What's New for Winter Quarter 2001

SECTION II OF THE STAR WORKSHEET UPDATED

Section II of the STAR worksheet (page 8) requests information that only needs to be entered once. However, when making these selections on STAR, be sure to enter your response for every section before you hang up. All of Section II must be completed, including the address usage information, in order for the selections to become part of your record. This is particularly important for your insurance selection. If you do not complete all of the section and respond to all of the questions but simply hang up the phone after selecting your insurance option, your insurance selection will not be added to your record. Because an insurance plan option must be selected by the seventh calendar day of the quarter, it is important that you ensure that you have actually completed all of Section II. To check your selection, call STAR and enter the transaction code to check your student account and loan status. Enter 1 5 # to list the selected optional charges (insurance, WashPIRG, Affordable Tuition Now).

The information in Section II will also be included as part of registration on the Web when that becomes available. These sections must be completed before you can begin registration.

UPDATING YOUR ADDRESS INFORMATION

It is important to keep your address information updated at all times. To do this, go to MyUW, select Personal Services followed by Change of Address. Make your changes and then submit your address change. The corrected address will display and a confirming email will immediately be sent to your "@u" email address.

The degree progress request gives you the capability of requesting an audit of your degree progress and seeing the response displayed on the screen shortly after you submit the request. You can then print to your attached printer. No trips to the Registration Office to pick up your copy are necessary.

Registration Eligibility and Periods

Registration Eligibility and Periods

REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

ALL STUDENTS

All students at the University who remain in good standing and in compliance with other rules and regulations, with no outstanding financial obligations, are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (summer quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification (e.g., undergraduate, post-baccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate). Once a student earns a baccalaureate degree, he or she must apply for admission as a postbaccalaureate (fifth year), nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action, (2) students with a registration Hold, (3) students not meeting their departmental continuation policies, or (4) students not meeting the University's satisfactory progress policy (see General Catalog).

You will not be eligible to register for winter quarter 2001 if you have an outstanding balance on your tuition and fee account. Contact the Student Accounts Office and pay any fees due in order to register.

UNDERGRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENTS (QUARTER-OFF ELIGIBILITY)

Subject to college, school, and departmental enrollment policies, undergraduate and professional students who have completed a quarter at the University of Washington may take the following quarter off and remain eligible to register in Registration Period I for the subsequent quarter without submitting applications as returning students. For example, a student completing spring quarter may, without registering for or completing autumn quarter, register during Registration Period I for winter quarter without reapplying. Any quarter from which a student has completely withdrawn, or from which he/she is canceled, does not constitute a completed quarter. Summer quarter enrollment is not required to maintain continuous registration eligibility.

Returning students who do not meet the criteria described in the above paragraph must submit a Returning Student Reenrollment Application by the published deadline. An Offer of Admission is sent to eligible students. Payment of the \$100 Enrollment Confirmation Deposit is required to hold a space for returning students.

GRADUATE STUDENTS

The Quarter-Off Eligibility Policy is not available to graduate students. Graduate students who do not maintain continuous enrollment (summer quarter excepted) must file a Petition for On-Leave Status with the Graduate School. Students who are registered for any portion of a quarter may not go on-leave for that quarter unless they officially withdraw at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, prior to the first day of the quarter (January 2). On-Leave graduate students returning to the University on or before the termination of their authorized periods of leave must apply as returning former students (through the Registration Office by the published deadlines). If you withdraw after the quarter begins, you may register for the next quarter during Registration Period I. See GRADING, WITHDRAWAL & ON-LEAVE (page 10) for more information.

REGISTRATION PERIODS

CALL STAR EARLY (ESTABLISHING YOUR PRIVATE ACCESS CODE)

You may call STAR and establish a Private Access Code (PAC) any time after your Enrollment Confirmation Deposit has been credited to your account. Establishing your PAC enables you to access MyUW. A \$25 late-registration fee is charged students who have not completed sections I and II of the STAR Worksheet by the first day of the quarter (January 2).

Continuing students may call STAR any time after Registration Period I begins and complete sections I and II of the STAR Worksheet. A \$25 late-registration fee is charged students who have not called STAR to complete sections I and II of the STAR Worksheet by the first day of the quarter (January 2).

STAR HOURS

STAR is available for registration Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight; Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight; and Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight.

The Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, is open for transactions not available on STAR, Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

PERIOD I – NOVEMBER 9–DECEMBER 3

This period is open only for continuing students currently enrolled autumn or for students who completed spring quarter 1999.

Priority registration dates are based on your completed credits, your autumn quarter 2000 credits as of November 7, and the last digit of your student number. The student number priority is changed each quarter so that all students have the earliest possible priority every other quarter. One half of the available spaces in each undergraduate course are reserved for day two of each priority period. If a STAR message states that the first-day spaces are filled, then the other half will be released on day two of that priority period. You may call STAR on, or after, your registration date to register and make changes to your schedule.

GRADUATING SENIOR PRIORITY

If you are a graduating senior or post-baccalaureate student with a degree application on file in the Graduation and Academic Records Office, you may register on the first day of Period I for your final two quarters. If you must postpone your graduation, you may save your priority quarters by not registering before your regular senior priority day. When you have used your Graduating Senior Priority for two quarters, you will revert to regular senior priority.

PERIOD II – DECEMBER 4–JANUARY 1

This period is primarily for newly admitted students and returning former students. Advising/registration notices of dates are mailed to newly admitted or readmitted students. You may register on or after your date. Continuing students may call STAR any day during this period.

PERIOD III – JANUARY 2–JANUARY 8

This period is open to all students for adds and drops. Courses dropped during this period will not appear on your transcript. You may register for courses at the Bothell and Tacoma campuses beginning this period. (See CROSS-CAMPUS REGISTRATION, page 9.)

LATE ADD PERIOD – JANUARY 9–JANUARY 21

This period is open to all students. All courses added during this period require an Entry Code or Faculty Number. A \$20.00 change-of-registration fee will be charged for all registration changes made on a single day. STAR closes at 6 p.m., Friday, January 12, and remains closed on Saturday, January 13. The deadline to add courses on STAR is midnight Sunday, January 21.

UNRESTRICTED DROP PERIOD – JANUARY 9–JANUARY 15

This period is open to all students. Courses dropped during this period will not appear on your transcript but are subject to a \$20 change-of-registration fee and tuition forfeiture.

LATE COURSE DROP PERIOD (ANNUAL DROP) – JANUARY 16–FEBRUARY 18

Students may drop one course each academic year (autumn through summer quarters) after the 14th calendar day of a quarter through the 7th week. For winter quarter 2001 a course dropped after January 15 will count as your annual drop. If used this quarter no additional courses may be dropped after the 14th calendar day until autumn quarter 2001. A "W" and a number indicating the week you dropped the course will follow the course title on your academic transcript. A \$20 change-of-registration fee and tuition forfeiture will be charged. These optional drops are not cumulative and can only be used within the current academic year.

STAR Registration

STAR

STAR (Student Telephone Assisted Registration) is the University of Washington's touch-tone telephone registration system. You may call STAR from any touch-tone phone to register. Some cellular and cordless phones do not always function properly with STAR. STAR acknowledges all completed transactions. Touch-tone phones are conveniently located in the Registration lobby, 225 Schmitz Hall; the T-Wing lobby in Health Sciences; 9 Communications; and the ground-floor level of the HUB.

STAR is available all weekdays and most holidays and weekends. Weekend hours not specifically scheduled are not guaranteed and may be subject to equipment and software maintenance requirements. STAR weekend hours are 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight on Saturdays and 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight on Sundays. Weekday hours are 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight.

In addition to registration, you may call STAR to listen to your grades for any quarter, check your tuition balance, as well as many other transactions. See STAR Transaction Codes (this page) or the STAR Worksheet (page 8) for a complete listing of STAR transactions.

