours, on their programs at the beginning of the quarter. Only partial tuition reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter. Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition associated with that course. Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund.

The effect of tuition forfeitures on the over-18-credit surcharge is as follows: forfeitures for courses dropped that exceeded 18 credits are charged the same as above. Also, if a student drops a course after the thirtieth calendar day and adds another, total credit charges will include credits that are added with no reduction for credits dropped.

Course drops become effective the date received and processed on STAR, in the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, or through the departmental registration screen used in academic departments.

## TUITION/FEE ASSESSMENTS AND DEADLINES

1. It is the student's responsibility to see that tuition is paid in full by the tuition due date (third Friday of each quarter). Bills are sent at the beginning of each quarter to facilitate payment. However, failure to receive a tuition bill does not nullify the student's responsibility for payment by the due date. Account balances are available through STAR.

2. You should indicate selection of your permanent or local address on STAR for fee statement mailing. If you have not received a fee statement by the end of the second week of the quarter, contact the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, or call STAR for the amount of tuition due.

3. You may pay your fees in person in the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office or mail them to UW, Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, 129 Schmitz, PE-10, Seattle, WA 98195, before the tuition due date. Fees must be paid by Friday of the third week of the quarter. Checks and money orders must be in U. S. Dollars and drawn on U. S. or Canadian banks. Payments postmarked on or before the due date are accepted without a late fee. Metered mail received after the due date is subject to penalties as described in #4 below.

4. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your tuition the week following the due date, plus a late fee as follows:

If payment has not been received in the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office by the end of the late payment period, your registration for the current quarter as well as any future quarters will be cancelled. Students permitted to reregister after cancellation for nonpayment will be charged a \$75 fee, in addition to their tuition.

5. Tuition and fees incurred after the tuition due date must be paid within three working days to avoid cancellation of registration. Exception: As of the last week of instruction, charges must be paid by the next business day.

6. If you reregister, you must reregister for all classes on your schedule at the time of registration cancellation. (Fees will include appropriate charges for classes dropped during the forfeiture period.) If you wish to drop any courses after you reregister, you may do so on STAR until the end of the seventh week of the quarter. A \$20 change fee will be assessed. Please note: Even if your registration is cancelled you will continue to owe one-half of your tuition.

7. Credit cards are not accepted.

8. Tuition and fees not paid by the end of the academic quarter will be subject to an interest charge of 1% per month, or fraction of a month, (12% A.P.R.), beginning with the month following the end of the quarter.

Remember: the registration for students owing \$30 or more after the late payment period will be cancelled. Always check your current account status on STAR when completing a registration transaction.

## APPLICATION OF PAYMENTS TO A STUDENT'S ACCOUNT

As a rule, payments received for a student's account are applied to charges in order of their due dates. For charges with the same due date, payments are applied first to tuition and related University fees and then to other charges on the account. A payment may be applied to a specific charge by contacting the Student Accounts Office at 129 Schmitz Hall. Financial aid from Federal Title IV programs is applied only to required tuition and fees and to loan and aid repayment obligations. The University may not apply such aid to pay insurance and some other optional charges.

## STUDENT INSURANCE

The University offers a voluntary accident and sickness insurance plan to supplement the services available at the Hall Health Center. Seattle Campus UW students (except nonmatriculated students and those enrolled in programs administered by UW Extension and UW faculty/staff or Washington State classified employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption programs) who remain registered through at least the first six days of instruction in the quarter are eligible to enroll in the plan.

Students may sign up for the plan when they register for classes. If students are registered for classes by their academic departments, and no plan is indicated, they will be enrolled in the student-only quarterly plan. The insurance premium will be included on the quarterly tuition statements and must be paid by the quarterly tuition-due date. In most cases Financial Aid will not pay insurance directly so students must make sure the premium is paid on time. There is no late payment period for the insurance premium.

If students are billed for student insurance and wish to add, cancel, or change coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance advice copy of the billing statement and pay the revised amount, or make payment in person at the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office by the tuition due date. Changes to student insurance may be made by calling the Registration Office, 543-8580 prior to the sixth class day of the quarter.