STAR FEATURES

ADD AND DROP CODES

Some courses require a special five-digit code that is available through the department offering the course. See ENTRY CODES and FACULTY NUMBERS on page 9 for more information on using these codes.

ADDING AND DROPPING COURSES

Courses may be added during Periods I, II, III, and the Late Add Period. Beginning with the Late Add Period on January 9, an add code is required to add any course and a \$20 change fee is charged. This is in addition to any tuition. Always check your balance after adding a course. Sunday, January 21 (until midnight), is the last day to add a course for winter quarter 2001.

You have unlimited drops through January 15 without entry on your transcript. STAR closes at 6:00 p.m. on Friday, January 12, and remains closed on Saturday, January 13. Beginning January 9, a \$20 registration-change fee is charged to drop a course. This is in addition to any tuition forfeiture. Always check your balance after dropping a course.

If you use your annual drop that is available for that academic year, a \$20 registration-change fee will be charged.

ALTERNATE SECTIONS

STAR lists alternate sections if the requested sections are closed or canceled.

CHANGING YOUR INSURANCE PLAN AND OPTIONAL CHARGES

If you wish to change your insurance plan you may do so on STAR no later than January 8. Optional charges for WashPIRG may be changed on STAR after your initial selection through the tuition due date. Please refer to the STAR Worksheet in this Time Schedule for instructions.

CLOSED COURSE SECTIONS

If the section requested is closed, you will be informed by STAR of other open sections (including new sections added after the publication of the quarterly Time Schedule). You may then select an alternate section to be added to your schedule. To overload a closed section see OVERLOAD GUIDELINES on page 9.

CONFIRMED REGISTRATION

You may confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule transaction (L#). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

COURSE AVAILABILITY

Beginning Period I, you may call STAR at any time to complete section II of the STAR Worksheet and check course availability using the course-status transaction (S → SLN → #).

GRADES ON STAR

STAR lists all officially recorded grades for the most recently completed quarter. Winter quarter 2000 grades and GPAs become available on STAR beginning March 21.

Grades for prior quarters can also be requested on STAR by entering the quarter code and year. Review the STAR Worksheet for the specific transaction codes. Grades are also available from the Web via MyUW (www.washington.edu/students/).

IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE

If you make a mistake before finishing an entry, press the star key and the pound sign key (*#), and your entry will be discarded.

PREREQUISITES

Certain courses require that you have prerequisites in order to add that course to your schedule. These courses are identified by a P symbol in the course listing section of the Time Schedule. Prerequisites may be one or more courses, a minimum test score, or a minimum grade in a prerequisite course. You may add a course section even if you have not completed the course prerequisite provided you are currently registered for the prerequisite course. However, departments may elect to have the course that required the prerequisite dropped from your schedule if you do not satisfactorily complete the prerequisite course. Courses subject to cancellation are identified by the PX symbol in the Time Schedule. If you do not satisfactorily complete the prerequisite course, the course that required the prerequisite will be dropped from your schedule no later than the third calendar day of the quarter.

PRIVATE ACCESS CODE (PAC)

The first time you ever call STAR, enter your initial Private Access Code (which is provided in your Registration Notice) when STAR asks you to enter a Private Access Code. STAR will then prompt you to select a new Private Access Code or PAC of 4 to 6 digits that you can easily remember. STAR will not accept zero as the first number in your PAC, nor will it accept consecutive or repetitive numbers. Enter the PAC you select when prompted by STAR. You will then use your PAC for all future calls to STAR. If you wish to

change your PAC, you may do so at any time using transaction code 9. Please refer to the STAR Worksheet in this Time Schedule for instructions. If you forget your PAC, you will need to contact the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, or call (206) 543-8580 to reset your PAC.

New students may call STAR any time after they have been assigned an appointment date for advising or orientation to establish a PAC.

STAR QUESTIONS

If you have questions regarding registration, please call the Registration Office, (206) 543-8580, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

STAR TRANSACTION CODES

The transactions you enter on your touch-tone telephone communicate to the computer the action to take (such as add a course, drop a course, etc.) and data you want considered. The following are transactions STAR accepts:

- A = Add a course
- D = Drop a course
- CG = Change grading option
- CI = Change Student Health Insurance option
- CW = Change WashPIRG contribution option
- G QTR YEAR = Prior quarter grades. (G followed by the quarter code and last two digits of the year.
- G = List your grades
- L = List class schedule
- S = Course status
- T = Terminate your call and receive registration confirmation information
- 9 = Change your PAC
- 11 = Account balance
- 12 = Financial aid summary
- 14 = Last received payment
- 15 = Optional charges
- * = (Star key) used to separate data
- # = (Pound sign) used to send transactions

STUDENT ACCOUNT AND AID STATUS

Call STAR to obtain your current student account balance, list a summary of disbursed financial aid and aid check availability, and list the latest recorded student account payment. Review the STAR Worksheet for the transaction codes.

TIME AND CALL LIMITS WHEN CALLING STAR

Time limits are built into the system, so if you are holding on the STAR line for an extended period of time, you will be disconnected. Error limits are also a part of the STAR system, so if you do not enter the correct information after the second try, STAR will disconnect. If you are disconnected you may immediately call STAR back. You may call STAR up to 100 times a day. No transactions will be permitted when your calls exceed 100 on that day.

STAR Registration

Additional Registration Information

ADDRESS CHANGES

Students are responsible for keeping a current address on file with the University. You may change your address through MYUW (www.washington.edu/students/). Once updated, you will receive an email message confirming your revised address information. You may also call (206) 543-3868, any time, 24 hours a day, to change your address information.

CHANGES IN REGISTRATION

A \$20 change-of-registration fee is assessed for any number of add, drop, or change transactions (including change of grading option) made during a given day beginning January 9. The \$20 fee is a service charge and is in addition to any change in tuition or forfeiture as a result of adds, drops, or changes.

There is no charge for changes made in Registration Periods I, II, or III.

Fee waivers are rarely approved. If you think your change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request, you must pay the fee and submit a petition for a refund to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. A downloadable form is available from the Web at depts.washington.edu/regisra/forms/. The Office of the Registrar will notify you of the decision. The fee will be waived only if the change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request.

CLASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES

If you do not attend regularly scheduled class meetings during the first week of the quarter, you are subject to being dropped at the discretion of the teaching department to allow enrollment space for other students. Affected courses should be identified in the Time Schedule and/or posted in departmental offices. Please do not assume that departments will automatically initiate a drop for nonclass attendees. If you are not going to go to class, you should drop the course through STAR since the instructor will assign a failing grade. You may attend a University course in which you have not been officially registered during the first two weeks of the quarter.

After January 12, an instructor may allow you to attend class only if you are registered. A faculty member may attend informally with the approval of the instructor.

CREDIT LIMITATIONS

Undergraduates will be limited to 19 credits during Registration Periods I and II to allow all students a chance to develop a basic schedule. Additional credits may be added during Registration Period III. The limit is 30 credits per quarter.

CROSS-CAMPUS REGISTRATION

Students of junior standing or higher have the option to take courses at the Bothell and Tacoma campuses. You must have earned a minimum of 25 credits at the University (from all campuses) before using this option. Beginning Registration Period III, you may register for courses at the other campuses. You may earn a maximum of 35 credits at the other campuses. These courses will count toward the minimum number of credits needed for your degree. The courses appear on your official transcript and are calculated in your GPA. Students can earn cross-campus minors and declare these minors at the time of graduation. Minors at the other campuses cannot be declared prior to application for graduation.

DAY/EVENING CROSS REGISTRATION

Students admitted to evening majors may register for day courses (non-YA sections) beginning Period III. Students admitted to day majors may register for evening courses (YA sections) beginning Period III.

ENTRY CODES

Entry codes are five-digit random numbers issued to you by academic departments as authorization to add or drop restricted course sections. Entry codes are not transferable.

Courses requiring add codes are designated with the > symbol to the left of the schedule line number (SLN) in the Time Schedule. All courses require add codes beginning January 9.

Please note that departments reserve the right to require entry codes whether the course is so designated in the Time Schedule or not. Departments give the location for obtaining entry codes either before the course listings or following the title of the course. Contact the department offering the course if STAR advises you an entry code is required and the location for obtaining one is not identified in the Time Schedule (campus operator - (206) 543-2100).

Instructors may issue add codes to students when a class is full. (See OVERLOAD GUIDELINES for additional information on using add codes to overload closed courses.)

Once you have used an entry code, the computer removes it from the list of valid codes and will not accept it again. If you drop a section that required an entry code to add, then you must obtain another entry code from the department if you wish to re-add the section.

Some courses require a drop code in order to be dropped. Obtain the code from the department offering the course. Perform the drop transaction on STAR and enter the drop code when prompted by STAR.

FACULTY NUMBERS

If you are enrolling in independent study courses such as 499, 600, 700, or 800, you will first need to obtain a Faculty Number from the instructor or department. The Faculty Number is used instead of the entry code to register for the courses on STAR.

FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT

You should register for 12 or more credits to be considered full-time or 6-11 credits for half-time if you are an undergraduate or professional student. The Graduate School requires 10 credits for full-time status and 5-9 credits for half-time status. It is important to note that differing criteria and standards for full-time enrollment exist for eligibility in certain programs. Consult the Financial Aid Office for its requirements on satisfactory student progress. The tuition schedule does not reflect full-time credit requirements for loan deferments, teaching assistantships or other programs.

OVERLOAD GUIDELINES

For reasons of public safety and instructional quality, course enrollment in each section is limited to the approved classroom capacity. The Office of the Registrar monitors course enrollments throughout the quarter according to the following guidelines:

- Through January 8, a student may add a section without permission unless the class is full or requires permission; then an add code is required. Beginning January 9, add codes are required to add any course. STAR will accept course overloads only up to 115% of classroom capacity to compensate for expected course drops.
- No course adds are accepted after January 21.

REGISTRATION ASSISTANCE

If you are having problems using STAR, call the Registration Office at (206) 543-8580 and a staff member will assist you. If you work during the day or are incapacitated and need assistance with non-STAR transactions, please call the supervisor of the Registration Office at (206) 543-8580 to make arrangements for assistance.

REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION

Registration Confirmations for students who registered by December 4 will be mailed beginning December 5. If you register after December 4, your Registration Confirmation will be mailed in two working days. Use MyUW or call (206) 543-3868 to record your correct address. Confirmation will not be mailed outside the United States if you register after December 4, and will not be mailed to addresses outside of the state of Washington during the last week of Period II and during Period III. If you are using an out-of-state address, you may claim your confirmation at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, within two working days (valid picture ID is required).

You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule transaction (L #) or by selecting MyUW from the Students link on the UW homepage. This listing includes building and classroom locations.

REGISTRATION HOLDS

If you have a Hold on your registration, you will not be permitted to register, add courses, or obtain a replacement U-PASS until the Hold has been released by the office that placed it. If you attempt to register on STAR before your Hold has been released, the voice response will indicate which office has placed the Hold and where to go to get it released. However, you may make other transactions on STAR.

The University will accept but not process a Returning Student Reenrollment Application for any student who has either a financial or academic Hold on their transcript or registration. (See the RETURNING STUDENTS section below for more information.)

REGISTRATION IN SEQUENCE COURSES

Departments may establish a registration priority for students enrolled in sequence courses. For example, students enrolled in a foreign language 101 course may have priority to register in the next course in the sequence (102) for the succeeding quarter.

REGISTRATION TAMPERING

A student who tampers or attempts to tamper with the registration records of another student, including but not limited to dropping courses and adding courses, may be subject to disciplinary sanctions as defined in the Student Conduct Code (WAC 478-120).

RETURNING STUDENTS

A returning undergraduate or professional student who has not been enrolled for more than one quarter (not including summer quarter), or a graduate student returning from official On-Leave status is required to complete and file a Returning Former Student Reenrollment Application by the application deadline. A student is eligible to apply as a returning former student only when returning in the same classification as when previously enrolled. Students applying for a new category (e.g. postbaccalaureate, professional, or

graduate) must complete the appropriate application for that category. A returning undergraduate or professional student must include a \$35 application fee with the application. Graduate students returning from on-leave status are not charged the \$35 application fee. The closing dates for returning former student applications are: autumn, July 1; winter, November 1; spring, February 1; summer, June 1.

The University will accept but not process a returning former student reenrollment application for any student who has either a financial or academic hold on their transcript or registration. Once the hold has been cleared, the application will be processed. A returning student must pay a nonrefundable Enrollment Confirmation Deposit of \$100 by the date indicated in the offer of readmission.

SERVICE AND RESEARCH CREDIT

Some course sections have symbols identifying them as "Service Learning" (S) or "Undergraduate Research-Intensive" (R).

Service-Learning courses incorporate opportunities for students to participate in meaningful community service with organizations and projects. Undergraduate Research-Intensive courses use inquiry-based learning as a centerpiece of the education.

TIME CONFLICT

You may not register on STAR for two courses that meet at the same time or for courses with overlapping meeting times. If you want the second course instead of the one you are registered for, you must drop the first one before adding the second course on STAR.

If you want to add a course that conflicts with another, you must add the second course, in person, at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. Students must obtain the verbal approval of both instructors to add a course that conflicts one hour a week or less; instructor signatures on an Authorization for Non-STAR Transactions form are required for courses that conflict more than one hour a week.

UNDERGRADUATE SATISFACTORY PROGRESS

If you are pursuing a baccalaureate degree, you are expected to make satisfactory progress toward the attainment of that degree and are expected to enter a major and graduate after completion of a reasonable number of credits. Refer to the General Catalog for additional information or see Satisfactory Progress on the UW homepage at www.washington.edu/students/reg/regopt.html.

VARIABLE CREDITS

Some courses are offered for a variable number of credits. See the department to obtain the appropriate number of credits for a variable credit course and be prepared to enter the number of credits when requested to do so by the voice response on STAR. Changes in variable credits are made only at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. The deadline to make these changes is Friday, March 9. A \$20 change-of-registration fee will be assessed beginning January 9.

Grading, Withdrawal, & On-Leave Information

GRADING

AUDITORS

You must first register on STAR and then go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, to select the audit grade option. You may select the audit option through January 12. A \$20 change fee is charged beginning January 9. Attendance in courses as an auditor is based on the consent of the instructor and space availability. You may not audit a course if you have not completed a prerequisite. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. You may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work and your registration may be canceled at the discretion of the instructor. Audited courses are not recorded on your permanent record.

Auditors, except Access program students, pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course. Although credits for audited courses are not listed on your transcript, they will be included in the billing on the fee statement. Audit credits count in the calculation of fees.

Courses audited may not be changed to credit registrations after January 12.

CREDIT/NO CREDIT COURSES

Some courses are offered on a credit/no credit (CR/NC) basis. It is not possible to register S/NS for these courses. Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal, a "W" is recorded.

DROPPING COURSES

You may drop courses on STAR without restriction through January 15. No record of the dropped course(s) will be recorded on your transcript. A \$20 change fee and tuition forfeiture will be charged after January 8.

You may drop one course each academic year (defined as September through August) after the 14th calendar day of the quarter but no later than the 7th week of the quarter. The course will be recorded on your transcript followed by a "W" and the week designator. For example, if you drop a course in week 5 the notation will be W5. (See LATE COURSE DROP PERIOD on page 6 for more information.)

You may also petition for a hardship withdrawal following the 14th calendar day if appropriate. (See HARDSHIP WITHDRAWAL on this page for information.)