International students must subscribe to the stu-



dent insurance plan unless they are covered by another plan. Proof of other coverage must be submitted to the International Services Office and a waiver obtained each Autumn Quarter (or upon initial admission if other than Autumn Quarter) because waivers are valid only through Summer Quarter each year. Students holding insurance policies that expire during the academic year are responsible for obtaining new waivers, as necessary.

Brochures describing the plan in more detail are available at the Hall Health Center, the HUB, and the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. Plan benefits may change each academic year, so students are encouraged to review the brochure carefully.

### WASHINGTON STUDENT LOBBY (WSL)

The Washington Student Lobby (WSL) is a voluntary, independent organization of university students whose purpose is to influence the Washington State Legislature and others on higher education matters of special interest to students. Students may choose to support the WSL by contributing \$1.00 each quarter. Support for the WSL may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on the tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

### WASHINGTON PUBLIC INTEREST RESEARCH GROUP (WASHPIRG)

The Washington Public Interest Research Group (WashPIRG) is a student-directed, non-profit and non-partisan research organization which works on issues affecting the quality of life in Washington State. Students participate in WashPIRG as decision makers, volunteers and credit interns producing research reports, lobbying the legislature and organizing students and citizens around consumer, environmental and governmental issues. Students may choose to support WashPIRG by contributing \$2 each quarter. Support of WashPIRG may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on the tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

## GRADING INFORMATION RELATED TO REGISTRATION

### SATISFACTORY/NOT SATISFACTORY

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory (S/NS) basis. Advisers should be consulted, and in no case are undergraduate students allowed to register for more than six credits (or for one course, if that course is offered for more than six credits) on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter.

Students may register for the course on STAR, but they must go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall to elect the S/NS grade option. STAR will not accommodate the S/NS grade option.

The S/NS grade option can be elected only through the tenth class day. A \$20 fee is charged beginning the sixth class day.

For undergraduates, a course in which an "S" is earned may not be used to satisfy any department, college, or University requirement, except that the credits may be applied to the minimum of 180 credits

required for graduation. Each instructor will report conventional grades to the Registrar, who will convert satisfactory grades (2.0 or greater) to "S," and unsatisfactory grades (less than 2.0) to "NS" for the student's transcript. No more than 25 S/NS credits will apply to an undergraduate degree.

Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). With the approval of his or her graduate program adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairperson, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on an S/NS basis.

In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS is included in the grade-point average. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

### CREDIT/NO CREDIT COURSES

Some courses are offered on a credit/no credit (CR/NC) basis. It is not possible to register S/NS to take these courses, because the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

### AUDITORS

Students must first register on STAR, and then go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall to select the audit grade option. Students may select the audit option through the seventh week of the quarter. A \$20 change fee is charged beginning the sixth class day of the quarter. Attendance in courses as an auditor is by consent of the instructor involved and is conditioned on the space available. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. An auditor may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work, and his or her registration may be cancelled at the discretion of the instructor. No entry is made on the permanent record for courses audited however, registered courses changed to audit after the second week of the quarter will be recorded on undergraduate academic transcripts with a "W" and a number designating the week of the quarter in which the course change occurred; for graduates and professional students a "W" will be recorded. To receive credit for an audited course, the student must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors, except ACCESS program students, pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course. Although credits for audited courses will not be listed on your transcript, they will be included in the billing on the fee statement. Such credits count in the calculation of fees.

Courses audited may not be changed to credit registrations after the second week of the quarter.

### INCOMPLETE GRADE

Incomplete grades may only be awarded if the student is doing satisfactory work up until the last two weeks of the quarter. Undergraduate students must not reregister for courses in which they have received an Incomplete, since a grade earned in a repeat course will not be recorded as an Incomplete

conversion grade. To obtain credit for the course, an undergraduate student must convert an Incomplete into a passing grade no later than the last day of the next quarter. An Incomplete not made up by the end of the next quarter will be converted to the grade of 0.0 by the Registrar unless the instructor has indicated, when assigning the Incomplete grade, that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. The original Incomplete grade is not removed from the transcript.