GRADE APPEAL PROCEDURE

A student who believes he or she has been improperly graded should first discuss the matter with the instructor before the end of the following academic quarter (not including summer quarter). If the student is not satisfied with the instructor's explanation, the student may submit a written appeal to the chair of the department, or in a nondepartmental college, to the dean, with a copy of the appeal also sent to the instructor. The chair, or dean, consults with the instructor to ensure that the evaluation of the student's performance has not been arbitrary or capricious. Should the chair believe the instructor's conduct to be arbitrary or capricious and the instructor declines to revise the grade, the chair (or the dean in a nondepartmentalized school or college), with the approval of the voting members of his or her faculty, shall appoint an appropriate member, or members, of the faculty of that department to evaluate the performance of the student and assign a grade. The dean and Provost should be informed of this action.

Once a student submits a written appeal, this document and all subsequent actions on this appeal are recorded in written form for deposit in a department or college file.

INCOMPLETE GRADE

Incomplete grades may only be awarded if you are doing satisfactory work up until the last two weeks of the quarter. Undergraduate students must not reregister for courses in which they have received an Incomplete, since a grade earned in a repeat course will not be recorded as the Incomplete conversion grade. To obtain credit for the course, an undergraduate student must convert an Incomplete into a passing grade no later than the last day of the next quarter. An Incomplete not made up by the end of the next quarter (summer excluded) will be converted to the grade of 0.0 by the Registrar unless the instructor has indicated, when assigning the Incomplete grade, that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. An instructor may request an extension of the incomplete-removal deadline for up to three additional quarters. The original Incomplete grade is not removed from the transcript.

SATISFACTORY/NOT SATISFACTORY

You may elect to take certain courses on a satisfactory/not satisfactory (S/NS) basis.

After registering for the course on STAR, select the Change Grade Option to elect the S/NS

grading option. The S/NS grade option can be elected through February 18. A \$20 fee is charged beginning January 9.

As an undergraduate, a course in which an "S" is earned may not be used to satisfy any department, college, or University requirement, except that the credits may be applied to the minimum of 180 credits required for graduation. Each instructor will report numerical grades to the Registrar, who will convert satisfactory grades (2.0 or greater) to "S", and unsatisfactory grades (less than 2.0) to NS for the student's transcript. No more than 25 S/NS credits may apply toward an undergraduate degree.

If you are a graduate student and earn grades of 2.7 or above, you will receive a grade of "S," while 2.6 or below are recorded as NS. With the approval of your graduate program adviser or the Supervisory Committee Chairperson, you may elect to take any course for which you are eligible outside of your major academic unit on an S/NS basis.

In cases of withdrawal, the "W" is recorded. Neither S nor NS is included in the grade-point average.

WITHDRAWAL

WITHDRAWAL FOR THE QUARTER

Dropping all courses. It is your responsibility to withdraw if you are unable to attend for the quarter. You may withdraw from the quarter through the last day of instruction, which is March 9 for winter quarter 2001. If you drop your last class on STAR after January 8, you will be charged the \$20 fee. Complete withdrawal cannot be done on STAR after January 15. You may also write to or withdraw in person at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, University of Washington, Box 355850, Seattle, Washington, 98195-5850. Withdrawals by mail are effective on the date of the postmark. No withdrawals are accepted after March 9.

Tuition owed will be based upon the date the complete withdrawal is recorded at the Registration Office, the date that the last class is dropped on STAR, or the postmark date for withdrawals received by mail (see TUITION FORFEITURE, page 11). Withdrawals from January 9 to February 1 are subject to 50% tuition forfeiture. If you withdraw prior to January 9 you will owe a \$75 U-PASS fee unless you return your U-PASS to the Student Accounts Office by the tuition due date (January 19). If you pay the \$75 fee and then lose your U-PASS, you are not eligible to purchase a replacement U-PASS sticker. Withdrawals after January 31 result in full tuition forfeiture.

Review the Registration Eligibility section of the Time Schedule if you are withdrawing before the first day of the quarter. New students must reapply through the Admissions Office.

Courses dropped as part of a complete withdrawal from the University during the first two weeks of a quarter (through January 15) are not recorded on your UW transcript; however, the date of the complete withdrawal is recorded.

If you withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (summer quarter excepted) you will not be eligible to register as a continuing student for the third quarter. You must reapply as a former student returning to the University and will be required to pay the \$35 application fee and \$100 enrollment deposit. For example, if you withdraw during the first week of spring quarter and autumn quarter, you must reapply as a returning former student for winter quarter.

HARDSHIP WITHDRAWAL

You may submit a written petition to the Office of the Registrar for a hardship withdrawal after the 14th calendar day of the quarter.

Petitions are granted if, in the judgment of the Registrar, you were unable to complete the course due to physical or mental debilitation or other unusual or extenuating circumstances, beyond your control, which have arisen after the 14th calendar day of the quarter. Petitions must be submitted promptly after the occurrence of the event and be accompanied by documentation. Approved hardship withdrawals will be entered on the transcript with a grade of HW. The \$20 change-of-registration fee will be assessed, plus any tuition forfeiture.

If you withdraw from the quarter based on reasons of hardship after the last day of instruction, the same petition process must be followed. If the withdrawal is approved, the courses will show a notation of "W" and the transcript will show withdrawal.

A hardship will not be granted for courses after you have been awarded your degree.

WITHDRAWAL FOR MILITARY SERVICE

If you are conscripted into the Armed Forces or called to active military duty you may withdraw

through the end of the seventh week of instruction (February 18) and receive a full refund but no academic credit. If you withdraw after that date you may receive either a full refund or (academic) credit and no refund. You must submit a copy of your military orders with your request to withdraw. Please consult with the Office of the Registrar for complete details.

GRADUATE STUDENTS ON-LEAVE

To go on-leave, have your department Graduate Program Coordinator sign a Petition for On-Leave Status Card, then take it to the Registration Office by 5:00 p.m., January 8. The Registration Office staff will issue you an On-Leave Graduate Student Card upon payment of a \$35 non-refundable fee. This card will give you access to the libraries. If you have registered for winter quarter 2001 and plan to go on-leave, you must officially withdraw prior to January 2, before the on-leave status will be granted.

Tuition Exemptions & Access Programs

TUITION EXEMPTION PROGRAM

Eligible University of Washington and State of Washington employees and members of the Washington State National Guard may register for and receive a tuition exemption for up to 6 credits each quarter provided they register on a space-available basis. Eligible participants registering on a space available basis will pay a per credit charge for the credits taken over six. All participants in the tuition exemption program will be assessed a quarterly \$30 registration fee and must pay other applicable fees including the Technology Fee. You may not register for any course prior to your assigned space-available registration day (January 3 for university staff, January 4 for other state employees) or the exemption will be canceled or not accepted. If you are in a matriculated status and desire a higher registration priority to facilitate course enrollment, you may register early and pay regular tuition rates.

Space availability applies to degree programs as well as courses, and fully enrolled programs may choose not to accept or enroll you if you are using the tuition exemption. To be eligible you must be:

- ◆ University of Washington permanent classified (WPRB) or contract classified employees with six months or more of continuous service prior to the first day of the quarter,
- ◆ University of Washington faculty or professional staff employed on a half-time basis or more on the first day of the quarter of enrollment,
- ◆ Non-University of Washington permanent classified or contract state employees employed half-time or more,
- ◆ Permanent classified and exempt paraprofessional employees of technical colleges employed half-time or more,
- ◆ Nonacademic employees and members of the faculties and instructional staff employed half-time or more at state institutions of higher education other than the University of Washington, or
- ◆ Members of the Washington State Army or Air-National Guard.

You must hold this status on the day the exemption form is approved, and must be in that status on the first day of the quarter for which the tuition exemption is granted. The University tuition exemption does not cover English 100.

101, 102, Math 098, UW Extension or Distance Learning courses, graduate-level independent study courses numbered 600, 700, and 800, or any self-sustaining courses. If you are nonmatriculated and admitted to enroll on a space-available, tuition-exempted basis, you may register for classes only when using the exemption and only after the exemption request form has been submitted or processed. If you are matriculated, you are permitted to register without the exemption, but full tuition and fees will be charged.

With the instructor's permission, and if you are planning to register on a space-available basis, you may begin attending classes the first day of the quarter if space is available. Registration, however, will not be permitted until your assigned space-available registration day.

You must apply for admission by the published application deadlines and be accepted to a University program. Applications may be filed with the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 320 Schmitz Hall, or the Office of Graduate Admissions, 200 Gerberding Hall. Former UW students returning in the same classification or as nonmatriculated students may apply at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall.

A NOTE OF CAUTION: UW employees pursuing graduate programs or graduate-level course work will have to claim the amount of the quarterly exemption as income on their federal income tax return unless the employer has certified that the program or course work is job related. If it is determined that the course is not job related, the value of the exemption will be considered income and subject to withholding.

TUITION EXEMPTION FORMS

Tuition exemption forms are available for downloading at depts.washington.edu/registra/forms/, or you can contact your departmental office, the Registration Office, (206) 543-8580, 225 Schmitz Hall, or UW Training and Development, (206) 543-1957.

REGISTRATION AND FEES

A separate tuition exemption form must be submitted each quarter. Course enrollment is not permitted prior to the appropriate space-available eligibility date (January 3 for university staff, January 4 for state employees). For winter quarter 2001, a \$25 late registration fee will be assessed if you initially register for the quarter on or after

Monday, January 9, and a \$20 fee will be charged for all registration changes made on a single day. You will be billed these fees, and other applicable fees, plus a \$30 registration fee if you have registered for a course. If you register before your assigned tuition exemption registration date you will not be permitted to convert to the tuition exemption program and will be required to pay regular tuition for all registered credits.

All participants in the Tuition Exemption Program must pay the quarterly Technology Fee. Registration for six credits or fewer does not entitle you to student services funded by the Services and Activities Fee, such as those available from the Hall Health Center and the Intramural Activities Building. Additionally, you are not eligible to purchase tickets to athletic events at student rates. UW faculty/staff identification cards may be used for library services. Participating Washington state employees and members of the National Guard may obtain ID cards for library services from the Student ID Center, 229 Schmitz Hall, and a U-PASS sticker for \$31 from the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, after registering for a class. Deadlines and registration dates are listed below for winter quarter 2001.

UW EMPLOYEES

Tuesday, December 11 – Tuition exemption request form due to Registration, 225 Schmitz Hall, Box 355850.

Wednesday, January 3 – Registration begins on STAR. Open from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight.

Friday, January 19 – \$30 registration plus prorated technology fee due. A registration fee is billed if a student registers for a course. The fee is non-refundable, even if a student withdraws during the first week of the quarter.

WASHINGTON STATE EMPLOYEES AND MEMBERS OF THE STATE NATIONAL GUARD

Tuesday, December 11 – Tuition exemption request form due to Registration, 225 Schmitz Hall, Box 355850.

Thursday, January 4 – Registration begins on STAR. Open from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight.

Friday, January 19 – \$30 registration plus prorated technology fee due. A registration fee is billed if a student registers for a course. The fee is non-refundable, even if a student withdraws during the first week of the quarter.

ACCESS PROGRAM FOR OLDER ADULTS

The University of Washington waives tuition for Washington residents sixty years or older who wish to attend classes as auditing students. If you are enrolling as an Access student you may attend class with the permission of the instructor, beginning the first class day if space is available. Courses marked with the > symbol require an entry code to register. You should contact the offering department to obtain entry codes prior to coming to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. A \$5 registration fee and a prorated technology fee will be billed if registration in a course(s) is completed. The payment will be due

January 19. Since you are auditing the course(s), you do not receive credit and are not expected to do any class work, participate in discussions, or take examinations. Your registration may be canceled at the discretion of the instructor. You may register for all courses except English 100, 101, 102, Math 098, UW Extension, Distance Learning, studio courses, laboratory courses, and honors sections. You may register in 500-level graduate courses with the approval of the instructor by obtaining an entry code through the department. A transcript is not maintained.

You will be limited to two courses per quarter. For additional information about this program or to request a registration form, you may phone the Registration Office, (206) 543-8580, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., weekdays.

REGISTERING

Registration is done in person at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, beginning Wednesday, January 3, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Registration ends at 5:00 p.m., Friday, January 8. If you are unable to come in person, you may mail in your registration request. Processing will not begin until Wednesday and classes are not guaranteed.

FEES

Friday, January 19 – A \$5 registration fee plus prorated technology fee is due. The Registration Fee is non-refundable if you register for a course and later withdraw.

TUITION/FEE BILLINGS AND DEADLINES

It is your responsibility to see that tuition is paid in full by the tuition due date (January 19). Bills are sent at the beginning of each quarter (January 2) to facilitate payment. However, FAILURE TO RECEIVE A TUITION BILL DOES NOT NULLIFY YOUR RESPONSIBILITY FOR PAYMENT BY THE DUE DATE. Account balances are available through STAR (transaction 11#) or MyUW.

Bills are also sent periodically during the quarter for fees assessed after the beginning of the quarter. However, YOU SHOULD NOT RELY ON SUCH BILLINGS TO MEET

PAYMENT DEADLINES, since balances are available from STAR and MyUW.

Select your permanent or local address on STAR or MyUW for fee statement mailing. If you have not received a fee statement by January 12, contact the Student Accounts Office, call STAR, or access MyUW, for the amount of tuition due.

You may pay your fees in person in the Student Accounts Office or mail them to UW, Student Accounts Office, 129 Schmitz Hall, Box 355870, Seattle, WA 98195-5870, on or before January 19. Checks and money orders must be in U.S. dollars and drawn on U.S. or Canadian banks. You may also pay electronically from your bank account by using MyUW.

If you fail to pay by the deadline you will be charged a late fee. For past due balances over \$250, the late fee is \$30; for past due balances between \$30-\$250, the late fee is \$10; and if the balance is less than \$30, there is no late fee.

If payment has not been received in the

Student Accounts Office by the end of the late payment period, registration for the current quarter will be canceled. Reregistration after cancellation for nonpayment requires a \$75 fee, in addition to tuition.

TUITION AND FEE CHARGES INCURRED AFTER JANUARY 19 MUST BE PAID WITHIN THREE WORKING DAYS. Exception: beginning March 9, charges must be paid by the next

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO KNOW

Drops or withdrawals after January 8 will cost you \$20 plus at least half of tuition reduction. (See Tuition Forfeitures and Refunds)

Tuition is due January 19.

Charges incurred after the tuition due date must be paid in 1-3 days. (See Tuition/Fee Billings and Deadlines.)

business day. Always check your account status and balance on STAR when completing a registration transaction.

If you reregister, you must reregister for all of the classes that were on your schedule at the time of registration cancellation. (Fees will include appropriate charges for classes dropped during the forfeiture period.) Please note that even if your registration is canceled you will continue to owe one-half of your tuition.

Credit cards are not accepted.

Tuition and fees not paid by the end of the academic quarter (March 9) will be subject to an interest charge of 1% per month, or fraction of a month (12% A.P.R.), beginning with the month following the end of the quarter. Delinquent unpaid accounts may be referred to a collection agency and reported to a credit bureau.

The Controller is authorized to place Holds on the record of any student who fails to pay amounts due the University. Until the Hold is cleared, the University (1) does not release the student's records, (2) does not release transcripts or certified records, and (3) denies registration.

TUITION FORFEITURES AND REFUNDS

Only partial tuition reductions will result for courses dropped after January 8. You will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition associated with any course dropped between January 9 through January 31. Courses dropped after January 31 receive no refund.