## HOW TO USE STAR

**1. TOUCHTONE TELEPHONE.** Use only a touchtone telephone to make entries on STAR. Touchtone phones make a different tone after each key is pressed. Telephones that make no tone or only a monotone will not work on the registration system. Your touchtone phone acts as a computer keyboard, enabling you to enter your course requests just as if you were sitting at a computer terminal. Within minutes, you will know your confirmed schedule.

**2. CALLING STAR.** STAR is available during published registration dates and times. STAR is closed on holidays and may close earlier than 12 midnight on a few days to produce registration confirmations, ID cards, and instructors' class list. If STAR does not answer your call, it is not in operation. If the phone line is busy, all lines are being used. Call back later. You may call STAR on, or after, your initial registration date or priority period.

**3. VOICE RESPONSE.** A voice response will guide you after each transaction. If you do not understand a response or instruction and would like it repeated, press the star key (\*) first, and then the number sign key (#).

**4. IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE.** If you make a mistake before finishing an entry, press the star key and the number sign key (\*#), and your entry will be discarded.

**5. TO SPEED UP YOUR REGISTRATION.** To expedite your registration, you may enter data during the voice response. Be cautious about doing this, since you may miss some important information.

**6. DISCONNECT ACTION.** Time limits are built into the system, so if you are holding on the STAR line for an extended period of time, you will be disconnected. Error limits are also a part of the STAR system, so if you do not enter the correct information after the second try, STAR will disconnect. You may immediately call back to STAR.

**7. TRANSACTIONS.** The transactions you enter on your touchtone telephone communicate to the computer what action to take (such as add a course, drop a course, check a section status, etc.) and what data you want considered. The transaction code legend follows:

- A = Add a course
- D = Drop a course
- L = Hear a spoken listing of your assigned courses
- S = Check the open or closed status of a course
- T = Terminate your call.
- G = List grades and GPA.
- 11 = Account balance.
- 12 = Financial aid summary.
- 13 = Outside lender loan.
- 14 = Last received payment.
- 15 = Optional charges.
- \* = Star key; used to separate data.
- # = Number sign key; used to send transactions that you enter.

Beginning the sixth class day, check your account balance (transaction 11) after adding or dropping courses.

**8. ENTRY CODES.** Entry codes are five digit random numbers issued to you by academic departments as authorization to enroll in restricted course sections. Entry Codes are not transferable. All courses require entry codes to add beginning the sixth class day of the quarter.

Courses requiring entry codes are designated with the symbol > to the left of the schedule line number (SLN) in the Time Schedule. Please note that departments reserve the right to require entry codes whether the course is so designated in the Time Schedule or not. Usually information on where to obtain entry codes is found in the body of the Time Schedule, either as a comment before the course listing or just after the title of the course. Contact the department offering the course if STAR advises you an entry code is required and the location for obtaining one is not identified in the Time Schedule.

Instructors may issue entry codes to students when a class is full. You may use this code to override the system but not if the overload will increase enrollment over 115% of room capacity.

Once you have used an entry code, the computer removes it from the list of viable codes and will not accept it again. If you drop a section that required an entry code to add, then you must obtain another entry code from the department if you wish to re-add the section.

When you use an entry code to register, it becomes a part of your registration record, and is visible with your name on computer terminal screens. Entry codes are required to add courses during the second week of the quarter.

**9. LECTURE/LAB/QUIZ/CONFERENCE.** These are combined under one SLN for each possible combination of time and day. On STAR, when you register for a course SLN associated with a lecture, lab and/or quiz or conference, you will be registered for all the lecture, lab, quiz or conference combination as listed under one SLN in the Time Schedule.

**10. ALTERNATE SELECTIONS.** If the section requested is closed you will be informed by STAR of open section alternates (including new sections added after the publication of the quarterly Time Schedule). You can then immediately select an alternate section to be added to your schedule. Have a pencil ready and be prepared to write down schedule line numbers (SLN) and meeting times of alternate sections.

**11. TIME CONFLICT.** You may not register on STAR for two courses that meet at the same time or for courses with overlapping meeting times. If you want the second course instead of the one you are registered for, you must drop the first one before adding the second course on STAR. If you want two time-conflicting courses, you must add the second course, in person, at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz. Time conflicts of more than one hour require instructors' signatures for both courses involved.