The effect of tuition forfeitures on the over-18-credit surcharge is as follows: forfeitures for courses dropped that exceeded 18 credits are charged the same as above. Also, if you drop a course after January 31 and add another, total credit charges will include credits that are added with no reduction for credits dropped.

The University's forfeiture schedule is as follows:

a. If you withdraw before January 9, you do not pay tuition. New and returning students forfeit

their \$100 Enrollment Confirmation Deposit. If you withdraw before January 9 without returning the U-PASS sticker, you will owe \$75 for the U-PASS. No replacements are allowed for students who pay the \$75 fee and then lose their U-PASS sticker.

b. If you withdraw January 9 through January 31, you will continue to owe one-half of your tuition. If you withdraw after January 8, you will be charged the applicable forfeiture and you may retain your U-PASS by paying the quarterly fee or return it no later than January 19 to have the fee waived. There will be no U-PASS refunds after January 19.

c. If you withdraw after January 31, you will continue to owe full tuition.

d. If your registration is canceled for nonpayment of fees, you will continue to owe the University one-half of your tuition and fees.

e. If you are an international student who is registered for an English as a Second Language course, you must make a separate request for a refund for that course by contacting the ESL Office, 4909 25th Avenue NE, on the second floor of the King Building, at the same time you withdraw from the University.

f. If you drop any classes January 9 through January 31 that results in lower tuition, you will owe one-half of the tuition associated with the reduced credit hours. A drop after January 31 will not lower tuition.

g. Course drops become effective the date received and processed on STAR, in the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, or through the departmental registration screen used in academic departments.

h. You may petition forfeitures for extenuating circumstances (death, disability, etc.) through the

Student Accounts Office.

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS FOR AID RECIPIENTS

If you are a financial aid recipient and withdraw from all of your classes, your refund of University charges will be returned to the financial aid programs. The proportion of aid returned will be based on the number of days remaining in the quarter. No funds will be returned after 60% of the quarter has elapsed.

The refund of University charges will be credited to your aid programs in the following order up to the amount you received for that quarter: Federal Direct Subsidized Stafford/Ford Loan, Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford/Ford Loan, Federal Perkins Loan, Federal Direct Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students, Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Other Title IV aid programs, Washington State Need Grant, institutional aid, private scholarships. If any refund remains after crediting these accounts the balance will be refunded to you.

Please be aware that if you withdraw from all classes within the first 60% of the quarter, you may owe immediate repayment of aid you received (except Direct and Perkins Loans that are payable according to the terms of the promissory note). Contact the Office of Student Financial Aid if you have any questions.

APPLICATION OF PAYMENTS TO A STUDENT'S ACCOUNT

As a rule, payments received for a student's account are applied to charges in order of their due dates. For charges with the same due date, payments are applied first to tuition and related University fees and then to other charges on the account. A payment may be applied to a specific charge by paying in person to the Student Accounts Office at 129 Schmitz Hall.

Student Insurance and Special Fees

STUDENT INSURANCE

The University offers a voluntary accident and sickness insurance plan that students may purchase. Detailed information is available in a brochure available at the Hall Health Primary Care Center, the HUB, and the Registration and Student Insurance Offices in Schmitz Hall. Plan benefits, costs, and the insurance underwriter may change from year to year, so students are encouraged to pick up and review the brochure carefully.

Seattle campus UW students are eligible to enroll in the plan. Not eligible are UW Seattle nonmatriculated students, students enrolled in programs administered by Educational Outreach (except Evening Degree Program students) or at the Bothell or Tacoma campuses, and UW faculty/staff or Washington state employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption program.

Enroll yourself and eligible dependents by calling STAR through the seventh calendar day of the quarter. You must sign up, change, or cancel your insurance selection through STAR or in person at the Student Accounts Office by the seventh calendar day of the quarter. If you do not cancel or change the plan, you will be considered enrolled in it and will be required to pay the premium for the plan selected. You may not cancel your insurance by not paying the premium.

The premium is billed with your tuition and must be paid by the tuition due date. Failure to pay the premium by that date will result in subsequent bills being sent and may result in a hold being placed on your records. Financial Aid will pay the insurance premium automatically in most cases, but you should check the conditions of your aid

and whether it is sufficient to pay all required charges, including the insurance premium.

If you are an international student, you must subscribe to the student insurance plan unless you are covered by another plan. Proof of other coverage must be submitted to the International Services Office and a waiver obtained each autumn quarter (or upon initial admission if other than autumn quarter) because waivers are valid only through summer quarter each year. Students holding insurance policies that expire during the academic year are responsible for obtaining new waivers as necessary.

For those graduate students who are eligible for Graduate Appointee Insurance, choose the "no insurance" option when registering on STAR. If you have questions regarding your eligibility for this plan, please contact your department. International graduate appointees, however, must still choose the quarterly student insurance option when registering. If you are an international RA, TA, or SA, the system automatically makes adjustments so that you do not have double coverage. If you are an international fellow or trainee, please contact your department for further instructions.

This is a one-year policy. You may purchase the plan on a quarterly or "annual" basis (e.g., "annual" at autumn is four quarters, "annual" at winter is three quarters). You must be registered during the quarter the plan is purchased (e.g., if you are not going to attend summer quarter, sign up spring quarter for "annual" coverage to have insurance spring and summer quarters).

Current rates are available from MyUW at www.washington.edu/students/.

INSURANCE EFFECTIVE DATES

This is a one-year policy. You may purchase the plan on a quarterly or "annual" basis. You must be registered during the quarter the plan is purchased (e.g., if you are not going to attend summer quarter, sign up spring quarter for "annual" coverage).

SPECIAL FEES

AFFORDABLE TUITION NOW!

Affordable Tuition Now! is a grassroots student advocacy group dedicated to keeping the UW affordable. ATNI Opposes large tuition increases, and lobbies the legislature for improved financial aid and expanded access to higher education. Contact ATNI at students.washington.edu/tuition. You may choose to support ATNI by contributing \$2 each quarter. Support of ATNI may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on the tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

QUARTERLY TECHNOLOGY FEE

This fee is to recover, in whole or in part, the costs of providing and maintaining services to students that include, but need not be limited to the following: access to the Internet and World Wide Web, email, computer and multimedia work stations and laboratories, computer software, and dial-up telephone services. Part-time students (those paying less than full-time tuition) are charged on a pro rata basis. The fee will be included on the Quarterly Tuition billing.

SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES FEES

As part of tuition, students pay the Services and Activities Fee which funds a variety of student services, including ASUW and GPSS, the Daily, Hall Health Center, Recreational Sports (IMA), Student Legal Services, Childcare Assistance Program, and Ethnic Cultural Center/Theater.

SPECIAL COURSES AND LABORATORY FEES

The amounts charged for tuition and fees normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs. Some departments do not charge auditors these fees.

Most course fees will be included in your quarterly tuition bill. Dropping a course with a course fee after the first week of the quarter will not remove the fee from your balance owed. Any adjustment to course fees after the first week of the quarter must be handled with the academic department offering the course.

STUDENT ID (HUSKY CARD)

The student ID card is a permanent, laminated card. Once obtained, do not discard it.

If you are a new student, you are eligible for a student ID card once you've paid the Enrollment Confirmation Deposit. Bring a piece of standard photo identification — this is mandatory — to the Student ID Card Center at 229 Schmitz Hall between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The standard UW student ID card is a non-photo card; however, students living in the dormitories (except for Stevens Court, Commodore-Duchess, and married student housing residents) will be issued a photo student ID card, for reasons of dormitory security.

A quarterly validation sticker is mailed to you with your Registration Confirmation. When it arrives, affix it to the front of the ID card in the location provided; without this sticker, the card is usually not honored on campus.

You should carry your student ID card with you whenever you come to campus. Many administrative transactions and campus services and facilities are not available to you without it. In some situations, you may also be asked to provide an additional piece of photo identification.