**12. REGISTRATION HOLDS.** If you have a hold on your registration, you will not be permitted to complete your registration until the hold has been released by the initiating office. If you attempt to register on STAR before your hold has been released, the voice response will indicate which office has placed the hold, and where to go to get it released. Registration holds will also prevent access to STAR for course changes, withdrawals, grades, tuition, financial aid, or optional charge information.

**13. ELECTING S/NS GRADING OPTION.** You may register for a course on STAR, but you must go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz to elect the Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory grading option. The deadline to elect the Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory grading option is the tenth class day. A \$20 change fee is assessed beginning the sixth class day.

**14. AUDIT.** You must first register on STAR for the course you wish to audit, and then go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall to set the audit grade option. You may change to audit through the seventh week of the quarter. After the 10th class day a "W" and the week of the quarter in which the grade option change occurred will be recorded on your transcript. A \$20 change fee is charged beginning the sixth class day.

**15. CREDIT LIMITATIONS.** Undergraduates will be limited to 19 credits during Registration Periods I and II to allow all students a chance to develop a basic schedule. Additional credits may be added during Registration Period III. Thirty credits is the limit per quarter.

**16. VARIABLE CREDITS.** Some courses are offered for a variable number of credits. See the department to obtain the appropriate number of credits for a variable credit course and be prepared to enter the number of credits when requested to do so by the voice response on STAR. To change variable credits beginning the sixth class day, an entry code is required to add the new course credits. After the tenth class day, changes are made at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz.

**17. SECTION II ON STAR WORKSHEET.** Call STAR beginning the first day of Registration Period I, complete Section II and check course availability. Then call STAR to register during your scheduled registration priority period. STAR will not accommodate changes of your initial decisions in Section II. You may go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall or call 543-8580 to modify selections. Faculty/staff or Washington State classified employees using a tuition exemption program, and branch campus students will not be asked to make decisions for Section II.

**18. MERLIN TELEPHONE.** If using an AT&T Merlin telephone to call STAR, press the # sign key twice to send transactions.

**19. QUESTIONS.** If you have questions regarding registration, please call the Registration Office, (206) 543-8580, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

**20. REGISTRATION IN SEQUENCE COURSES.** Departments may establish a registration priority for students enrolled in sequence courses. For example, students enrolled in a foreign language 101 course may have priority to register in the next course sequence (102) for the succeeding quarter.

\* Saturday courses may schedule their examination for the first Saturday of the examination week, but must make arrangements with Room Assignments to check on room availability. Dean's office approval is not required for Saturday only courses.

Final Examinations should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule. The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed:

1. With the dean's permission the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for the date of a final examination.

2. An instructor shall not schedule a final class examination before the beginning of finals week. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.

3. A student absent from any examination

through sickness or other cause, judged by the instructor to be unavoidable, shall be given an opportunity to take a rescheduled examination or perform work judged by the instructor to be the equivalent.

If the instructor determines that neither alternative is feasible during the current quarter, the instructor may exempt the student from the requirement. Examples of unavoidable cause include death or serious illness in the immediate family, illness of the student, and, provided previous notification is given, observance of regularly scheduled religious obligations.

Students are responsible for taking any number of examinations for which they are scheduled on a given day.

4. Classes that begin on the half-hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the examination time. For example, a

class that begins at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9:00 a.m. would use the 7:30 a.m. time.

5. Classes that begin on the hour use the first following half-hour to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that begins at 10:00 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.

6. Day-time classes (7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may extend their final examination period to three hours. All other examinations are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.

7. If an examination is held during finals week at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure the room is available.

**B CON 320 CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT DOCUMENTS II (3)**  
Comprehensive review of working drawings, specifications and other documents required for a commercial construction project, including technical specifications and building codes. Emphasis on document requirements in relation to time, materials, other resources necessary to estimate, schedule, and manage projects. Prerequisites: 310, 312, and 313 (or equivalent), or permission of department.