Never allow anyone else to use your student ID card, as such misuse will subject you

to disciplinary action as described in the Student Conduct Code.

If you lose your student ID card, you should immediately make two phone calls, one to the ID Card Center at (206) 685-4120 to report it as lost, and also to the UW library system at (206) 543-2553. To replace the card, go to the Student ID Card Center with photo identification; a non-refundable \$5 fee is charged for replacement of non-photo cards, \$10 for photo cards.

If you lose three or more ID cards, you must schedule an interview with a registrar before a new card will be issued.

TRANSCRIPT (UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON)

You may order an official transcript in person at the Transcript Office or by writing to that office. The cost is \$4 per copy. To order a transcript in person, come to the Transcript Order Window, 225 Schmitz Hall. Requests by mail should be sent to:

Be sure to include your name, student number, Social Security number, date of birth, and approximate dates of attendance, to ensure the staff can correctly identify your record. All requests must include your signature.

U-PASS INFORMATION

In addition to biking and walking, using the U-PASS is the best way to get to campus. The U-PASS provides free trips on all Metro, Community Transit, and Sound Transit regular routes; free parking to those who ride together; free trips on the Night Ride; discounted vanpool fares; and merchant discounts. The U-PASS validation sticker is mailed with your registration confirmation each quarter and the \$32 fee is included in the tuition bill. If you do not wish to participate in the U-PASS program you must return the U-PASS sticker to the University by the tuition payment deadline (April 14). The sticker can be returned by mail in the return envelope provided, mailed with your tuition payment, or returned in person at the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office or the Registration Office.

If you withdraw through April 2 without returning the U-PASS sticker, you will owe \$75 for the U-PASS. If you withdraw after April 2, you will be charged the applicable tuition and may retain the pass for \$32 or return it no later than the tuition due date (April 14) to have the \$32 fee waived. There will be no U-PASS refunds after the tuition payment deadline (April 14), and no replacements of lost U-PASS stickers for students who have withdrawn.

If you did not receive your U-PASS in the mail you will be asked to sign a certifying statement and will be issued a replacement sticker at no charge through March 31. Replacement stickers issued after March 31 (for any reason) will cost \$10. Lost ID cards bearing a U-PASS sticker will be replaced for a \$15 fee (\$20 fee for photo IDs), which includes a new U-PASS sticker. Replacement fees are non-refundable. If you are issued a replacement sticker you will not be permitted to cancel the \$32 U-PASS fee (or the \$75 fee if you have withdrawn) by returning a sticker.

Eligible students who have not already purchased a U-PASS sticker may do so at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, anytime during the quarter. The fee will remain \$32 throughout the quarter.

The U-PASS is the property of the University of Washington and is not transferable. The U-PASS program, replacement policies, and quarterly fee are subject to change without notice.

WASHINGTON PUBLIC INTEREST RESEARCH GROUP (WashPIRG)

The Washington Public Interest Research Group (WashPIRG) is a student-directed, non-profit, and non-partisan research organization that works on issues affecting the quality of life in Washington State. Students participate in WashPIRG as decision-makers, volunteers, and credit interns producing research reports, lobbying the legislature, and organizing students and citizens around consumer, environmental and governmental issues. You may choose to support WashPIRG by contributing \$3 each quarter. Support of WashPIRG may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on the tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

STATE SUPPORT

The State of Washington provides financial support to students attending the University of Washington. An estimate of annual financial support in 1997-98, for both educational costs and financial aid, has been calculated by the Higher Education Coordinating Board and is provided below for average, full-time students.*

Notices and Services

ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON (ASUW)

The Associated Students of the University of Washington is a voluntary association of students designated by the University Regents to carry out a variety of student activities. In order to vote in ASUW elections or hold ASUW office, you must be a member. Membership choice will not affect tuition payment in any way. Information about the ASUW can be obtained from the ASUW Office in 204L Student Union Building (HUB). You may join ASUW when registering on STAR.

DEGREE AUDITS

Audits for all undergraduate majors may be ordered from the Degree Audit Reporting System (DARS) Web site (www.washington.edu/students/reg/dars/). These audits show your progress toward your intended degree.

DISABLED STUDENTS

If you are a student with a disability, various support services, including priority registration, note taking, and examination accommodations are available. You may contact Disabled Student Services (DSS), 448 Schmitz Hall, (206) 543-8925 voice/TDD, for information on academic accommodations designed to meet individual student needs.

The STAR Worksheet and Instructions are available from DSS in alternate media, including large print, tape recording, and Braille. If you have a disability that limits your ability to use STAR, you may register through DSS.

EMAIL

You may establish an email account at the University, using your initial Private Access Code (PAC) or the one you selected the first time you called STAR. In general, you may open your email account two days after selecting your PAC on STAR.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The University of Washington, as a standing policy, does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, age, marital status, disability, or status as a disabled veteran or Vietnam era veteran. Any discriminatory action can be a cause for disciplinary action. This policy applies to all University programs and facilities including, but not limited to, admissions, educational programs, employment, and patient and hospital services. FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS

It is the University's expectation that you will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the General Catalog and the Time Schedule. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and you believe that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, you may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which you are enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer you to the proper office for a decision.

GRADUATION RATES

The graduation rates of full-time freshmen beginning their studies at the University of Washington either summer or autumn quarter 1993 are 65.8% in 5 years and 72.2% in 6 years.

IMMUNIZATION

All new and returning former students, and all students living in University of Washington residence halls or single-student apartments, are required either to provide proof of measles (rubeola) immunity or request that the requirement be waived for religious, personal, or medical reasons. You will not be allowed to register for any classes until the Hall Health Primary Care Center (the student health center on campus) confirms that you have satisfied this requirement.

You must complete the student health center's Measles Immunity Verification Form and provide either certifications by your health-care provider or copies of original immunization records as proof of: (1) two live virus measles (rubeola) vaccinations, both given after 1967 with at least one given after 1980; or (2) positive measles (rubeola) titer (blood test for antibodies against measles); or (3) a history from a health-care provider of measles (rubeola) disease. Students born before 1957 are considered immune to measles.

While continuing students are not required to provide the Hall Health Primary Care Center with proof of measles immunity, they are encouraged to do so. In the event of an outbreak on the campus, all students lacking acceptable documentation of measles immunity, including students with waivers, will be barred from classes, living groups, and other campus activities until health officials determine that there is no risk of them transmitting the disease to others. Measles Immunity Verification Forms are available at the Hall Health Primary Care Center and the Registration Office at 225 Schmitz Hall. For more information, students should contact the Hall Health Primary Care Center at (206) 616-4672

and leave voicemail messages or email hhimmune@u.washington.edu to which members of the nursing staff will respond.

RELEASE OF STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 protects the privacy of your education records. As a general rule the University will not release a student's education records to a third party without written consent of the student. This includes tuition account information. The complete University policy on student education records and the location of such records may be found in the Washington Administrative Code under WAC 478-140. Manuals containing the Code are available at Reference Stations on campus and at the Visitor's Information Center, 4014 University Way NE. Information release forms for tuition account information only may be obtained from the Student Accounts Office, 129 Schmitz.

The following information is considered public or "directory" information and may be released to anyone unless you inform the Office of the Registrar that you do not wish any information released: name, address, telephone number, email address, major field of studies, dates of attendance, full- or part-time enrollment status, most recent previous educational institution attended, degrees and awards received, as well as notices of awards or academic honors to home town newspapers, and for athletes, date of birth, weight, and height.

If you do not wish to authorize directory release and do not want your directory information to appear in the published or electronic Student Directory you may restrict the release of this information using MyUW which can be found in the Change of Address under Personal Services (www.washington.edu/students/) or by calling the address change service at (206) 543-3868. No information will be released on students or to students, who have restricted release of directory information. If you wish to change your authorization and allow release, you must go to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz and present photo identification or make the change via MyUW/Personal Services.