**B CON 322 CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT MANAGEMENT (3)**  
Introduction to the principles and techniques for selecting and managing construction equipment. Review and evaluation of the types of earth-moving and other construction equipment including the estimating and analysis of production, ownership, and operating costs. Prerequisites: 312 and 313 (or equivalent), or permission of department.

**B CON 323 CONSTRUCTION METHODS AND MATERIALS II (3)**  
Review and evaluation of structural and nonstructural systems for commercial, institutional, and industrial building types including erection and coordination of specialty trades work. Prerequisites: 310, 311, 312, and 313 (or equivalent), or permission of department.

**B CON 411 PROJECT PLANNING AND CONTROL (3)**  
Review and evaluation of the basic principles, techniques, and practices used as tools by contractors to plan, control, and manage building construction projects. Prerequisites: 310, 311, 312, 313, 320, 321, 322, 323, and 331 (or equivalent), or permission by department.

#### URBAN DESIGN AND PLANNING

**URBDP 575 IMPLEMENTATION IN PRESERVATION PLANNING & URBAN DESIGN (3)**  
Analysis of recent case studies in the implementation of preservation planning and urban design in terms of planning and design products and related processes, decision making, administration, management. Tools and techniques include design analysis, policy-making, regulation, design review, taxation, financing and public participation. Prerequisite: introductory course in preservation or urban design.

### COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

#### ANTHROPOLOGY

**ANTH 491 HONORS COLLOQUIUM (2)**  
Introduction to anthropological research. Students read original articles and papers and discuss them with authors. Research presenters include faculty, visiting faculty, and advanced graduate students. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: students in the department honors program, or other social science or biological science honors programs.

#### ART *Art History*

**ART H 434 NATIVE AMERICAN ART AND CEREMONY OF THE SOUTHERN AND CENTRAL NORTHWEST COAST (3)**  
Examines the role of the visual arts in the ceremonial life of the Native American people of the central and southern Northwest Coast. Emphasis on traditional social and religious aspects of ceremonialism, contrasts between tribal traditions, and continuing twentieth century traditions.

#### CHEMISTRY

**CHEM 570 TOPICS IN BIOTECHNOLOGY (3)**  
Survey of biotechnology-related research being pursued at the University of Washington by faculty participating in the Biotechnology Training Program. Prerequisites: Undergraduate background in biological, engineering or physical science.

#### COMMUNICATION

**CMU 365 ADVANCED TELEVISION NEWS PRODUCTION (3)**  
Supervised undergraduate workshop experience in the preparation of news materials for television. Prerequisite: 350 or permission of instructor.

#### GENETICS

**GENET 411 GENE ACTION (5)**  
Molecular genetics: description of fundamental genetics processes such as mutation, repair, genetic exchange, recombination, and gene expression. Use of genetic strategies to analyze complex biological processes. Focus on prokaryotic organisms. Joint with MICRO 411. Prerequisites: 360 or MICRO 410; CHEM 237.

**HISTORY*****History of the Americas*****HSTAA 370 CONSUMER CULTURE IN THE MODERN UNITED STATES (5)**

Studies the American attempt in this century to create, sustain, and organize the world's first consumer-oriented industrial society. Topics to be considered include: the economy of mass consumption; how a culture of consumption was created, and the ideas of social critics who have rejected consumerism.

**INTERNATIONAL STUDIES*****Russia and Eastern Europe*****SISRE 501 BIBLIOGRAPHY AND RESEARCH METHODS (3)**

Introduction to bibliographic and other scholarly resources in field; development of research techniques. Some use of Slavic/East European language required. Required of all first-year M.A. students.

**MUSIC****MUSIC 185 THE CONCERT SEASON (2)**

Performances from the School of Music concert season, supplemented by lecture topics related to concert repertoire. Analysis of applicable musical topics appropriate for enhanced appreciation of historical and cultural contexts of works performed. Attendance at ten concerts required.

**PHYSICS****PHYS 521 ADVANCED QUANTUM MECHANICS - INTRODUCTION TO QUANTUM FIELD THEORY (3)**

Multi-particle systems, second quantization, diagrammatic perturbation theory, radiation, correlation functions and multi-particle scattering, relativistic theories, renormalizability, basic quantum electrodynamics, and other applications. Prerequisite: 520 or equivalent.

**PSYCHOLOGY****PSYCH 512 PERSONALITY DISORDERS (4)**

Theoretical research, clinical literature on personality disorders. Special attention to borderline personality disorder. Current diagnostic criteria, assessment instruments, validation strategies. Biological, psychological research relevant to epidemiology, longitudinal course, family genetics, developmental antecedents, correlates, and treatment of personality disorders. Prerequisite: graduate standing in Social Work Psychiatry or Nursing Psychology or permission of instructor.

**PSYCH 520 EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT (4)**

Current theory and research on emotional development in infants, children, and adolescents. Reviews work on emotion recognition, expression, and understanding. Special emphasis on family and social influences on emotional development, as well as links to psychopathology. Prerequisites: graduate standing or permission of instructor.

**SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION****ACCOUNTING****ACCTG 199 ACCOUNTING PROBLEM SOLVING (2, MAX 6)**

Supplementary lectures, discussions, and problem solving sessions in introductory accounting. Enrollment restricted to EOP students and others by permission. Credit may not be applied to fulfill specific course requirements or to 180 credits required for graduation. Concurrent enrollment in 210, 220, or 230 required

**OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT****OPMGT 450 INTRODUCTION TO PROJECT MANAGEMENT (4)**

Focuses on the management of complex projects and the tools and techniques which have been developed in the past 25 years to assist managers with such projects. The course covers all elements of project planning, scheduling and control as well as implementation and organizational issues. Prerequisite: OPMGT 301.

**SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY****DENTISTRY****DENT 655 MEDICAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT/BASIC LIFE SUPPORT (1)**

Reviews principles and practical applications for management of medical emergencies in dental practice in conjunction with training and certification in Basic Life Support.

**COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING****COMPUTER SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING****CSE 471 COMPUTER DESIGN AND ORGANIZATION (4)**

CPU instruction set and addressing modes, CPU structure and functions, computer arithmetic and logic unit, register transfer level design, hardware and microprogram control, memory hierarchy design and organization, I/O and system components interconnection. Laboratory project involves design and simulation of an instruction set processor. Prerequisites: 370 and 378.

**CHEMICAL ENGINEERING****CH E 461 ELECTROCHEMICAL ENGINEERING (3)**

Explores role of thermodynamics, charge transfer kinetics, mass transfer on behavior of electrochemical systems. Includes cell thermodynamics, faradaic, non-faradaic rate processes, ionic transport, nucleation, growth theories, topics of current interest. Applications to chemical sensors, batteries, corrosion, thin film deposition. In-class demonstrations to illustrate concepts. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

**TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION****TC 531 TECHNICAL JAPANESE 2 (4)**

Focus on oral communication and reading. Additional vocabulary and *kanji* necessary for practical communication and technical reading are introduced. Lab work required for *kanji* building, grammar review, and oral drills. Prerequisite: 530.

**COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES****FOREST PRODUCTS AND ENGINEERING****FPE 423 WATERSHED ANALYSIS (4)**

Inventory and historical analysis of the interactions between natural resources, climate, and forest management. Development of management objectives and design of forest management activities based on inventory and analysis. Includes the use of modeling and simulation in predicting the influence of forest management activities on other resources. Prerequisite: 425.

**FOREST RESOURCE MANAGEMENT****FRM 507 SOILS AND LAND USE PROBLEMS (4)**

Environmental concerns of soils; how soil properties control potential and reasonable possibilities for land use. Includes factors controlling soil stability, hydrology, fertility and movement of pollutants. Field trip oriented with weekly activity summaries. Students also conduct field trips to soil-use problems located. Prerequisite: OPMGT 301.

**INTERSCHOOL/INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAM****UNIVERSITY CONJOINT****UCONJ 527 CURRENT TOPICS IN NEUROBIOLOGY (1)**

Presentation and discussion of current research in neurobiology in order to provide students with exposure to and understanding of the diverse areas of neurobiology research. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: graduate student in the Program in Neurobiology or permission of the instructors.