Under the provisions of FERPA, you have the right to:

1. Inspect and review information contained in your education records within 45 days of the day the University receives a request for access. You should submit to the registrar, dean, chair of the academic department, or other appropriate official, written requests that identify the record(s) you wish to inspect. The University official will make arrangements for access and notify you of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the University official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise you of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.
2. Request the amendment of your education records that you believe are inaccurate or

misleading. You should write the University official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record you want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the University decides not to amend the record as requested, the University will notify you of the decision and advise you of your right to a hearing.

3. Consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in your education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the University in an administrative, supervisory, and academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the University has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person serving on the Board of Trustees; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

4. File a complaint with the Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the University of Washington to comply with the requirements of FERPA. Written complaints should be directed to Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue SW, Washington D.C. 20202-4605.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

- ◆ Saturday courses may schedule their examination for the first Saturday of the examination week, but must make arrangements with Room Assignments to check on room availability. Dean's office approval is not required for Saturday only courses.
- ◆ Students are responsible for taking any number of examinations for which they are scheduled on a given day.
- ◆ Final examinations should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule. The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed:

Final Examination Guidelines

1. With the dean's permission, the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for the date of a final examination.
2. An instructor shall not schedule a final class examination before the beginning of finals week. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.
3. A student absent from any examination through sickness or other cause, judged by the instructor to be unavoidable, shall be given an opportunity to take a rescheduled examination or perform work judged by the instructor to be the equivalent.

If the instructor determines that neither alternative is feasible during the current quarter, the instructor may exempt the student from the requirement. Examples of unavoidable cause include death or serious illness in the immediate family, illness of the student, and provided previous notification is given, observance of regularly scheduled religious obligations, and might possibly include attendance at academic conferences or field trips, or participation in University-sponsored activities such as debating contests or athletic competition.
4. Multiple section courses, courses with two or more lecture or lab sections in a given quarter, may schedule a common final with approval from the dean and the Registrar. Common finals will usually be held the Saturday before or during finals, or on occasion in the evening.

Common final dates and times are normally indicated in the comment section of the Time Schedule, under individual course listings. They will be announced at the beginning of the quarter in each course section, and included in the course syllabus. The times for common finals differ from the times shown in the above examination schedule. A make-up examination time is to be arranged for any student who cannot be present for a common final.
5. Classes that begin on the half-hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the examination time. For example, a class that begins at 8:30 a.m. and continues until 10:00 a.m. or 10:20 a.m. would use the 8:30 a.m. time to determine the examination period.
6. Classes that begin on the hour use the first following half-hour to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that begins at 10:00 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.
7. Daytime classes (7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may extend their final examination period to three hours. All other examinations are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.
8. If an examination is held during finals week at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure the room is available.

In addition, most courses require the purchase of textbooks from the University Book Store (details will be included with your registration confirmation).

Refunds

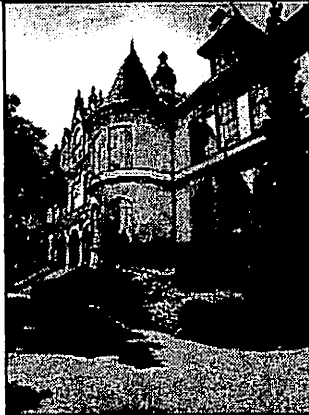

The University of Washington offers one of the nation's largest summer programs, including many high-demand courses that are difficult to get in other quarters. Shorter four-and-a-half-week courses are available to accommodate students with summer jobs.

Get the classes you need

Class size is typically smaller during Summer Quarter, and with fewer students registering you're more likely to get the classes you need. Summer enrollment is especially appropriate for seniors who lack credits for graduation, for juniors planning to graduate in June 2002, and for incoming freshmen who want to get a head start on their studies. (If you can't attend summer classes, you can earn credits through UW Distance Learning.)

A special time to learn

More than 1,600 summer courses are offered, including many classes and workshops scheduled only in the summer. 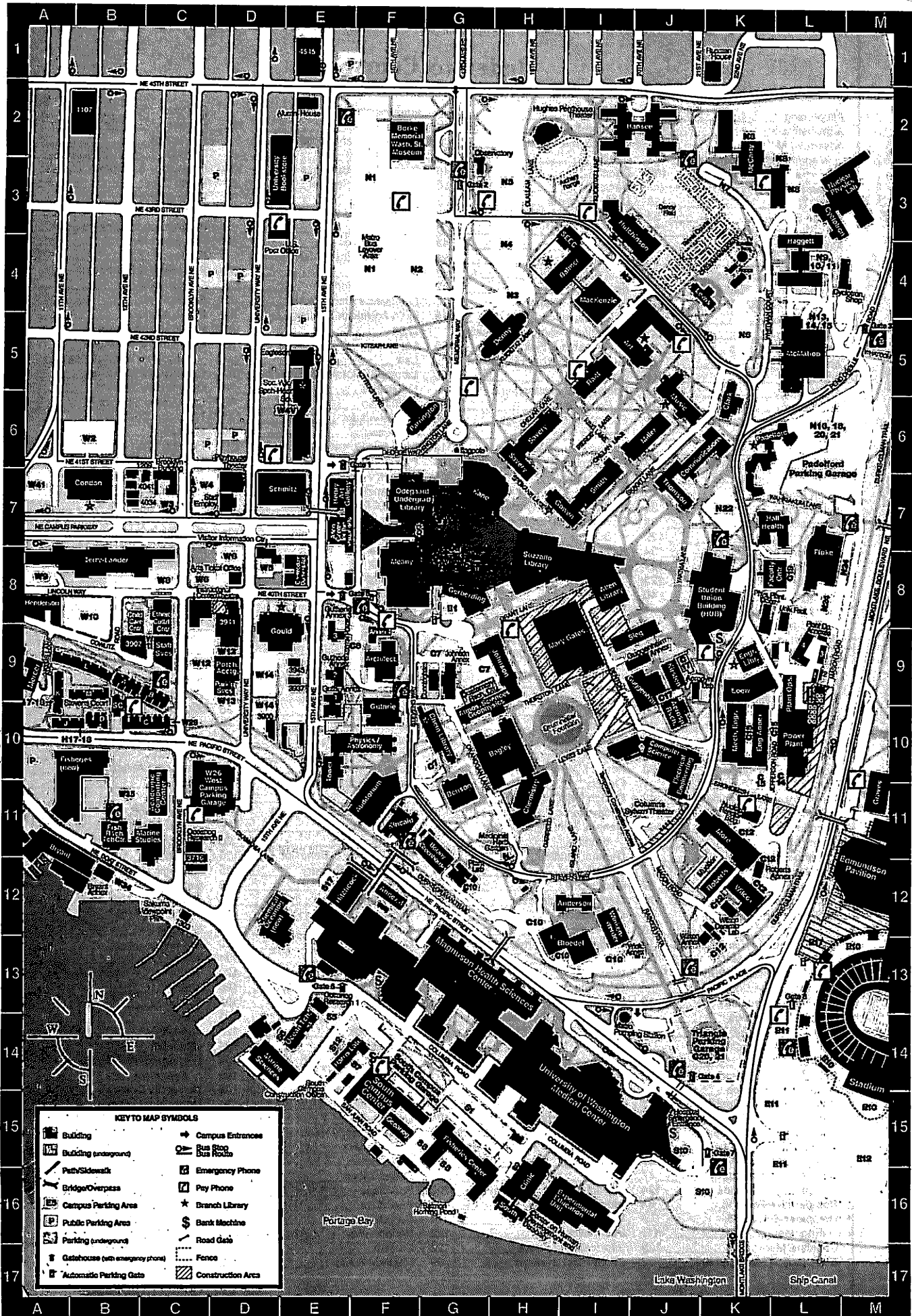