**SCHOOL OF PHARMACY****PHARMACY****PHARM 498 CASE CONFERENCE: GERIATRICS (1)**

Students taking geriatric pharmacy clerkships in various clinical settings meet together with faculty to present case studies of elderly patients requiring complex drug therapies. Required for the Certificate in Geriatric Pharmacy Practice. Prerequisites: 487 and 488 which may be taken concurrently, or permission of instructor.

## W COURSES OFFERED WINTER QUARTER 1993

Students who plan to take majors in the College of Arts and Sciences and who started college Autumn Quarter 1985, or later, must complete 10 credits of courses designated "W". Some other undergraduate majors also require W courses. W courses are not English composition courses but, rather, are courses in which a substantial amount of writing is required. 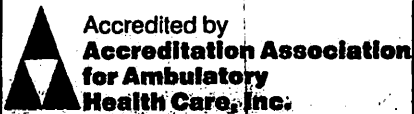

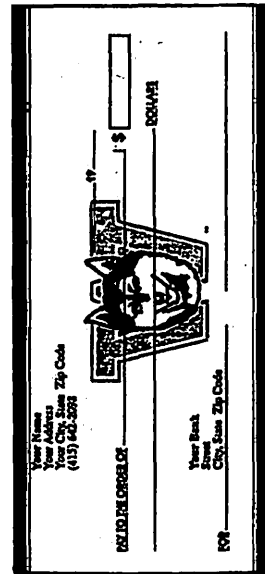

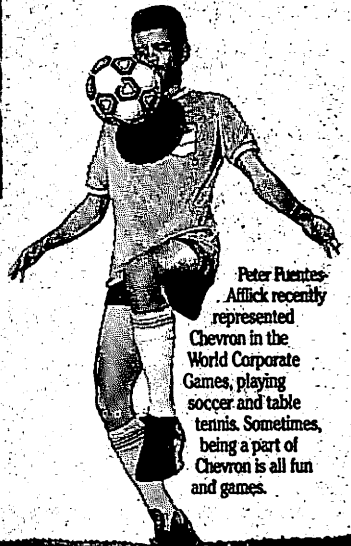

## A defense against cancer can be cooked up in your kitchen.

There is evidence that diet and cancer are related. Some foods may promote cancer, while others may protect you from it.

Foods related to lowering the risk of cancer of the larynx and esophagus all have high amounts of carotene, a form of Vitamin A which is in cantaloupes, peaches, broccoli, spinach, all dark green leafy vegetables, sweet potatoes, carrots, pumpkin, winter squash, and tomatoes, citrus fruits and brussels sprouts.

Foods that may help reduce the risk of gastrointestinal and respiratory tract cancer are cabbage, broccoli, brussels sprouts, kohlrabi, cauliflower.

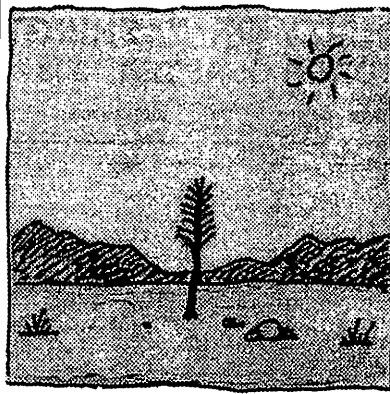
Fruits, vegetables and whole-grain cereals such as oatmeal, bran and wheat may help lower the risk of colorectal cancer.

Foods high in fats, salt- or nitrite-cured foods such as ham, and fish and types of sausages smoked by traditional methods should be eaten in moderation.

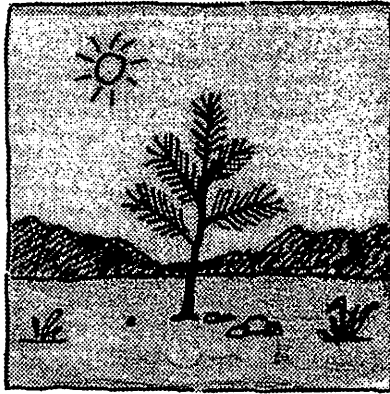
Be moderate in consumption of alcohol also.
